## I. Fellowship

### **For the Entire Congregation**

Each year Westminster sponsors several exciting all-church fellowship events. This is a great way to get to know more people at Westminster. Check our website for updates and additional events.

### **Fellowship Hour/Lemonade on the Lawn Host**

Each Sunday during the year individual members or groups may host coffee hour after the service. Volunteers bring in light refreshments, set up and clean up. Lemonade on the Lawn is the summer equivalent. A streamlined process makes it easy; a minimum of 3-4 people works well.

**Softball** (April – July) Softball@wpc-alex.org

If you are interested in playing slow-pitch softball and are up for a few months of fun and fellowship, come join Westminster's team. We play in a fun-focused, fellowship division, so you don't have to hit like Babe Ruth to play!

### **For Young Adults**

Our active group of young adults (20's-30's, single or married) enjoy outings like golfing, bowling and kayaking, as well as Bible study and service projects. Dedicated to the support and ministry of young adults, our program seeks a balance between fellowship, service, and study.

#### **Faith on Tap**

Exciting faith-based discourse and perhaps a malty beverage or a fountain soda! We usually meet on the third Tuesday of each month at a local restaurant.

#### **Small Group Opportunities**

Groups of 4-7 participants meet twice a month on Sunday mornings during the education hour. Participants commit to attend five months of meetings, and some groups choose to extend their meetings beyond that duration. This opportunity is open to young adults who are single or married, with or without children.

### **For Families**

Throughout the year, families with young children enjoy park gatherings, game nights, parent seminars, and other family supporting activities. (Childcare provided for parent-only events.)

#### **Mornings for Moms**

Fellowship group for moms the first and third Fridays of the month, beginning September 17, between 10:30 a.m. and noon. Moms meet for conversation and snacks while the kids play.

### **For Singles**

#### **Flying Solo**

For singles in their prime years (more or less 40 and above). The group offers single adults the opportunity for Christian fellowship, spiritual and intellectual growth, and service to others. There are monthly Dine-Outs and a monthly potluck at church, three Roundtable lunch discussions a year and an annual weekend retreat as well as other occasional special activities.

## **For Youth**

Our Middle School and Senior High groups have fun with friends (young and old), laugh, learn, worship, pray, play, rest, share, serve, snack, and much more. We enjoy weekly fellowship on Sunday afternoons, and mission trips take us across the country or around the world! Youth Sunday worship services give youth the opportunity to prepare and lead meaningful services for the whole congregation.

## **For Women**

### **Book Group**

Women gather on the fourth Monday of the month; choose either a day or evening group to discuss a selected book.

### **Circles**

Women meet monthly for Bible study, fellowship, and to support service projects. Many meeting time/place options available.

### **Shanghai Card Night**

Women gather monthly for a rousing card game and fellowship, usually the first Monday.

## **For Men**

### **Men's 2<sup>nd</sup> Friday Breakfast**

The Men of Westminster sponsor a monthly breakfast in Fellowship Hall at 7:00 a.m. on the second Friday of the month for a lively discussion of a topic of current interest and fellowship.

### **Men's Retreat**

A popular annual retreat for refreshment, fellowship, and study.

## **For Seniors**

### **Westminster Travelers**

Senior adults gather for lunch, day trips, the theatre or attend special events within the church several times a month. Extended trips are also taken annually by chartered bus.

### **Transportation**

Westminster provides transportation to and from Sunday worship services for persons living at Goodwin House Alexandria, Goodwin House Baileys Crossroads, and The Fountains at Washington House.

## **For All Adults**

### **Tables for Eight**

Meet and get to know other members of the congregation in small groups of 8-10 members, including individuals and couples. The groups gather approximately every month in members' homes or at restaurants for dinner and conversation.

### **Craft Workshop**

Open workshops morning and evening every Tuesdays; holiday Boxwood Workshop and teaches new skills to men and women, church members and community members, in partnership with the adult education programs of Alexandria Public Schools.

## II. Education

### For Children and Youth

#### Infants and Preschoolers -YoungChildren@wpc-alex.org

Childcare is provided on Sunday mornings and at other times as advertised. Our dedicated nursery is always staffed by two experienced caregivers. September through May during 11:00 worship, Pre-K children attend *Children and Worship* to begin their learning of scripture through storytelling.

#### Elementary School: Creation Station (Sept – May) CreationStation@wpc-alex.org

On Sunday mornings, September – May, grades K-5 enjoy our rotation model church school, *Creation Station*. Children learn Bible stories and Christian concepts in 4 or 5 week in-depth sessions rotating through storytelling, arts & crafts, cooking, computer lab, geography, Bible Jeopardy, music, and more!

During 11:00 worship, our kindergarteners and 1<sup>st</sup> graders may attend *Children and Worship* which includes scripture based storytelling.

#### Youth (Sept. – May)

Our Sunday morning classes are designed to help youth grow in their understanding and application of faith in their own lives. Youth are also encouraged to participate in our youth fellowship, mission and music activities.

##### *Middle School Youth Café (Grades 6-7)*

Join your peers and caring teachers as you explore the pages of Scripture and the story of your lives.

##### *Confirmation Class (Grade 8)*

Together, we explore the basic beliefs of Christianity as we experience them as Presbyterians to prepare for our decision to claim Jesus Christ as our Lord and Savior and become full members of the church.

##### *Senior High Sundays (Grade 9-12)*

Each week, we'll have a different format (movies, current events, field trips) that will help us build on our faith and make it a bigger part of our daily life.

#### Westminster Weekday Preschool

A developmental program, weekday mornings only, encouraging each child to grow socially, emotionally, physically, and cognitively at his/her own pace. Ages 2 1/2 through 4.

## **Adults**

### **Young Adults**

20's-30's, single or married. Young adults are encouraged to participate in the vibrant life of adult education in the church, periodically we have special opportunities for young adult education.

*Young Adult Study* – Pastor-led study and discussion series occur seasonally throughout the year.

*Faith on Tap* - Calling all young adults yearning for exciting faith-based discourse and perhaps a malty beverage or a fountain soda! Usually meets the third Tuesday of every month.

### **Sunday Mornings**

Our outstanding Sunday morning Adult Education program includes a wide range of classes from 9:45 to 10:45 a.m. during the program year. Classes are taught by professors from area seminaries and universities, experts in various fields, pastors and church members.

### **Evening Classes**

Our senior pastor leads several studies during the program year. The first is DISCIPLE, on Thursdays at 7:30 p.m. from September 1, 2011 through March 8, 2012. This course studies the Old and New Testaments with a focus on how to read the Bible, what it contains and the many different meanings that lie within it and how it comes to life in our world.

### **Faith Groups**

Two groups of 10 -20 people meet in homes for six weeks at a time, usually before Advent and Lent. The morning group is for women and the evening is for men and women. Groups read and discuss a book that relates to faith.

### **Parents**

Parent seminars and classes are offered throughout the year.

*Study for Moms* - A seasonal weekly pastor-led discussion group based on a chosen book. See fellowship activities for Families for more information.

### **Women's Bible Study**

## **Resources**

### **Pera Library**

We maintain a reference collection for in-depth Christian study; periodicals and videos; a circulating collection of books and videos for members that includes theology, church history, social issues, parenting, and many other topics. There is an extensive children's section, including videos.

## III. Music

### Choral

#### Westminster Choir

Adult singers lead in worship by providing music for the 11:00 a.m. service. The choir also prepares large choral works for special worship events seasonally.

#### Youth Vocal Ensemble

For all youth grades 6 and above. The repertoire is varied, from the works of Bach to spirituals and music written especially for this group, with a focus on vocal training.

#### Alleluia Choir

Children in grades 3-5 learn music-reading, vocal, and choral skills while continuing to foster the development of our worship leadership. Alleluia Choir sings in worship at least monthly.

#### Carol Choir

Children in grades K-2 enjoy music and begin to learn basic concepts of music and theology through singing songs, instruments, and games. Carol Choir sings for worship several times during the year.

#### M&M Week

“Music & More” for children in grades K – 5. Westminster’s staff, musicians and parents lead our annual summer day camp. Based around a Bible story or theme, campers enjoy singing, drama, crafts, storytelling, games and cooking fun snacks.

### Handbells

#### Westminster Ringers

This advanced handbell choir provides another facet of musical expression for worship, playing in church several times a year and for special occasions. Previous ringing experience and commitment to attend rehearsals required.

#### Celtic Cross Ringers

Intermediate level handbell choir for adults. An ability to read music is helpful and a commitment to attend rehearsals required.

#### Youth Handbells

Handbell ringing for grades 6-12 who have some experience ringing and/or can read music. A commitment to attend rehearsal required.

#### Beginning Bells

New ringers starting with 3rd grade receive an introduction to the basic techniques of playing handbells while developing their musicianship.

#### Music Fun

Children in grades K-2 can participate in our new program for music development through games and instruments.

**Music Ministry for Seniors/Homebound:** This musical outreach brings the music of worship to those who are unable to participate in worship due to aging or illness. Participants can volunteer whenever they are available to go on visits to members in their homes and senior/nursing facilities, primarily to sing hymns, on one Sunday or Monday each month during the program year. This ministry is open to all.

## **IV. Service within the Congregation**

### **Creation Station Teacher/Leader, and Classroom Assistants**

Creation Station rotations are arranged on a September to May school-year calendar. Curriculum is provided with a wealth of ideas and activities. Congregation members are encouraged to offer their wide variety of skills and interests. Substitutes are needed and may volunteer at any time.

### **Transportation: Sunday Morning Church Bus**

The church bus provides Sunday morning transportation from area retirement communities along a designated route. Bus drivers need to have a good driving record; instruction is required. Bus assistants need an ability to help passengers use van steps.

### **Youth Advisor**

Accompany, befriend and mentor our Middle School or Senior High youth as we play, serve, worship and learn together. All ages and personalities welcome...what's required is a heart and energy to connect with our youth and help them connect into the life of Westminster.

### **Youth Teacher**

Help lead our Sunday morning education activities for our Middle School and Senior High youth. Prior expertise not necessary – it comes with teaching!

### **Worship Service Opportunities**

#### **Communion Element Preparation**

Meet on a Saturday prior to Communion being served on Sunday. Training, assistance, and fellowship provided.

#### **Offering Counter**

Teams of 3-4 people count Sunday's offering after morning services or the following day and make the bank deposit. Each team counts 12 times a year; training provided. Substitute counters needed.

#### **Ushers Guild**

Assists on Sundays and at special services. Teams consist of a captain and from 4-10 ushers per service.

## **Church Administration Opportunities**

### **Library**

Assist with cataloging and re-shelving. We are looking for a computer-savvy volunteer to help us move to a computerized catalogue.

### **Church Archives**

Assist with organizing and preserving the church's history. We have records on the founding, various committees and guilds, former pastors, etc. including a photo collection that needs cataloging.

### **Chronicle Aide**

Assist in printing, collating, folding, and preparing The Chronicle for mailing one Thursday morning a month as well as the occasional large mailing.

### **Grounds Maintenance**

Gardeners, landscapers, arborists, and leaf rakers are welcome. Spring and fall cleanup days are open for all volunteers.

## **Elected Offices**

### **Board of Deacons**

The deacons support the pastoral staff in ministering to members who are ill, homebound or in need. They are nominated and elected by the congregation from within its membership, serving three-year terms. Their duties include home visitation, flower delivery, extended communion delivery, meals team, support for the Sunday bus, and special transportation requests, among others.

### **Session**

The session is the governing body of the local church and is comprised of elders nominated and elected by the congregation from its membership. The adult elders serve three-year terms and the two youth elders normally serve one or two year terms. Elders have responsibility for the governance and ministry of Westminster, being charged to work to strengthen and nurture the faith and life of the congregation.

### **Trustees**

The Trustees act on behalf of Westminster Presbyterian Church, Alexandria, VA, Inc., as directed by the Session and under the provisions of the Constitution of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), in matters regarding the church property.

## V. Mission Opportunities

### **Local Mission Opportunities** (more details available on our website)

WPC is involved in a variety of activities that support our community. We use the acronym CHES to describe the types of programs we support. CHES stands for: Children, Hunger, Education, Shelter, and Self-Sufficiency. Each of the community organizations that Westminster supports provides services in one or more of these areas.

#### **ALIVE!** (Alexandrians InVolved Ecumenically!)

ALIVE! is an organization of several Alexandria faith communities that serve critical needs of low-income families in Alexandria. Westminster members assist with donation pickup/delivery, canned good collection, among other volunteer opportunities.

#### **Arlington-Alexandria Coalition for the Homeless (AACH)**

AACH provides shelter, counseling, and employment training for homeless families to assist them in rebuilding their lives. Volunteers are needed for telephone answering, transportation, child care, and furniture delivery/pick-up.

#### **Bag Lunch Program** (BagLunch@wpc-alex.org)

The Bag Lunch program feeds the hungry weekdays Monday through Friday at Meade Memorial Church in Old Town Alexandria. Westminster serves about 4 days a month and welcomes servers and donations of sandwiches, snacks, and fruit. Soup is prepared and served seasonally.

#### **Carpenter's Shelter**

The first Monday of every month Westminster members provide and deliver food for residents of Carpenter's Shelter for the homeless in Alexandria. Volunteers also may sign up to help serve.

#### **George Mason Tutors**

Tutors work one-on-one with elementary school children assisting them with homework and other school assignments. Requires 1 hour each week on Tuesday or Thursday afternoons from 2:35 -3:35 from October to May. Substitute tutors are also needed.

#### **Guest House**

Guest House provides housing and services for women coming out of jail or prison who need support to transition successfully back into their lives and communities. Donation of supplies and services (e.g. dental care, hair styling) and volunteers needed.

## **Local Mission Opportunities (cont'd)**

### **Meals on Wheels**

Provides 2 meals (one hot, one cold) to homebound people in Alexandria, 5 days a week. Westminster volunteers deliver on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Tuesday morning of each month.

### **Presbyterian Women Work Day**

Produces handmade articles for use in the community, such as pillows for heart patients, stuffed toys for hospitalized children, cancer pads, and afghans for homebound members and nursing homes. Meets 9:30 a.m. on the 1<sup>st</sup> Wednesday of each month.

### **Rebuilding Together Alexandria** (Rebuilding@wpc-alex.org)

Westminster along with several other Alexandria faith communities and companies repair homes in Alexandria for low-income elderly or disabled homeowners. The big annual focus is the last Saturday in April. There are additional projects throughout the year including a fall weatherization on a Saturday (date is variable).

### **Adopt a Turkey**

In November, Westminster members donate and deliver prepackaged Thanksgiving dinners to low-income families.

### **Adopt a Family**

In December, Westminster members “adopt” a family through the Child and Family Network Center to provide a brighter holiday for low-income working families.

### **Scouts**

Westminster sponsors and operates both Boy Scout Troop 129 and Cub Scout Pack 129, and provides space to a Girl Scout Troop. Ways to help: Assist with troop leadership or in a support role; help with a specific merit badge; provide outing opportunities.

## **National and International Mission Opportunities**

### **Spirit Lake Reservation, North Dakota**

Westminster members provide continuing support to help improve the quality of life and worship on the reservation through teamwork with Bdecan Presbyterian Church.

### **Kenya - United Orphanage & Academy, Moi's Bridge**

Since 2001 we have emphasized support for the United Orphanage & Academy in Moi's Bridge, Kenya. In addition to providing funds to support the 54 orphans who reside at the facility, Westminster members and others provided funds to build dormitories, toilet facilities, a dining hall, kitchen, office and storage space, a fresh water well, installed electricity and purchased a 14-passenger van, and began construction of a new three-story educational academy for the orphans and local children representing all local ethnic groups. Many members provide scholarships for students and stipends for teachers. Members travel to Kenya every 2 to 3 years to maintain personal relationships.

### **Throughout Africa**

Our congregation supports churches and seminaries in Cameroon, the Democratic Republic of Congo, Ghana, Kenya and Zambia. We provide scholarships for seminary students in Kenya and Zambia. We are partners with Elburgon Presbytery in Kenya of the Presbyterian Church of East Africa in building churches and health clinics, and providing training in Elburgon Presbytery.

### **Mission Trips**

Intergenerational, Young Adults, Senior High, and Middle School mission trips are planned annually, usually over the summer. Trips are designed to assist a needy community outside the Washington DC area; sometimes to international locations. Basic home maintenance skills welcome but not required.

- Mission Trips 2011-2012
  - September 17, 2011: Apple Gleaning Day-Trip to Winchester, VA. All ages joined us as we picked apples and brought them back to local shelters and food banks in Alexandria.
  - October 20-23, 2011: Appalachia Service Project Mission Trip to Jonesville, VA. Adults of all ages will assist with home construction projects for low-income residents.
  - November 4-6, 2011: Harvest of Hope Intergenerational Mission Trip to Shawsville, VA. Participants age 10 and over will glean beats and turnips for donation at local soup kitchens and food banks.

## VI. Pastoral and Congregational Care

### Home Visits

Our Pastoral Care Coordinator, deacons, and other trained members of the church make personal contact with homebound members at least once a month to affirm our interdependence as a church family.

### Member Response Team (MRT)

MRT addresses special needs of members, connecting members in need with church and/or local resources to address job loss, counseling needs, transition issues related to immigration, short-term financial assistance, and other emergency needs.

### Deacon Meal Team

Meals for church members with short-term needs are coordinated and delivered to homes.

### Compassion Guild (CompassionGuild@wpc-alex.org)

Assists church staff and families when a family member dies. Coordinates ushering and receptions for memorial services.

### The Prayer Chain

Many Westminster members pray regularly for those needs shared through our email prayer chain.

### Extended Communion to Hospitalized and Homebound Members

Each month Deacons take communion to those who are unable to attend services.

### Music Ministry for Seniors/Homebound

One Sunday and Monday per month, participants sing hymns with members in their homes and senior/nursing facilities when they are unable to participate in worship services due to aging or illness.

### Transportation

#### Sunday Mornings

Westminster provides weekly van transportation to and from Sunday worship services from area retirement communities along a designated route.

#### Transportation Assistance

The Deacons coordinate rides upon request for Westminster members needing transportation to doctor's appointments, etc.

### Other Care Services

Medical Equipment – Available on loan for free through the church office. Durable items such as wheelchairs, walkers, canes, bath benches, and commodes are reused as needed.

Donations are appreciated.

Joys and Concerns - A weekly listing in our bulletin of joys and concerns. This is made available so that worshippers may take this listing home for use in their personal prayers.

The Care Line - (703) 684-2934 Provides a way of learning up-to-date information by phone about member deaths and family losses, memorial services, births, and weddings.

## VII. Church Committees

### **Administration and Finance** – AF@wpc-alex.org (Chair: David Hill)

Develops procedures for proper handling of church funds and supervision of individuals involved with the funds; prepares annual budget; reviews church books; monitors monthly income and expenses; develops long range financial plans; oversees church vehicles.

### **Building and Grounds** – BG@wpc-alex.org (Chair: Bill Eckert)

Plans and advises on building and grounds maintenance, building and grounds budget issues, capital expenditures and improvements, and church cleanup activities.

### **Christian Education** – CE@wpc-alex.org (Chair: Lauren Sigler)

Plans and oversees the church educational curriculum and programs for all ages. Responsible for the church library, retreats, and liaison between the Session and the Weekday Preschool Board of Directors.

#### **Adult Subcommittee**

Supports and plans Sunday morning educational activities for adults.

#### **Children Subcommittee**

Supports and plans Sunday morning educational activities for children in the nursery through Creation Station.

### **Church HOME (Helping Our Members Engage)** – HOME@wpc-alex.org (Chair: Dave Aland)

Focused on helping new members find their home at Westminster and involving all the members of Westminster in the life, work and worship of the church.

### **Communications** – Comm@wpc-alex.org (Chair: Mara Winn)

Responsibilities include maintaining & improving the Westminster website; publishing Westminster's printed materials; publicizing church events; and photographing/video recording.

### **Congregational Life** – CL@wpc-alex.org (Chair: Pat Prospero)

Develops ways to enhance the church's sense of community by planning and implementing special activities for the entire church family such as picnics and dinners as well as serving as liaison between the Session and individual church fellowship groups.

### **International Mission** – InternationalMission@wpc-alex.org (Chair: Rob Lalka)

Directs the church's attention and support to mission work throughout the world. Organizes and sponsors Westminster's adult mission trips. Serves as the contact and generates support for the United Orphanage in Moi's Bridge, Kenya.

### **Local Mission** – LocalMission@wpc-alex.org (Chair: Sean Heather)

Provides the liaison between the church and many local programs providing housing, food, and life-crisis support to residents in Alexandria, and surrounding communities.

**National Mission** – NationalMission@wpc-alex.org (Chair: Doug Anderson)

Organizes mission trips and activities for adults and families. Mission activities include gleaning, and trips coordinated through Appalachian Service Project.

**New Member** – NewMember@wpc-alex.org (Chair: Patty Chamberlain)

Assists visitors who are interested in becoming members to enter fully into the fellowship and activities of our church.

**Nominating** – Nominating@wpc-alex.org (Chair: Eric Weiss)

Builds the slate of nominees for each year's election of Elders for the Session and Deacons for the Diaconate and Trustees. Members are elected by the Congregation.

**Personnel** – Personnel@wpc-alex.org (Chair: Susan Cloud)

Oversees the staff of Westminster and their compensation. Performs annual reviews. Members of this committee are appointed and approved by the Session.

**Stewardship** – Stewardship@wpc-alex.org (Chair: Duncan Campbell)

Encourages members in the congregation to dedicate their time, talents and financial resources, all of which are critical to the worship, education, mission and fellowship at Westminster.

Coordinates the annual Stewardship Campaign, where members are all called to pledge a portion of their financial resources so that the Church's needs, both current and future, are efficiently and responsibly planned and budgeted.

**Worship and Music** – Worship@wpc-alex.org (Chair: Rosa Fullerton)

Responsible for the church's worship and music programs – all services, music events, weddings, and memorials. Responsible for ushering; communion preparation and service; and liturgical presentation, decoration, and use of the sanctuary and chapel.
