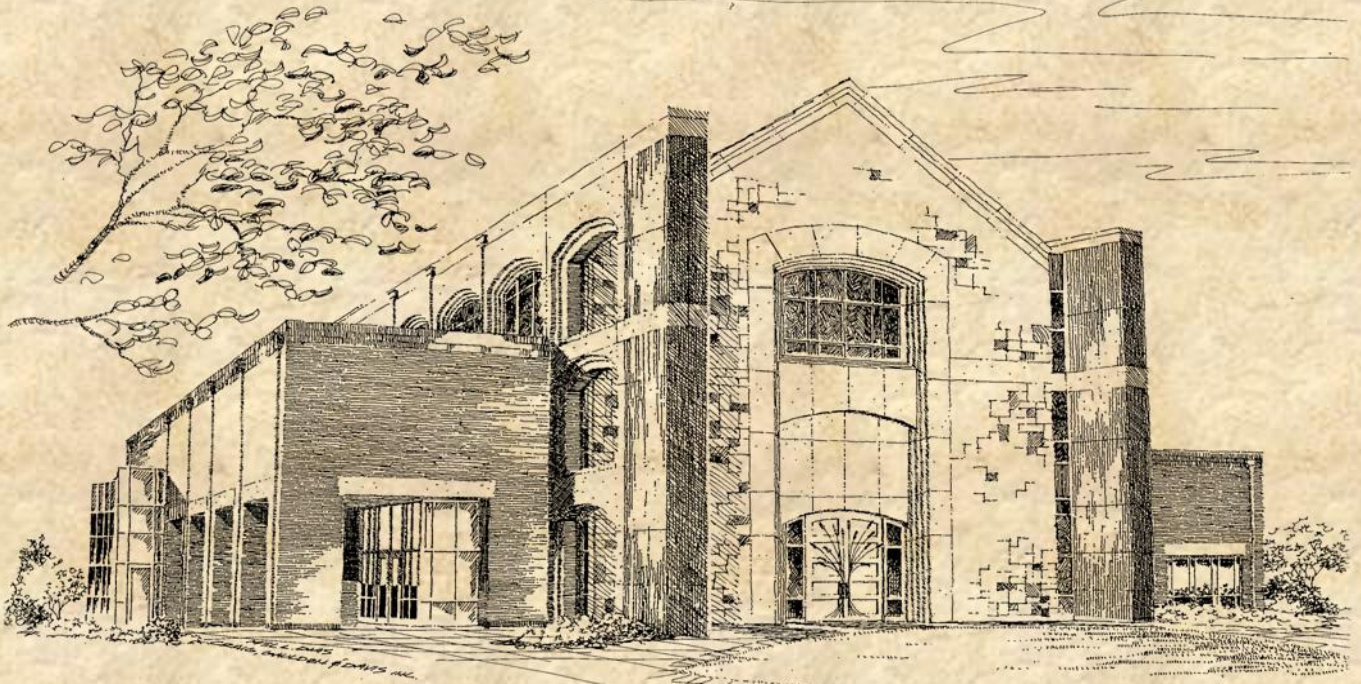

New Parishioners

Welcome! Please pick up an Information Packet and register as part of our parish family. Various facilities and services are available to our active members, including use of the church for baptisms, weddings, and other sacramental events, as well as parishioner status in parochial schools.

Active membership is determined by the following criteria: Being properly registered for a sufficient period of time; faithful attendance at Mass on Sundays and Holy Days; use of the envelope system in regular support of the parish; and being active in at least one parish program, ministry or organization.

Sacraments

Baptisms, Weddings and Funeral Masses may be celebrated according to the traditional Latin liturgical books (pre-Vatican II) OR the rituals as reformed since 1970. Please contact Msgr. Brovey with any questions.

Baptism: Call the office for information about the Baptismal Preparation Class. Baptisms are *usually* celebrated on the 1st Saturdays of the month at 10:30AM. In order to schedule a Baptism for your child, you must have attended a Baptismal Class within the last two years and have turned in all paperwork to the Church Office.

RCIA: Call Joe Waters for information about adults becoming Catholic.

Marriage Preparation: Call the Church Office at least 9 to 12 months in advance of proposed wedding date about Marriage Preparation Classes and requirements for the Sacrament of Marriage.

Anointing of the Sick: Call the parish office to receive this Sacrament prior to surgery or when gravely ill. **After Office Hours Emergencies: Call 1-866-456-2956.**

Sick, Hospitalized & Homebound: Call the parish office to request Holy Communion when hospitalized or homebound. *Isolation from our parish family by illness, advance age or other circumstances, can lead to loneliness or depression. If you or one of your loved ones will be hospitalized or is homebound due to advance age, let us know. Call the office and Joe Waters will arrange for a visit and Holy Communion. It is important to let us know when someone is released from the hospital to ensure that we transition our contact with a person when they return home.*

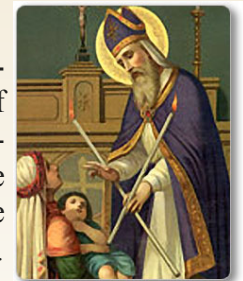

Feast of Candlemas and
Blessing of Candles
February 2, 2011

The Feast of Candlemas dates back to the 4th Century and commemorates the presentation of the Child Jesus in the Temple forty days after His birth and the purification of Mary. The Gospel for the feast proclaims the words of Simeon that Jesus will be “a revealing light to the Gentiles, the glory of your people Israel.” The Solemn Mass begins with the blessing of candles to be used at Holy Mass and in the home for the following year and then a solemn procession through the church with lighted candles. The blessing of candles and procession will take place at the School Mass on Wednesday, February 2nd at 10 AM. We will begin in Croghan Hall. If you would like to have a set of blessed Candlemas candles for home use, please be sure to place an order so that we will have enough on hand. A sign up sheet may be found in the Church narthex. (Suggested donation is \$5.00) **Please note that there will not be 10 AM Confessions that Wednesday.**



Feast of St. Blaise, Bishop and Martyr Traditionally the Blessing of Throats is offered to the faithful on February 3rd as the Church celebrates the Feast of St. Blaise. The blessing will be done during the 7AM Mass on that date.
