Welcome! Please pick up an Information Packet and register as part of our parish family.

Various facilities and services are available to our active members, including use of the church for baptisms, weddings, and other sacramental events, as well as parishioner status in parochial schools. **Active membership** is determined by the following criteria: Being properly registered for a sufficient period of time; faithful attendance at Mass on Sundays and Holy Days; use of the envelope system in regular support of the parish; and being active in at least one parish program, ministry or organization.

**Sacraments:** Baptisms, Weddings and Funeral Masses may be celebrated according to the traditional Latin liturgical books (pre-Vatican II) OR the rituals as reformed since 1970. Please contact Msgr. Brovey with any questions.

**Baptism:** Call the office for information about the Baptismal Preparation Class. Baptisms are celebrated on the 1<sup>st</sup> Saturdays of the month at 10:30AM.

**RCIA:** Call Joe Waters for information about adults becoming Catholic.

**Marriage Preparation:** Call Bebe Norris at least 9 to 12 months in advance of proposed wedding date about Marriage Preparation Classes and requirements for the Sacrament of Marriage.

**Anointing of the Sick:** Call the parish office to receive this Sacrament prior to surgery or when gravely ill. **After Office Hours Emergencies: Call 1-866-456-2956.**

**Sick, Hospitalized & Homebound:** Call the parish office to request Holy Communion when hospitalized or homebound.

**LENTEN REGULATIONS 2010**

Each year the holy season of Lent provides us a special time of grace and spiritual renewal so that we may become better instruments in sharing the Gospel message.

This year, **Ash Wednesday**, the beginning of Lent, falls on 17 February 2010. The present laws of the Church regarding fast and abstinence during the Season of Lent are as follows:

1. **Ash Wednesday** and **Good Friday** are days of **fast**. On days of fast, one full meal is allowed. Two lesser meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted. Catholics who have completed their 18<sup>th</sup> year are bound by this law until the beginning of their 60<sup>th</sup> year.
2. **Ash Wednesday** and all **Fridays of Lent** are also days of **abstinence**. On days of abstinence, meats should not be taken at any meal. The law of abstinence binds all Catholics who have completed their 14<sup>th</sup> year.

**The Obligation to observe, as a whole or "substantially," the penitential**

days specified by the Church is a serious obligation. The New Code of Canon Law states:

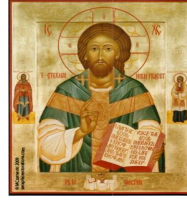
"On these days (of Penance), the faithful are in a special manner to devote themselves to prayer, to engage in works of piety and charity, to deny themselves, by fulfilling their obligations more faithfully and especially by observing the fast and abstinence..."

May this Holy Lenten season provide us an opportunity for deepening our faith, hope and love through a life of deeper prayer, penitential practices, and works of charity.
