My dear Friends in Christ,

Every day when I go to the University here in Spain, I go by a huge statue dedicated to the Blessed Mother under the title of Mother of Fairest Love. Students always stop for a quick prayer as they go off to classes and today I will go by for the last time as a student before I come to Prince of Peace as your Priest. Advent is a time when our thoughts go naturally to that remarkable woman, Mary.

I have thought a lot about her as I plan to come back home. So many people are asking me, "So what are you going to do when you get to Prince of Peace?" But when we look at the Blessed Mother, we see first of all that she let herself be guided by a Divine Plan. But in order to know what that plan was, she spent much of her time listening in prayer. Our parish family is much like Mary in her home at Nazareth, studying the Word of God, waiting for the Word of God to take flesh in our lives. That attitude of prayerful expectation and readiness to say "Be it done unto me according to Your Word," that is what all of us must do: in church, school, work and home.

What are the two most important things that our parish family does? First, we encounter the Word by learning: our excellent parish school and religious education program, our programs for adults, and our community and personal prayer. Second, we encounter the Word by serving: responding to the needs of the poor, the sick, and the suffering, as individual Christians and as a parish family.

Learning and Serving are what we as a parish family are all about. This new liturgical year marks the beginning of a new adventure in the Spirit for me and for you. Let us be attentive to the Word of God that we encounter Christ and one another by learning and serving. Mary will serve as our model and guide. Listening in prayer and ready for action, God will do great things with us, and we will be filled with joy.

novena to the immaculate conception

It is customary to pray a Novena to the Immaculate Conception starting on 29 November and ending on 7 December, the Vigil of the Feast of the Immaculate Conception.

Immaculate Virgin! Mary, Conceived without sin! Remember, thou wert miraculously preserved from even the shadow of sin, because thou wert destined to become not only the Mother of God, but also the mother, the refuge, and the advocate of man; penetrated therefore, with the most lively confidence in thy never-failing intercession, we most humbly implore thee to look with favor upon the intentions of this novena, and to obtain for us the graces and the favors we request. Thou knowest, O Mary, how often our hearts are the sanctuaries of God, Who abhors iniquity. Obtain for us, then that angelic purity which was thy favorite virtue, that purity of heart which will attach us to God alone, and that purity of intention which will consecrate every thought, word and action to His greater glory. Obtain also for us a constant spirit of prayer and self-denial that we may recover by penance that innocence which we have lost by sin, and at length attain safety to that blessed abode of the saints, where nothing defiled can enter. O Mary, conceived without sin, pray for us who have recourse to thee.

the solemnity of the immaculate conception is thursday, 8 december 2011 *it is a Holy Day of Obligation.* Masses will be Wednesday, 7 December: 7p vigil, Thursday, 8 December: 7a Low Latin EF, 9a School Mass and 7p sung English.

Welcome! Please pick up an Information Packet and register as part of our parish family. Various facilities and services are available to our active members, including use of the church for baptisms, weddings, and other sacramental events, as well as parishioner status in parochial schools.

Active membership is determined by the following criteria: Being properly registered for a sufficient period of time; faithful attendance at Mass on Sundays and Holy Days; use of the envelope system in regular support of the parish.

sacraments Baptisms, Weddings and Funeral Masses may be celebrated in the Ordinary Form (English) or the Extraordinary Form (Latin). Please contact Fr Tomlinson with any questions.

baptism: Call the office for information about the Baptismal Preparation Class. Baptisms are *usually* celebrated on the 1st Saturdays of the month at 10:30AM.

rcia: Contact Fr Tomlinson for information about adults becoming Catholic.

marriage preparation: Call the parish office at least 6 months in advance of proposed wedding date about Marriage Preparation Classes and requirements for the Sacrament of Marriage.

anointing of the sick: Call the parish office to receive this Sacrament prior to surgery or when gravely ill.
