

Navajo Missions Spring Work Trip

(late April/early May)

Churchill Baptist Church has supported the ministry of Pastor Willie Howe, a Navajo Indian, and Water Fall Bible Church in the Navajo Nation for several years. A small group of individuals travel from Churchill Baptist Church to Water Fall Bible Church every spring to work on small construction projects. Past activities have included building a storage building, painting, and plumbing.



This Year's Jobs Include:

- Spray wash and paint outside of church
- Fix roof leak near stove pipe on church
- Re-Shingle Willie's house
- Seal gap between roof and wall on storage building
- Repair door frames on storage building
- Install cold water sink in storage building
- Cut fire wood
- Build hay shed near new corrals



Immanuel Mission is located near the four corners where Arizona, Utah, New Mexico and Colorado come together. Founded in 1924 the work started in an abandoned stone trading post and has grown to include a school, a motor vehicle maintenance shop, a Navajo managed thrift shop, and the Navajo Chapel.

The primary ministry of Immanuel Mission is the school. They strive to provide a quality, Bible-based education for students K-12.

Immanuel Navajo Chapel is a fellowship of Navajo and Anglo believers. They worship together each Sunday with the Breaking of Bread, and teaching meetings in both the Navajo and English languages.

Navajo Missions Vacation Bible School

(early July)

Churchill Baptist Church has supported the ministry of Pastor Willie Howe, a Navajo Indian, and Water Fall Bible Church in the Navajo Nation for several years. Vacation Bible School at Water Fall Bible Church has become a national, multi-church event. Last year, for example, we had about 35 missionaries from nine churches in Texas, Colorado, New Jersey, Illinois, and Florida involved in some aspect of VBS. VBS reaches over 50 children from preschool through middle school and also includes activities for adults such as Bible studies and crafts. VBS typically ran from 9:00 to 12:00, with the afternoons free for activities such as hiking.



Challenges to reaching the Navajo for Christ:

Navajo have no concept of sin. For instance, the language has no wording for “I’m sorry.” Navajo are also extremely group and family-focused, which may result in the new Christian being ostracized from his family and friends. Navajo children also have absolutely no framework of Christianity. Their knowledge base begins at zero.
