## Spiritual Gifts

It's vital for you to prayerfully consider your FaithWorks! commitments in the light of your particular Spiritual Gifts. Every good gift is from God, the Bible tells us, and especially our Spiritual Gifts motivate and empower us to walk through the doors of ministry God has opened for each of us.

This list is provided to help you identify your spiritual gifts and relate them to opportunities represented in this ministry catalog. While this list is not exhaustive, it should be a guide as you select your opportunities to serve and support ministries.

Pray for God's divine guidance to lead you in your decision. With over 140 FaithWorks! Opportunities in this catalog, you're certain to find your place, working shoulder-to-shoulder with the Master in His kingdom.

1. **Administration** – Planning, organizing, and managing resources, people, events, and information. Examples: VBS Director, Sunday School Superintendent, Flower Coordinator.
2. **Apostleship** – The ability and vision to begin new ministries and take the Gospel to others. Examples include: United Methodist Disaster Response Team, Prison Sponsorship, Building Teams.
3. **Arts/Music** – To perform in a way that leads others to experience, worship, and serve God. Examples: Chancel Choir, Instrumental Musicians, Dramatic Readers.
4. **Assistance/Helps** – Working alongside others to perform behind-the-scenes tasks to sustain and enhance the Body of Christ. Examples: Sanctuary Usher, Food Pantry, Transportation, Office Helper.
5. **Compassion** – Caring and ministering to those in need. Examples: Sunshine Card Ministry, Nursing Home Volunteer, Meal Ministry, Respite for Caregivers of Elderly, Bereavement.
6. **Encouragement** – Strengthening God's people by inspiring and motivating them in their spiritual formation and growth. Examples: Friends in Faith, Big Brother Big Sister, Just Friends, College Care Packages.
7. **Evangelism** – Spreading the Good News of Jesus Christ. Examples: Carolina Cross Connection/Hinton Family Life, Disciple Bible Outreach Ministries, Prison Worship.
8. **Faith** – Trusting God's promises. Examples: Prayer Chain, Yokefellow Ministry, Prayer Group – Thursday Morning.
9. **Giving** – Contributing both materially and of oneself for the advancement of God's ministries. Examples: The Giving Tree, Writing for Newsletters/Brochures, Christmas Card Ministry.
10. **Hospitality** – Making people feel at home. Examples: Greeters, Frequent Visitor Class Refreshments, Bread Ministry.
11. **Leadership** – Influencing others with encouragement, motivation, coordination and guidance in affecting future directions. Examples: Children's Church Leader, Girl Scout Leader, Children's Choir Director, Contemporary Worship Coordinator.
12. **Teaching** – Communicating God's truth in a way people can understand and apply it. Examples: Vacation Bible School Teacher, Disciple Bible Study Co-Leader, Sunday School Teacher, Companions in Christ Co-Leader.
