Habitat for Humanity is having an "Apostle's Build" to build a home for a single mother with two children in our Habitat Village on Eastern Ave., Carrollton. The Apostle's Build is a partnership that allows twelve (or more) individual churches to join together to fund and build a Habitat home. Financial sponsorship is through CFUMC, North Georgia Housing and Homeless Council, Carrollton Presbyterian Church, Glenloch Baptist Church, Carroll EMC, and the Blue Jean Ball.

The tentative build schedule is:

July 18 - pre-fab walls, manual labor, moving lumber and hammering walls, flooring system

July 25 - Walls, roof, siding, doors, and windows. Sub-contractors on-site for plumbing, electrical, hvac, roofing, siding.

Aug. 1 - Trim, paint, and decking. Need experienced

trim installers, and painters for trim and cut-in.

Aug. 8 - Installation of faceplates, mirrors, closet organizers, clean-up

Aug. 15 - Landscape including laying sod, install mailbox
