From the Senior Pastor

The blessings began at an evening worship service recently in a 17th century cathedral in London, England. Parishioners came forward at the direction of the priest for the blessing. But the blessing was not for themselves, for others or even for animals. The blessing was for their gadgets and devices: cell phones, lap tops, blackberries and iPhones. Coming forward for the blessing were working moms, businessmen, students and retirees. As they laid their devices on the altar, the pastor intoned words of grace, then sent these people on their way.

Now unlike humans and our pets, the jury is out as to whether my lap-top has a soul worthy of being blessed. To tell the truth, I rather think it may be possessed. The blessing is not for the electronics, but rather for the users. The blessing is rendered for those who text, tweet and type.

But let us imagine, for a moment, that our electronic devices can be spiritual and Spirit led. Would this change how we use them? Would this cause us to reconsider the places we go with them? Might we rethink what we speak through them to others?

Having been on the hurtful end (and to be honest –also the sending end) of some harsh emails I can only imagine how they might have been phrased differently had the Holy Spirit been indulged just before they were sent. Having seen some of the cruel and disturbing web sites out there, I think their creator might have been more careful and compassionate before sending them out into cyber-space.

There is also a more positive way to imagine our technological devices as a spiritual and Spirit led creation. We might spend some time using them for

the building of the Kingdom. We might use those cellular devices to make contacts with people whose day would be immensely brightened by our phone call. We might visit a web site that offers a blessing rather than a curse (a favorite of mine is www.upperroom.org).

We might even consider blessing the devices by giving them a much needed Sabbath and having a real face-to-face conversation with a friend instead.

So today I am laying my cell phone and laptop on God's altar and asking the Holy Spirit to help me use these things in a way that blesses not only me, but the world. Perhaps I could begin by writing an uplifting front page for this month's *Messenger*.

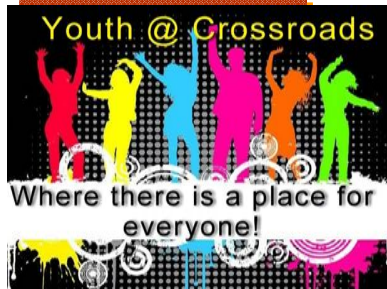

China Update

As you may know, my wife and I were in Qingdao, China from 2005 to 2009. While there I ran an English corner in which native speaking English persons talk with several Chinese on various subjects. I also taught a Bible study at a "Three-Self-Church", a government sponsored church. When we left, three missionaries continued to teach the Bible study and the pastor suggested that the Qingdao church and Crossroads establish a relationship for

mutual benefit, which we have done.

Now the Bible study has grown to 40 to 50 people. This group did an English play for the rest of the Qingdao congregation at Christmastime. Two of the members of the Bible study became missionaries first traveling to Switzerland to be trained and then to Jordan to share the Gospel. One of the members of the English corner wrote just before Christmas to say that he had

become a Christian.

The Outreach Committee is looking to send a group of Crossroads parishioners to China. This group would teach the Bible, music, English, and church administration. They would also possibly do some repair work on the Qingdao church building.

We will keep you updated on this exciting relationship.

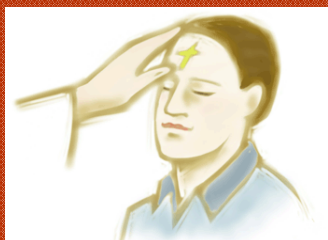

Nurse Sally's Tip of the Month

Ten Tips for Better Sleep

It seems as though every time I turn around lately someone is complaining to me that they are having trouble sleeping. Lack of sleep can make us crabby, among other things. Work, household responsibilities and child care can make sleep difficult. Factor in financial worries, layoffs, relationship issues, or an illness, and quality sleep may be even more difficult.

You may not be able to control or eliminate all the factors that interfere with your sleep, but you can create an environment and adopt habits that encourage a more restful night. Try these suggestions if you have trouble falling asleep or staying asleep:

- **Go to bed and get up at the same time every day, even on weekends.** Sticking to a schedule helps reinforce your sleep-wake cycle.
- **Don't eat or drink large**

amounts before bedtime.

Eat a light dinner about two hours before sleeping. Also, limit how much you drink after dinner to avoid trips to the bathroom during the night.

- **Avoid nicotine, caffeine and alcohol in the evening.**

These are stimulants that can keep you awake.

- **Exercise regularly.**

Regular physical activity, especially aerobic, can help you fall asleep faster and sleep more restfully. But don't exercise within three hours of your bedtime.

- **Make your bedroom cool, dark and quiet.**

Adjust the lights, temperature and noise level to your preferences. Use a mask, earplugs, extra blankets, a fan, or other devices to create an environment that suits your needs.

- **Sleep primarily at night.**

Daytime naps may steal hours from nighttime slumber. Limit naps to about half an hour and make it during mid afternoon.

- **Choose a comfortable mattress and pillow.** If you share your bed, make sure there is enough room for two. Keep pets off your bed; they can be disruptive.

- **Start a relaxing bedtime routine.** Do the same things each night to tell your body it's time to wind down. This may include a warm bath, reading a book or listening to soothing music.

- **Use sleeping pills only as a last resort.** Check with your doctor before taking any sleep medications. He/she will make sure the pills won't interact with other medications you are taking.

If you are having trouble sleeping more than three times a week for a month, check with your doctor. Identifying and treating the cause of your sleep disturbance can help you get back to a good night's sleep.

You can create an environment and adopt habits that encourage a more restful night.

night with stars,

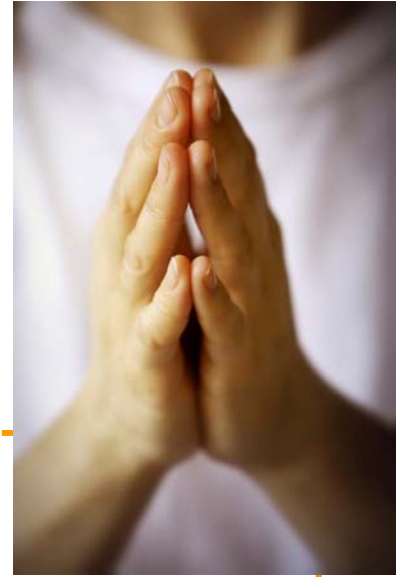
for I need to lift my eyes and

Prayer Challenge

Praying For Disaster Victims By Sally Charlton

I awakened this morning to the news of the huge earthquake that devastated Haiti. Haiti is the poorest island in the Caribbean and as such has no resources to help itself. I am always proud that our wonderful country is the first to respond and assist with relief efforts.

Haiti is a Christian country; about 85% are Catholic. As I watched the devastation, I saw people praising God for sparing their lives. There was no malice, just praise. It warmed my heart to know that they were allowing our Loving God to comfort them.

As I began to pray for Haiti it occurred to me that I generally pray to change things, to stop a

tragedy. But when the tragedy has already happened, how do I pray? I went to the Methodist General Global Board of Discipleship website for guidance. The following prayer is from that website, with a few of my own thoughts and words added:

Dear Heavenly Father,

Let us pray for all those affected by the earthquake in Haiti; Let us pray for all those involved in the attempts to rescue, to relieve suffering, and to bring aid. Let us pray for the global community, that we may find new levels of compassion through cooperation.

As we pray for the victims and survivors, let us show compassion for all who suffer, let no prejudice enter our hearts.

Let us remember that those who perished in the earthquake are more than numbers, more than statistics and extremely valuable to God; each was a person of sacred worth created in His image. In the aftermath of this terrible earthquake, we are comforted by the knowledge that the same God who knows when a sparrow falls to the ground knew and loved each of those who died much more than a sparrow.

We are called by the Holy Spirit to be united with all the children of God, let us be ready to respond in Christian love to those in need.

We pray all this in the name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Amen.
