WHAT HAPPENS?

There are talks which lead to a better understanding of the scope and depth of the Cursillo movement and its relationship within the church.

There are times of sharing, fellowship, worship, singing, teaching, learning, and discernment.

BUT, it is NOT another Cursillo three-day weekend nor a repeat of the weekend talks.

WHO LEADS AN ECLW?

The team, selected by a district coordinator working with the national movement, consists of 3 or 4 persons, including a priest.

The host community provides persons to serve as table leaders, music leaders, and support staff.

WHEN, WHO, WHERE ?

The location is a retreat center or a church as determined by the local host.

Neighboring dioceses are encouraged to send individuals from their movements. (This sharing and linking is beneficial to the movement as a whole.)

The workshop begins on Friday evening and ends Sunday afternoon. Dioceses (or regions) are encouraged to have an ECLW every 2 to 4 years.

WHAT IS THE COST?

Cost is dependent upon the number of participants, the facility, and the availability of scholarship funds.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND?

- Those Cursillistas who wish to explore a servant leadership within the Cursillo movement.
- Those who want a better fundamental understanding of the Cursillo movement.
