Spiritual Gifts

“The gifts he gave were that some would be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and teachers, to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ.” Ephesians 4:11-12.

“We have gifts that differ according to the grace given to us: prophecy, in proportion to faith; ministry, in ministering; the teacher, in teaching; the exhorter, in exhortation; the giver, in generosity; the leader, in diligence; the compassionate, in cheerfulness.” Romans 12: 6-8.

“Now you are the body of Christ and individually members of it. And God has appointed in the church first apostles, second prophets, third teachers; then deeds of power, then gifts of healing, forms of assistance, forms of leadership, various kind of tongues.” I Corinthians 12:27-28.

“Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. To one is given through the Spirit the utterance of knowledge according to the same Spirit, to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit, to another the working of miracles, to another prophecy, to another the discernment of spirits, to another various kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues...Indeed, the body does not consist of one member but of many. If the foot would say, ‘Because I am not a hand, I do not belong to the body,’ that would not make it any less a part of the body...But as it is, God arranged the members in the body, each of them, as he chose. If all were a single member, where would the body be?”

I Corinthians 12:4-10, 14-15, 18. *You are encouraged to read I Corinthians Chapter 12 in its entirety.*

Administration

A gift of organization, planning, thinking ahead and solving problems before they arise.

“Therefore, friends, select from among yourselves seven men of good standing, full of the Spirit and of wisdom, whom we may appoint to this task, while we, for our part, will devote ourselves to prayer and to serving the word.” Acts 6:3-4. See also Luke 14:28-30.

Examples of Ministries to consider are: Long Range Planning, Church Officer, Finance and Stewardship, Worship and Music

Apostle

A gift which may involve the edifying of various church groups and may involve the establishing of new ministries.

“So then you are no longer strangers and aliens, but you are citizens with the saints and also members of the household of God, built upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ Jesus himself as the cornerstone. In him the whole structure is joined together and grows into a holy temple in the Lord; in whom you also are built together spiritually into a dwelling place for God.” Ephesians 2:19-22.

Examples of Ministries to consider are: Church Officer, Mission Outreach, Christian Education, Worship and Music

Discernment

A gift which has to do with distinguishing between truth and error, good and evil.

“Beloved, do not believe every spirit, but test the spirits to see whether they are from God; for many false prophets have gone out into the world... We are from God. Whoever knows God listens to us, and whoever is not from God does not listen to us. From this we know the spirit of truth and the spirit of error.” I John 4:1,6.

Examples of Ministries to consider are: Long Range Planning, Church Officer, Christian Education

Encouragement

A gift of giving courage, hope or confidence.

“As you know, we dealt with each one of you like a father with his children, urging and encouraging you and pleading that you lead a life worthy of God, who calls you into his own kingdom and glory.” I Thessalonians 2:11-12.

Examples of Ministries to consider are: Congregational Care, Christian Education, Mission Outreach, Worship and Music

Evangelism

A gift of leading people to Christ through speech and loving action.

“Now those who were scattered went from place to place, proclaiming the word. Philip went down to the city of Samaria and proclaimed the Messiah to them.” Acts 8:4-5. See also verses 26-40.

Examples of Ministries to consider are: Christian Education, Worship and Music, Mission Outreach

Faith

A gift of trusting the Lord in all circumstances.

“For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God.” Ephesians 2:8. See also Hebrews 11:1.

Examples of Ministries to consider are: Long Range Planning, Church Officer, Finance and Stewardship

Giving

A gift to joyfully share an extraordinary proportion of one's time, energy, and resources to the work of the Lord.

“For during a severe ordeal of affliction, their abundant joy and their extreme poverty have overflowed in a wealth of generosity on their part. For, as I can testify, they voluntarily gave according to their means, and even beyond their means, begging us earnestly for the privilege of sharing in this ministry to the saints and this, not merely as we expected; they gave themselves first to the Lord and, by the will of God, to us.” II Corinthians 8:2-5.

Examples of Ministries to consider are: Congregational Care, Finance and Stewardship, Facilities Care

Healing

A gift which enables helping others become whole in mind, body, and/or spirit.

“Are any among you sick? They should call for the elders of the church and have them pray over them, anointing them with oil in the name of the Lord.” James 5:14.

Examples of Ministries to consider are: Congregational Care, Church Officer, Mission Outreach

Helper

A gift of sensing a need and bringing support to others to relieve their burden and/or support their ministry by working and being with them.

“Then the righteous will answer him, ‘Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry and gave you food, or thirsty and gave you something to drink? And when was it that we saw you a stranger and welcomed you, or naked and gave you clothing? And when was it that we saw you sick or in prison and visited you?’ And the king will answer them, ‘Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me.’” Matthew 25:37-40. See also Numbers 11:17.

Examples of Ministries to consider are: Congregational Services, Facilities Care, Food and Fellowship, Women’s Ministry

Hospitality

A gift of welcoming strangers and making people feel at ease with joy and effectiveness.

“Let mutual love continue. Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for by doing that some have entertained angels without knowing it.” Hebrews 13:1-2. See also I Peter 4:9-10 and Romans 12:13.

Examples of Ministries to consider are: Food and Fellowship, Worship and Music, Congregational Care, Women’s Ministry

Intercession

A gift of praying for others faithfully and steadfastly.

“First of all, then, I urge that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be made for everyone.” I Timothy 2:1. See also Genesis 20:17 and Luke 2:37.

Examples of Ministries to consider are: Congregational Care, Women’s Ministry, Mission Outreach

Knowledge

A gift of discovering, analyzing, and clarifying information and ideas which are pertinent to the growth and well-being of the church.

“Now we have received not the spirit of the world, but the Spirit that is from God, so that we may understand the gifts bestowed on us by God. And we speak of these things in words not taught by human wisdom but taught by the Spirit, interpreting spiritual things to those who are spiritual.” I Corinthians 2:12-13.

Examples of Ministries to consider are: Christian Education, Long Range Planning, Finance and Stewardship, Worship and Music

Leadership

A gift to lead others effectively in various areas of Christian ministry while offering personal concern and care for their growth.

“But we appeal to you, brothers and sisters, to respect those who labor among you, and have charge of you in the Lord and admonish you.” I Thessalonians 5:12.

Examples of Ministries to consider are: Church Officer, Christian Education, Finance and Stewardship, Worship and Music, Women’s Ministry

Mercy

A gift to feel genuine empathy and compassion for individuals who suffer distressing physical, mental, or emotional problems and to translate that compassion into deeds done cheerfully which reflect Christ’s love and alleviate the suffering.

“Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of mercies and the God of all consolation, who consoles us in all our affliction, so that we may be able to console those who are in any affliction with the consolation with which we ourselves are consoled by God.” II Corinthians 1:3-4.

Examples of Ministries to consider are: Congregational Care, Mission Outreach, Women’s Ministry

Pastor

A gift to assume long-term personal responsibility for the spiritual welfare of a believer or group of believers.

“Keep watch over yourselves and over all the flock, of which the Holy Spirit has made you overseers, to shepherd the church of God that he obtained with the blood of his own Son. I know that after I have gone, savage wolves will come in among you, not sparing the flock. Some even from your own group will come distorting the truth in order to entice the disciples to follow them. Therefore be alert, remembering that for three years I did not cease night or day to warn everyone with tears.” Acts 20:28-31. See also I Timothy 4:11-16.

Examples of Ministries to consider are: Church Officer, Christian Education, Congregational Care, Worship and Music

Service

A gift to selflessly help or aid in various areas of Christian work.

“And we urge you, beloved to admonish the idlers, encourage the faint hearted, help the weak, be patient with all of them.” I Thessalonians 5:14.

Examples of Ministries to consider are: Facilities Care, Worship and Music, Congregational Services, Women’s Ministry, Christian Education

Teaching

A gift to communicate God’s truth to others in such a way that it can bring understanding and application.

“ I did not shrink from doing anything helpful, proclaiming the message to you and teaching you publicly and from house to house, as I testified to both Jews and Greeks about repentance toward God and faith toward our Lord Jesus.” Acts 20:20-21.

Examples of Ministries to consider are: Christian Education, Church Officer, Women’s Ministry, Worship and Music

Wisdom

A gift of insight into the ways of God, into the understanding of life situations and into the linking of the two, so that one knows what to do and how to do it.

“If any of you is lacking wisdom, ask God, who gives to all generously and ungrudgingly, and it will be given you.” James 1:5.

Examples of Ministries to consider are: Long Range Planning, Church Officer, Finance and Stewardship, Worship and Music, Christian Education
