Annual Parish Meeting, January 21



Every year, St. Luke's on the Lake hosts its Annual Parish Meeting. The Canons of the Church require that two items must be attended to – the election of the Vestry (here, it is accomplished by a slate of four candidates) and the presentation of the 2018 budget. This year the Vestry will provide information on the transition process as we call our Fourth Rector. The Annual Parish Meeting will be on Sunday, January 21, at 10:15 AM in the Fellowship Hall.



The Church year renewed the first Sunday in December and now our secular calendar has caught up. It is hard to believe that 2018 is upon us and we are all headed into a new year together. Many will be starting this New Year with anticipation and much relief as 2017 is behind us now, but many can feel some apprehension to what lies ahead.

Lots happening with the middle and high school EYC! For the past few months, we've been going through some key passages in the book of Acts where the disciples (who Jesus had told would eventually become fishers of men) began to experience resistance from religious leaders as they spread the Gospel of Jesus. When two of them were imprisoned overnight for healing a lame man, the crowds asked them where their power came from, and of course they told them, "Jesus." The authorities set them free, but asked them to please stop talking about Jesus! Their response was, "We can't stop talking about what we've seen and what we've heard."

The Gospel is not a new set of beliefs or an addendum to Judaism or some new philosophy. The Gospel is based on an actual event in history where Jesus was crucified, buried, and rose again for the forgiveness of our sins. The only way anyone will ever know about this event is if somebody tells them. Therefore, what we learned is that the Gospel message is not an intuitive message. In other words, you cannot sit underneath an apple tree and come to the knowledge of this event. Someone has to tell you, which is why the disciples later prayed for boldness to proclaim God's Word.

As believers, even as a youth group, God is molding us to become "fishers of people," because we know the only way our friends will ever know about the message of Jesus is if someone tells them. God also set it up for us to partner with the church (and retreats like Happening) so when we invite our friends, they will hear this amazing message of God's love.

CHILDREN AND FAMILY MINISTRIES



When I think of New Year's, I immediately see the big light ball in New York City, traveling down to the new year's number. Fireworks light up the sky and remind me that newness is often associated with Light. The Light. Hold that thought.

I also think of Casey Casum's voice doing the countdown for the ball. And in turn, that reminds me of Top 40's count downs on Sunday mornings when I was a teen, and how, just as SOON as the last prayer in church ended, I would try to slip out to the car to hear the top 3 songs of the week after church. My Dad (the preacher) would roll his eyes as I quickly shook the Parishioners' hands or hugged everyone before RUSHING outside and into the car. There I would anxiously wait for Casey's voice and the top pop hit of the week – what is more important to a teen in the '70's than knowing what the top song was for that week??

Music and Light.

Music (and rushing to be AWAY from anyone older than 22) is still very important to your children. Your youth. Sound is one of the strongest memory tugs in the human brain. How many times have you heard an old song (from your youth) and have a memory light up before your eyes? Remember how important music was to you and see that though "their music" does not sound like yours and mine did, it is still important to them. An expression of who they are and sometimes, a light to guide them through their very own dark time.

And Light? Light is what is needed to pervade the darkness. While every new year brings us an opportunity to envision newness and light, we must share The Light every day. Every new day gives us a brand new opportunity to share God's grace and goodness with everyone around us.

Be the music: make memories WITH your youth (even if it really does not sound like music). Be the light: let us shine His Light, reflected by who we are, what we do and how we treat others. Just by being who we are: a Community in Christ and Christ to the World.

- **Pre-EYC** meets from 5-7pm in Big Room Riker. We just get together and have some fun (and it can definitely get a little crazy), building relationships and marshmallow towers. Okay, so we will ALSO see what marshmallows have to do with Jesus, so you will want to be there and even invite a friend to join us. We feed them, regular food.

Online Giving Options

Dear Parishioners,

Many of you have inquired about online options for sending donations to St. Luke's on the Lake. This letter is intended to inform you of some convenient electronic alternatives to fulfill your pledge for the upcoming year. Electronic delivery of your pledge to the parish is easy to set up and is available in a number of varieties:

1. Automated Payment issued via your own financial institution: Using this option, you may set up a regular, automated payment from your bank account directly to St. Luke's on the Lake. In most cases, banks refer to this service as "Online" or "Web" Bill Pay, and it results in the regular issuance of a check that is mailed directly to us. Contact your bank or your bank's website for details on this service, or click on the "Online Giving" link on the our home page (<http://stlukesonthelake.org>) for more information (including direct links to many local banks).

2. Automated Payment through our Vanco service: Using this option, you may set up a recurring electronic payment between your bank account and St. Luke's on the Lake. In this case, no check is issued/mailed- your payment is made electronically via the same automated clearing house (ACH) process that banks and retailers use to clear checks. We contract with a company called Vanco to provide this service. This is the fastest, least expensive way to regularly get your pledge to the parish. Click on the "Online Giving" link on our home page for more information or call the church office if you need assistance.

Credit Card Payment through our Vanco service: Using this option, you may set up a recurring electronic payment using a major credit/debit card. Your regular payment will be charged to the authorized card. This is also done via our service provider, Vanco. While convenient, this is the most expensive payment mechanism for the church. St. Luke's will incur a fee of 2%-3% for each credit card transaction. We would encourage you to take that fee into account when setting the amount of your pledge. Click on the "Online Giving" link on our home page for more information or call the church office if you need assistance.

These same electronic giving options are also available for other recurring and one-time contributions to St. Luke's on the Lake. This includes Endowment Pledges, Missions and Outreach giving, Vacation Bible School (VBS) and Youth (EYC) contributions, and SLOL special events.

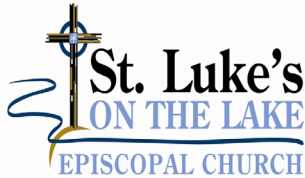
