25th Anniversary Celebration

Faith In Action Caregivers Northwest will be celebrating 25 years of service in October. This organization was started with the intent of providing transportation and other support services to seniors 60 and older, thereby allowing them to live independently. 25 years later we are still helping area seniors go to the grocery store, hair appointments and medical appointments. Our clients are so grateful for the caring door through door service we provide.

St. Luke's on the Lake became involved when West Austin caregivers came to an ECW luncheon and described the services they were providing for seniors in their area. The idea caught on and soon we joined with nine other area churches. Office space was generously donated by Anderson Mill Baptist Church - they still provide it today. Senior Day Out, a social event held twice monthly, was held at Pond Springs Baptist Church with a second group meeting at Cedar Park United Methodist Church. This activity continues but the venue has moved to Anderson Mill Baptist Church. St. Luke's on the Lake is an

active participant in this activity with St. Margaret/St. Ann's Guild providing a lunch and a snack and The Guild of the Christ Child providing a lunch for the participants.

In addition to transportation for the clients there are handyman services and friendly callers. Sometimes all that is needed is a friendly voice on the phone or a light bulb needs to be changed.

At the end of the first year, 45 clients had been served by 46 volunteers with 126 rides given. At the end of 2010 the number of clients had increased to 422 and they had received 6088 rides from 263 volunteers. We have increased our service area and are now the largest Caregiver group in Central Texas. We have included Steiner Ranch, Riverplace and Grandview Hills in our service area and have 17 clients residing in those areas needing rides and other assistance.

Our current need for drivers from Steiner Ranch, Grandview Hills and Riverplace is great. Often those drive requests must go unfilled because of lack of drivers. If they are filled, it is a lengthy drive for a Cedar Park or Leander driver. This is an ideal volunteer job since you pick the day, time and amount of time you want to spend. Moms with kids can apply!! If time is not what you have to spend, monetary donations are appreciated as our expenses increase with the increase in clients and activity.

As part of our birthday celebration we are raffling a quilt made by the Sew Special Sonshiners from Anderson Mill Baptist Church. Raffle tickets are available on Sundays during Sunday School from Mary Duggan. They are \$1 each or 6 for \$5. The drawing will be held on October 27th.

The Rector's Bible Study: Discovering John

The second chapter of John's Gospel opens the section that contains the public ministry of Jesus, from its beginning in Galilee to its climax in Jerusalem. 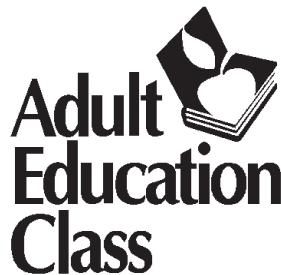

Jesus Lives Here

True story: On the evening of September 6, 2011, after a very full 48 hours of supporting our friends and neighbors of the Steiner Ranch Community across the street, everyone deserved a break. So, St. Luke's Parishioners came together in the Parish Hall for a hot meal . . . for about 250 residents of Steiner Ranch who just did not need to worry about dinner. We collected, cooked and cleaned up afterwards. So many were grateful and we were happy to serve.

But that is not even the best part. This is: One of those residents was a sweet 3 year old girl who came with her family. She had attended St. Luke's Hometown Nazareth Adventure (our VBS). And as she walked into the church, she smiled a knowing smile and exclaimed, "Jesus lives here!"

Cute, you say? Sweet?

Well, yes. You'll probably remember that our theme this past summer was about Jesus as a kid. In Nazareth. Where He lived as a kid. But what you also have to remember is that on September 6th, those marvelous decorations transforming our campus into Jesus' hometown were long gone. And there was no Timothy the Toolman or Nazarene Nancy or even Jesus' mother, Mary. This sweet child just remembered this is where she learned about Jesus. Where he obviously touched her heart.

Right here at St. Luke's on the Lake. And this is where people she did not even know, made and served her family a meal. Where they provided a safe place to be. Where they were Jesus to her.

This **IS** where Jesus lives. Here at St. Luke's, Jesus lives in each of us. He lives in that little girl's heart and memory too. As a child, she will remember learning about Jesus at VBS; as an adult, she will remember that she learned about Jesus' love through the actions of strangers who lived with Jesus in their hearts.

"Do you hear what these children are saying?"

Jesus said, "Yes, I hear them. And haven't you read in God's Word, 'From the mouths of children and babies I'll furnish a place of praise'?"

I started writing this piece to illustrate the importance of Christian Formation programs like BLAST Island and VBS. I wanted you to have yet another example of why it is crucial to support Children's Ministry.

But, can you think of a better way to honor our Lord and Savior than to hear "Jesus lives here" in a sweet preschooler voice? Realizing that I am a bit biased, I have to admit there is no greater joy than to hear a child's voice utter His name.

One of the things we do really well here at St. Luke's is Children's Ministry. Not that the other ministries are not good. They are. But maybe now is the time to take a longer look. Please put aside my obvious bias and look at the programs we have for kids (which, by the way, were well-established before I even got here). What better ways to spend our precious resources of time, treasure and talent.

This is imperative to understand, as without kids, you don't have families and without families there is no growth. No growth for St. Luke's and no growth for God's family.

Understanding the impact that Children's Ministry has on growing God's kingdom in the hearts of so many young ones is key to completing our mission for Christ. So, as you read on, please consider where you can plug into Children and Family Ministries (CFM) or otherwise support those already serving. We have some great established programs and a couple of new/renewed ideas as well.

You can't find a better place to serve, because Jesus lives here!

BLAST Island

classrooms during the week. But we also got some much needed storage and a start on a repainted hallway.

Our kids have experienced plenty of opportunities these last few weeks to help literal strangers, affected by the terrible wildfires. We will be focusing on how both sides feel when compassion is called upon by our Lord. These studies were decided on long before the recent events we have experienced here in the Austin area. Don't know about you, but I am sure glad God is in charge.

We are SO blessed in BLAST Island this year! We are definitely experiencing kid overflow! All but one of our classes in rotation stations has more than 10 kids. What a great problem to have! However, one need that has arisen in Computer Cave is a couple of extra computers. We would like to have them similar in style and of course operating system compatible. Also, we would like to be able to print out our occasional creations in color, so we would really put a new (or re-purposed) color printer to use. Triple P – Parents’ Participation Program, Re-take:

Last October, we proposed this program, but never followed up. SO, beginning in October 2011, parents of children at all age levels will be asked to begin participating in their child’s BLAST Island experience. Parents will be notified as to when they are scheduled to participate as a guest shepherd, at least one time over the course of the school year. Don’t worry. The regular shepherd or leader will be there too. But we hope to give everyone an opportunity to discover just what we do on the Island. This will include our Youth classes of 6th-12th graders (gasp!!). As part of our continued attempt to partner with parents in the spiritual formation of your kids, we feel this is a valuable “event” for all involved. Please try to make it to your child’s class. We know you will learn something. ☺

Parent Support Group (PSG)

No, there is no 12 step program here. But, as part of our Parish-wide Strategic Goals Initiative (PwSGI -- not really), we came up with the idea of a sort of Parent Teacher Association (PTA) for St. Luke’s Children’s Ministries, including the EYC. While we are in the thoughtful stages just now, we would invite all those who might be interested in making a further investment in the spiritual formation of our children and youth here at St. Luke’s. Facebook was alive with alerts of what was going on and where people could go. In the days that followed, our church was alive with activity. "What can we do? Whom can we help? How can we serve?"

Aloha from Hawaii!

We had our team that went to the Philippines come back from outreach this week from the April DTS and they had an incredible outreach. They were able to teach about how to hear God's voice to over a hundred high school students who were able to practice that right away. This group of seven prayed for people to be healed and saw over twenty people get radically healed right in front of their eyes, from kidney stones disappearing to arthritis leaving and even someone who couldn't see was able to see perfectly after Jesus healed them. They traveled all over the Philippines and saw God move in huge ways.

I just got back from a two week outreach to Orange County, California where two YWAM bases teamed up to do an outreach in America for the first time in thirty years (the Kona base and the Denver base). We had two hundred and fifty people hit the streets everyday doing evangelism, and at night time we had tent revival meetings next to Huntington beach. We saw over a hundred people come to know Jesus and start a relationship with Him and tons of Christians had revival come to their hearts. Plus a ton of people were physically healed by God. It was so awesome to be a part of a mission trip in America and see that God really is bringing revival to America. He is speaking the same thing to Christians all over this country, that revival has come and that this is a significant time to be alive in history. This is the first time ever that everyone on earth will soon have a chance to hear the gospel in their own language through the advancements in technology. God is alive and moving here and in the Nations. Thank you so much for your prayers!

- Why, then, do so few of us actually seem to participate in regular worship? Daily prayer and study? Acts of mercy and compassion?
- Why do so many of us say, "I worship God in my own way on the golf course/in my boat/hiking in the woods/up in the mountains. I don't need organized religion. It gets in between me and God."
- Why do others of us say, "Religion is an old superstition that was once useful for human social development. Now we have science to explain things."
