During these past three months, I have studied, read, rested, traveled, enjoyed family time, and reflected on my ministry. It has all been wonderful.

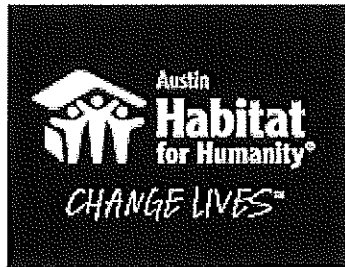
One of the books I read this summer was the new biography on Dietrich Bonhoeffer, written by Eric Metaxas. Titled "Bonhoeffer: Pastor, Martyr, Prophet, Spy," the book is lengthy (over five hundred pages), but reads like a novel. I commend it to you.

"When Christ calls a man," writes Bonhoeffer, "he bids him come and die." Of course, there are different kinds of dying, but the essence of discipleship is contained in these words. Discipleship is costly; it is not "cheap." As I read Metaxas' book, I was struck (and frequently, convicted) by Bonhoeffer's complete absence of fear, his humility, and his candidness. He was martyred by the Nazis in the last days of World War II.

Discipleship is not simply about going to church. It is not about reading your bible and saying your prayers; it is not about the service you provide in the community or your fellowship group. These may be parts of being a disciple, but primary to discipleship is a life that is willing to be molded and patterned, of being one who is willing to follow and obey. So, ask yourself, "Where do I resist following and obeying? When do I turn to my own way rather than a way the Jesus may be calling on me to turn?"

If we allow Jesus to lead us, to be Lord over all of us – not just these parts we offer to His Lordship – then we, too, will be following and obedient. During my sabbatical, I attempted to take on "costly discipleship" by listening to my heart. I did not let myself "off the hook" by returning to familiar patterns. I discovered the experience to be thrilling and scary, affirming and challenging, filled with hope and with fear. Nevertheless, by the grace of God, I am,

In their own words, here are brief introductions to them:

From Laura Calender:

Hello St. Luke's! I'm excited to be serving with all of you as my field parish this year! Being from the Pacific Northwest (Washington's Olympic Peninsula to be precise), it feels like coming home every time I set foot in St. Luke's sanctuary and look out over the sparkling blue water. The warm welcome that has been extended to me whenever I visited during the past year has made that "I'm home" feeling even more special. Thank you so much! Allow me to introduce myself. My full name is Laura Helen Faithseeker Callender, but Laura or even "Hey You" will suffice while we get to know each other. I was born in and grew up in Ohio (right on Lake Erie—heart of the Snow Belt) and I moved to Washington, Diocese of Olympia, in 2001. Discovering John

The second chapter of John's Gospel opens the section that contains the public ministry of Jesus, from its beginning in Galilee to its climax in Jerusalem. This section is organized around seven miracles, or "signs." For John, each sign is seen as a special action by Jesus for the purpose of revealing his glory to those who believe. Also, these signs are intended to confront others with the need to decide about Jesus.

These signs reveal the glory of God in the sense that they show God's power at work through the person of Jesus. This power is always life-giving, and reminds us that Jesus himself offers life. The signs involve the physical elements of life – bread, water, wine, healing of the body, restoration of life. So, through Jesus, God is at work in the world, restoring health and bringing salvation to the world. May we see the glory of Jesus today!

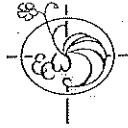

The regular polls taken about religious attitudes and practices in the United States tell us that we are an intensely religious people.

- Why, then, do so few of us actually seem to participate in regular worship? Daily prayer and study? Acts of mercy and compassion?
- Why do so many of us say, "I worship God in my own way on the golf course/in my boat/hiking in the woods/up in the mountains. I don't need organized religion. It gets in between me and God."
- Why do others of us say, "Religion is an old superstition that was once useful for human social development. Now we have science to explain things."

**Why, in this twenty-first century,
continue to have faith, follow Jesus, and do so in the Episcopal Church?**

First Saturdays intends to be an ongoing series of conversations to engage us in why we continue to do just that. First Saturdays will be a safe place to ask the questions you have wanted to ask but thought unsafe to ask in the church, to express your doubts, to live with uncertainty while on the spiritual pilgrimage. First Saturdays will be a community of pilgrims.

What will we do?

Between 10:00 a.m and 12:00 noon, we'll pray, have a teaching to frame the day's topic, and then engage one another in conversation. Over coffee, tea, and snacks we'll engage the following topics: Who, me, on a Spiritual Pilgrimage?, Why Baptism?, Why the Bible and the Biblical Narrative?, How can the Bible still be living today?, The History of the Church, Prayer Book worship and the life of prayer, Why place the Holy Eucharist at the center of our fellowship?, Why and how do I listen to God and follow Jesus?, Can I have a meaningful vocation and ministry in life?

When will we meet?

We'll meet on the following nine Saturdays: September 3, October 1, November 12 (not a First Saturday), December 10 (also not a First Saturday), January 7, February 4, March 3, April 14 (also not a First Saturday), and May 5.

- If you want to prepare to join the Episcopal Church through Confirmation.
- If you have questions about the life of faith and following Jesus.
- If you have a desire or sense a call to go deeper into faith and following Jesus.

Tornado Relief Efforts Continue to towns of Hackleburg & Phil Campbell, Alabama and Smithville, Mississippi



"This is a marathon, not a sprint." This is what our Jr. Warden Allen Griswold likes to say about our church's ongoing support of victims of the April 27th tornado that ripped through Mississippi and Alabama. Since early May, Allen has made five 30-hour round trips to the area with donations of supplies and cash to help citizens of three small rural communities recover from this disaster. Many of these families have lost EVERYTHING and are still struggling on a daily basis to meet basic needs.

Allen plans to make another trip in mid-August with the primary focus being to help children and families of the area with "back-to-school" preparations. School supplies, backpacks, TVs and DVD players for school rooms, and Barnes & Noble or Amazon gift cards for libraries, are all sought for this trip. Other high-priority needs include Lowe's cards, cash, small appliances, sheets & pillow cases [new only], bath & hand towels [new only], kitchen starter sets, non-perishable food, baby wipes, daily hygiene items, cleaning supplies, plastic bags, and trash cans. Over the course of the year, I will send out emails after meetings describing what we discussed, PLEASE TALK ABOUT THESE!!! 45 minutes of discussion time is sometimes just not enough and remember that parents remain the greatest influence in their children's lives.

I pray that we are able to have another great year of youth group at St. Luke's and that we are all able, in our own way, of answering the question, "Why are you a Christian?"

My Dad taught me that it was okay for me to believe "differently" from him. Not the basic truths, of course. But, he always encouraged me to fully "trust and believe Him from the heart," being able to totally defend my beliefs with "the confidence and faith of the heart alone."

Our BLAST Island theme for 2011-2012 is "Following God's Call." We will be studying numerous people from the Bible who illustrate pure selflessness as it relates to truly hearing and acting on God's commands. We will start with the true story of the Widow's Mite, which complements our Stewardship Campaign. As Jesus observed the people entering the temple one day, he asked the disciples who was giving the most, the Widow with her two mites or the rich Pharisees, with their lavish presentation of wealth. Both Jr High classes (6/7th graders meet separately) are designed to be interactive and well, fun!

This year, we are trying some new things in regard to the Sr High Class. In an effort to keep it relevant and Biblical, as well as fun, we will be offering several options for our Sr. High students. Finding that many High Schoolers, though recently Confirmed in the Faith, sometimes lack the motivation to get up on Sunday morning and engage over the Scripture, we are attempting to meet them where they are. NO, not at Starbucks or behind a video screen. Wait . . . maybe. Please encourage your teens to give it a try this year and throughout the year where they will have new opportunities to Follow God's Call. Our plan includes the opportunity to serve as class leaders throughout the year, engage in more interactive studies of relevant or "current" cultural devices and take on leadership roles within St. Luke's church life.

Parents, PLEASE encourage your child to attend Sunday School regularly. Though Children and Family Ministries is committed to partnering with our St. Luke's Families in the spiritual formation of your kids, encouraging them to attend Sunday School is imperative to developing both relationship with other Christian young people and their relationship with the Lord. Remind them that Sunday School is only one hour a week of their life . . . and the family is there anyway, because YOU need the community, spiritual formation time and relationship. As Christians, especially in today's world, we ALL need to bolster ourselves through continuing formation. Whether that is leading, teaching or attending, the "habit" of engaging in formation with other Christian Family members is essential.

New Name, New Team- As promised in the August newsletter, I am excited to announce that Robin Miner and Dana Thompson have joined our Children and Family Ministries (CFM) Team! Robin (see her introduction on page 1) will continue to serve as our VBS Director, but has taken on the other weekly duties of "Assistant Director" that Jen had added to her job description in the spring; Dana will be serving as our Nursery Coordinator (page 1 for more information). Please take a moment to introduce yourself to them next Sunday if you have not already met them.

Eucharist Training- Last month, we had 9 youngsters attend our first ever Saturday Eucharist Training. Although as a Church, we acknowledge that anyone baptized in the Trinitarian formula is entitled to receive Communion, many parents like to choose a time in the lives of their children when they feel the kids can best understand and appreciate the privilege of sharing in the Communion of Christ. This "formal" training will again be provided in the future, on a Saturday or maybe a couple of week nights. If you are interested in having this training for your child, please let LoriAnn or the office know.

Volunteers - We are still looking for some volunteers for Rite K and Little Liturgy, especially during the 11:30a service. These programs "point your kids in the direction they should go" by providing an interactive service that roughly follows the Liturgy of the Table in "big church." You and the kids are back in the regular service at The Peace, before the Eucharist. The sermons and activities are planned and prepared for you and you are never alone! Currently, our volunteers serve once a month or so. But with more of us, we could spread the fun!

Communication - is the key, flexibility is the key ring. Yes, you have heard it before. CFM sends out a weekly (or so) email blast to keep parents informed as to what is going on specifically with Children and Family Ministries. If you are not receiving this

Welcome to our little corner of the church! In the nursery, you will find everything you would expect – age-appropriate toys, caring nursery staff, volunteers, books, children, and animal crackers. Perhaps you will also find a few things you don't expect, such as crafts that relate to the Gospel lesson of the week, hands-on Sunday school lessons (geared toward those even as little as toddlers), chapel time in which children are listening to the Word, learning The Lord's Prayer, and worshipping Jesus through music.

Little Liturgy

Did you know that even if your child is 2 years old, he or she is hearing the Gospel reading every week? With a few exceptions (some of those Gospel readings get a little too heavy for young minds), your child is hearing and learning the same concepts you are in Big Church, but on a level that they can understand and really apply in their lives. From 9:15-9:30, children from PSC A, B, and C go to the Chapel room in Riker Hall. They "light" the candles on the altar, hear the Gospel, and participate in an interactive "sermon." The children also hear an age-appropriate collect (determined by the liturgical season) and pray the Lord's Prayer. After processing back

from the chapel, the children create and engage in a craft or game that applies to that particular lesson. Feel free to ask them questions about what they did in the nursery. You never know what you can gain from the wisdom of a child!

*Special note: We are slowly getting more children in the nursery at the 11:30 service. If you are interested in volunteering to do Little Liturgy, please let me know.

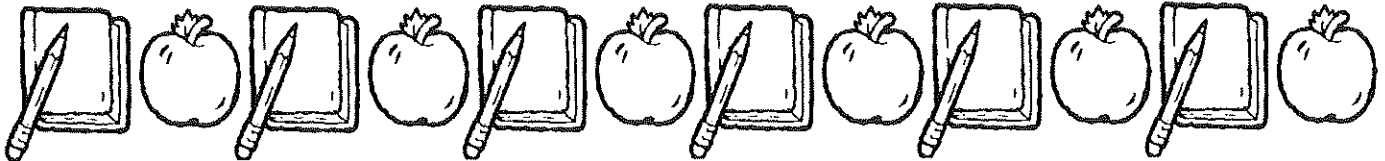

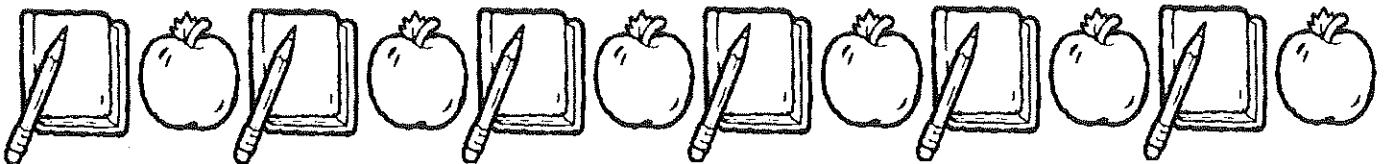
