### News From Senior Warden Pete Paul

#### The Work of the Vestry

In going over my notes from our last Vestry meeting, I am struck with the wide variety of issues that come before the Vestry. In the last meeting issues ranged from strategic planning for the future of St. Luke's to replacing a corroded water supply line and pumping out our septic tanks.

The **Strategic Plan** has been in development for some time and is in the final stages of polishing. It defines our goals in carrying out our mission. It will provide methodology as well as metrics to assist us in gauging success. It will also provide guidance for future budgeting.

A campus **Master Plan** was developed a couple of years ago as an effort to define our future facility needs. The redevelopment cost is currently beyond our capability but in the meantime we use the Master Plan as guidance in making repairs and replacing equipment.

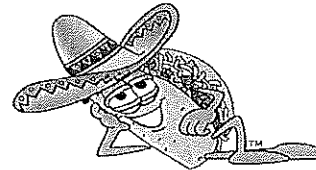
We have begun to develop a **Planned Maintenance Program** for our facilities. Rather than waiting for something to break and having to scramble to find the funds for repair, we are establishing a list of maintenance projects that we know will have to be done in the future. We will be putting budget estimates and estimated time frames on the projects in an effort to budget ahead of time. Significant savings can be had with timely repairs and maintenance. For example: There is currently a project to reinforce the cross on top of the church. The high winds that we experience have weakened the base. A design to strengthen the base with the cross still in place has been made and work will begin soon. If left alone, with the wind stress, further damage could require that the cross be brought to the ground for repair (very expensive).

I always enjoy the little sign on the edge of our cliff that says "God gave us so much, please help us keep it clean." God also gave us St. Luke's. We must be good stewards of this treasure.

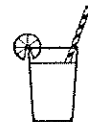

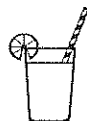

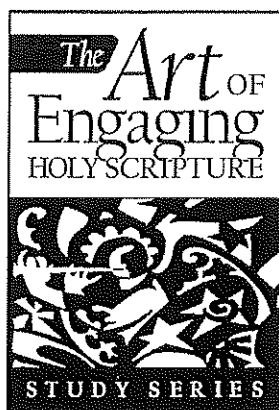

### The ART of Engaging Holy Scripture Study Series

### Continues at St. Luke's on the Lake

A unique small group Bible study curriculum that is much more than a typical Bible Study, TAEHS imparts a lively method of engaging the Scriptures through reading and study, conversational prayer and silent prayer, and group sharing. This dynamic method gradually leads to the experience of the Holy Spirit's presence in the Scriptures, one's self, and our sisters and brothers.

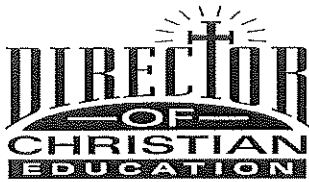
The experiential focus makes all the difference. One's relationship with Christ strengthened, and learning is greatly enhanced. The small group context offers the opportunity for meaningful friendships to develop within the larger faith community and have great fun doing so!

The ART of Engaging Holy Scripture curriculum is designed for small groups. Groups meet weekly for one hour. The weekly meetings are led by a facilitator who receives extensive training and practice in the core components of the curriculum and are based upon the Study Guide that all participants purchase. In addition to guiding the weekly meetings, the Study Guide provides careful directions for participants to engage in reading, praying, and studying the Bible on their own. Each week the Study Guide leads participants through three personal study sessions that typically take 20 to 30 minutes each to complete. At the following week's meeting, participants report their experiences of engaging the Scriptures.

The ART of Engaging Holy Scripture curriculum begins with a Foundational Year of three courses that comprise 30 weeks of studies. The first course establishes the practice of the method, the small group process, and facility with the Bible and the Judeo-Christian Story. The second is Knowing & Following Jesus, and the third, Community of the Spirit. Following the first year, five years of curriculum are available. All of the New Testament and major portions of the Old Testament are in development.

A number of your fellow parishioners have participated in the Foundational Year during 2010-2011. We will be offering the Foundational Year in 2011-2012 for people new to TAEHS and studies in particular books of the Bible for those who have already finished the foundational year. During this Summer, there will be one or more TAEHS "samplers" offered to give a taste of the TAEHS experience. ## CHILDREN'S MINISTRY



Summer is upon us! I love the summer in Texas: hot, humid and high spirited. Yes, high spirited. I love the summer because it gives me time with my family. ## Our Missionaries Around the World



### Greetings from North Africa

As we're sure you have all heard, things in the Muslim world have gotten even more interesting the past few weeks. Osama Bin Laden being killed by US troops and a bomb packed with nails was detonated in our city's main tourist square within a couple days of each other. Up to now, our country has avoided all the turmoil seen in the rest of the North African countries. Things have been remarkably stable here and the King continues to open up the government to reform and transparency. Our friends and neighbors are very upset about the bombing in our city and are hoping that Westerners will still come to their country

Discipling Berbers in remote mountain villages continues to be challenging. A couple weeks back we drove 2 ½ hours up into mountains to see a new believer. We got to the end of the paved road where it turns to a dirt track and crosses a river. Normally our truck would have no problem with this, but the recent snow-melt had swollen the river. It was impassible and we were stuck an hour away from our friend's village. The river has remained swollen and we are still waiting to go see him. This could take awhile as we have had an unusual amount of rain this spring.

We would really appreciate your prayers for the people injured and affected by the bomb, for the people who are seeking peace and truth through all the political turmoil, and for our family to be a blessing to all we meet.

### Neighbor Helping Senior Neighbor

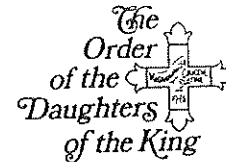


It's hard to think about life without driving in the big sprawling hill country we live in, but many seniors in our area are very capable of doing everything else but drive themselves. Is that really the time for them to move into a nursing home or assisted living and give up their independent lifestyle? Faith in Action Caregivers can step in and provide this needed service so our senior neighbors can continue to live independently and maintain their quality of life. Our volunteers provide rides to medical appointments, grocery stores, personal and business errands, etc. for the senior adults over the age of 60 we serve who live independently and are mobile. Faith in Action Caregivers is a non-profit organization funded by local church congregations, community groups and individual donations – celebrating our 25th anniversary this year!

As the senior adult population grows at an astounding rate in Central Texas, the need for volunteers for our programs is even greater. Volunteers with Caregivers can serve as drivers (the biggest need), office helpers/schedulers, friendly visitors, etc. Limited transportation options for our senior neighbors are why the biggest request for service (about 95% of the calls) is for transportation. With the ability to choose your geographical area to drive and to drive when it fits your schedule – once a month or more often – driving for Caregivers Northwest is one of the easiest ways to serve your community and your neighbors. Caregiver drivers are providing a much-needed free service to our seniors and we need your help to be able to fill the ride requests each week. FIAC Northwest volunteers provided over 6000 point to point rides in 2010 and this number will grow for 2011. Over

375 seniors were served last year by Faith in Action Caregivers Northwest in the areas of Northwest Austin, Cedar Park and Leander – our current level of ride requests has led us to have a waiting list for new clients as of April. We hope to have enough new volunteer drivers in May to lift that waiting list by June 1, so we can serve more of our senior neighbors. Everything we do for our clients is possible because of our awesome volunteers- we would love to grow our volunteer teams!

Volunteer drivers range from young college students to retired executives and everyone in between. Some working folks drive on their lunch hour every now and then. Many young parents include their children in driving a very appreciative senior neighbor – what a great way to show your kids the importance of giving back to your community! Teachers are sharing some of their short time off during the summer by driving a few times. FIAC provides so many rides to so many clients in different areas, that we will have a ride to fit your schedule.
