## From the Pastor

**Labor Day** is unique among our national holidays in that it does not celebrate a single individual, a battle, or a religious occasion. It is dedicated to honoring the American worker. While to many it is just a three-day weekend, it is a day to celebrate the contributions to our society made by the hard work and commitment of everyday American workers. The first Labor Day was celebrated on September 5, 1882, and gradually, states began to officially adopt the holiday throughout the following decade. God has richly blessed our nation with a strong and vital labor force, and it is to Him and to them—the laborers of our nation—that we owe our gratitude for the prosperity and benefits we enjoy.

Christians have a special reason to celebrate Labor Day, which honors the fundamental dignity of workers, for we worship a God who labored to make the world — and who created human beings in His image to be workers. When God made Adam and Eve, He gave them work to do: cultivating and caring for the earth.

In the ancient world, the Greeks and Romans looked upon manual work as a curse, something for lower classes and slaves. But Christianity changed all that. Christians viewed work as a high calling — a calling to be co-workers with God in unfolding the rich potential of His creation. So this Labor Day, remember that all labor derives its true dignity as a reflection of the Creator. And whatever we do, in word or deed, we do it all to the glory of God.

Dear Congregation of Emanuel's,

We would like to share with you some of our experiences from the 2009 ELCA National Youth Gathering in New Orleans. We had a great time and we saw a lot of the sights and specialties of New Orleans. The Cajun food was spicy, the seafood fresh, and the beignets warm and sweet. We visited places like the French Quarter, Jackson Square, the St. Louis Cathedral, and a cemetery. On the history tour, we learned how and why the people of New Orleans bury their dead in a unique way.

However, the New Orleans youth gathering was much more than just seeing the sights. The streets were packed with 38,000 Lutherans from around the nation. We met groups of people from Wisconsin, Alaska, Puerto Rico, California, Ohio, Minnesota, Nebraska, Iowa, North Dakota, South Dakota, South Carolina, Virginia, and Illinois. One of our missions was to trade small items and mingle with other people. We took pecans with ELYO written on them, to share the spirit from Seguin. We also had tons of fun at dances, karaoke, arts and crafts.

In the Superdome, there were inspirational speakers and musicians who inspired us, entertained us and excited us to go out and change the world. From the heavy metal rock violinist, to the 6-year old trombonist and 10-year old accordion player, we gained an appreciation for musical skill and the feelings they express.

We learned what a "minga" is in a native Peruvian culture: an urgent calling together of people to work for a common good. We learned about many different needs and opportunities for service around the world and in our own communities. While visiting the Lower Ninth Ward, one of the areas that was severely devastated by Hurricane Katrina in 2005, we heard a bible passage on reconciliation and hope and said a prayer. We could see that rebirth was happening in parts of that area, as smiling children waved at us from the porches of their newly reconstructed houses.

We were delighted by the locals on the streets who thanked us for being there to stimulate their economy, provide volunteers, and bring hope. While eating lunch two of our girls shared stories with a worker who called them her "lunch buddies".

Our group's service project involved replanting salt-resistant grasses used in restoring wetlands. The loss of coastal wetlands contributes to hurricane damage to the city. The work was tiring, hot, and muddy, but gave us a good feeling in the end.

To know **Jesus** means to love and serve others, to do **Justice** means to do what is right, and **Jazz** represents getting energized to do God's work. We were given examples of injustice around the world and ways that we can make a difference, while bonding as a youth group and meeting other members of the larger Lutheran church.

We want to thank the congregation for all your support in the fundraisers and for sending us off with your blessings. The future of ELYO is looking very bright, as we are already planning to give back by serving at Rally Day, the Church Picnic, and in music worship. We also plan to serve in the community soon. The average attendance at the high school Sunday school class has been gradually improving since the gathering.

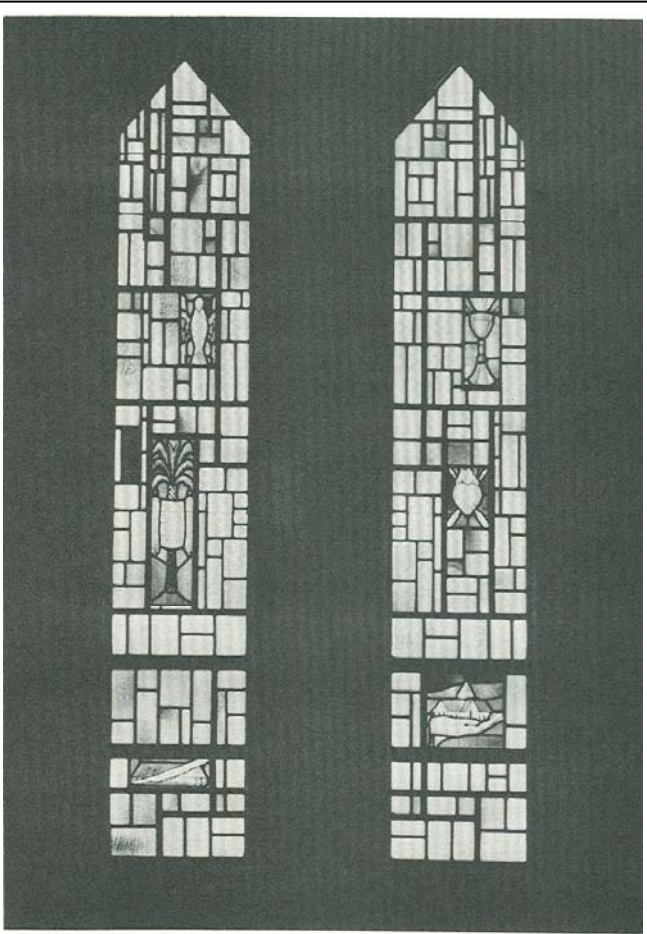

- The Pen and Book:** Symbolic of St. Augustine as one of the great theologians of the early Church.
- The Chalice:** Symbolizes his faithfulness to the Word and the Sacrament.
- The Flaming Heart:** Pictures his zeal for the Church. The arrows signify his sorrow for the sins of his youth.
- The Church-in-Hand:** Symbolic of St. Augustine as a Defender of the Church.
