## In The Moment

In certain circles of Christianity, there is a particular emphasis on the moment of conversion. It is usually phrased as a question about the time and place one knew oneself to be saved, or the acceptance of Jesus in one's heart. Episcopalians experience a certain sort of discomfort with this sort of talk. It just doesn't feel quite right to us.

We like to couch our commitment to God as a journey. Shifting the discussion from Jesus to God is intentional. We



often prefer to think about God, rather than Jesus, the Christ. Journey seems more comfortable, and an amorphous notion of a supreme being avoids struggling with the particularity of God in the person of Jesus.

Lent is drawing to a close. We will come face to face with the Passion of Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Moment by moment, Jesus will face difficult realities and experiences with a single vision, faithfulness. Jesus will face the powers of death and destruction, focused on defeating these powers by remaining committed to trust in the Father's love.

Our challenge is to live moment by moment in the Passion. We will witness much. We will want to turn away, but we have to keep watch. What moment of the power of the grace of God will open us to Jesus?



## PALM SUNDAY @ 9:15 AM

Join us at 9am on the Palace Green on Palm Sunday, March 25, for the Blessing of the Palms, after which we will process into the church for the service. If you cannot physically join us for the procession, please feel free to enter the sanctuary for a time of quiet meditation before the service.

## WORSHIP IN HOLY WEEK

Join us for Holy Eucharist on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday (March 26, 27 & 28) in the church at 6pm.

## MAUNDY THURSDAY

The liturgies for Maundy Thursday and Good Friday are unique and highly symbolic; each will be celebrated only once, offering a sense of the “real time” of the Last Supper and the Crucifixion — Christ’s Passion. Holy Eucharist and The Stripping of the Altar on Thursday, March 29, will be held in the church at 6pm. Child care will be available for nursery through four-year-olds in the Parish House during this service. Led by our Cantorians, a Vigil with foot-washing will be held at 8pm in St. Mary’s Chapel. Parishioners as well as college students are welcome.

## GOOD FRIDAY

The Hours of Good Friday will be held in the church from noon until 3pm on Friday, March 30. The service consists of half-hour segments with hymns, readings, meditations, prayer and silence which commemorate the hours Jesus spent on the cross. Congregants are invited for the entire service or for single or multiple movements. There will be an organ interlude at the end of each, where worshipers may come and go.

The Stations of the Cross will be marked beginning at 3pm as a large cross is carried from Bruton through the college campus to the Catholic Campus Ministry building (old St. Bede’s on Richmond Road).

We hope you will attend Good Friday Liturgy at 6pm in the church as the finality of the Crucifixion sets in. Christ has died, and the world holds its breath. Child care will be available for nursery through four-year-olds in the Parish House during this service.

## HOLY SATURDAY

The Great Vigil of Easter begins in the churchyard with “The Lighting of the New Fire of Easter” on Saturday, March 31, at 9pm and then continues in the church. This is the most important celebration of the entire year — the one from which all others either take their meaning or to which all others look forward. Bishop Hollerith will be baptizing, confirming and receiving members into the Episcopal Church.

Proceeding from darkness to light, from silence to alleluia, it is the symbolic dramatization of the story of God’s action on our behalf. It is the Christian Passover, for it celebrates the passing from death to life, from sin to grace. The story of the Exodus is central to the Liturgy of the Word; Baptism is the means of the full realization of redemption; Holy Communion is the promise of the glory that shall be ours with our Risen Lord. This service includes incense.

## EASTER TRAFFIC, PARKING & WORSHIP SERVICES

Easter Sunday is April 1, and services of Holy Eucharist will be held in the church beginning at 7am, 8:30 am, 10:15 am, 12 noon & 5:30 pm. Holy Eucharist will also be held in the churchyard at 10:15am, followed by our children’s egg hunt.

In order to help the flow of traffic between the services on Easter Day, please drive down Prince George Street towards the church, turn right when you get to the Palace Green, and officers will direct you where to park from there — you will not be permitted to enter Duke of Gloucester Street from Nassau Street (please see the diagram below).

We will have two lines to bring worshippers into the church. Parishioners are asked to form a line from the Palace Green Gate down the walk toward the Governor’s Palace (and, as always, wearing your parish nametag is helpful). Ushers will help form this line and be sensitive to the health and fitness of those members of the parish in line, and do their best to offer comfort and expedience. Visitors will form a line down Duke of Gloucester Street and will be admitted once we have admitted parishioners.


Once inside, please allow the ushers to assist you in finding a seat. Once each service is over, all will exit through Duke of Gloucester Street gate, allowing those waiting for the next service to begin entering.

## THE FLOWER CROSS

All are encouraged to bring cut flowers for the cross which will be stationed in the churchyard and used for the churchyard service on Easter.

The Egg Hunt will be held following the 10:15 am service in the churchyard on Easter Sunday, April 1. Children pre-K through 4th grade should bring their baskets!

traditions in the historic Wren Chapel.


Come to Wren Chapel on Sunday, April 15, at

## MARTHA WASHINGTON

THE MORNING PROGRAM WILL BEGIN IN THE CHURCH AT 10AM WITH A PRESENTATION BY MARTHA WASHINGTON AS PORTRAYED BY COLONIAL WILLIAMSBURG'S KATHERINE PITTMAN. MARTHA DANDRIDGE CUSTIS WASHINGTON HAD A LONG FAMILY RELATIONSHIP WITH BRUTON PARISH CHURCH. THE FIRST RECTOR OF THE PARISH IN 1674, THE REV'D ROWLAND JONES, WAS HER MATERNAL GREAT GRANDFATHER. TWO OF THE FOUR CHILDREN SHE BORE WHILE MARRIED TO DANIEL PARKE CUSTIS DIED YOUNG – DANIEL AT AGE THREE AND FRANCES AT AGE FOUR. THEIR GRAVE STONES ARE NEAR THE NORTH TRANSEPT DOOR OF THE CHURCH. IN 1757, AT AGE 26, SHE BECAME A WIDOW. SHE MARRIED GEORGE WASHINGTON IN 1759 AND IN 1789 BECAME THE FIRST LADY OF THE UNITED STATES. EARLY RESERVATIONS ARE SUGGESTED FOR THIS EVENT.



## ANNUAL LUNCHEON & GUEST SPEAKER THE VERY REV'D ANDREW MCGOWAN

DEAN MCGOWAN IS THE MCFADDIN PROFESSOR OF ANGLICAN STUDIES AT YALE DIVINITY SCHOOL. HE ALSO SERVES AS DEAN AND PRESIDENT OF THE BERKELEY DIVINITY SCHOOL AT YALE. BORN IN MELBOURNE, AUSTRALIA, HE RECEIVED HIS BA FROM THE UNIVERSITY OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA IN 1983. FOLLOWING HIS ORDINATION AS AN ANGLICAN PRIEST, HE UNDERTOOK DOCTORAL STUDIES IN CHRISTIANITY AND JUDAISM IN ANTIQUITY AT THE UNIVERSITY OF NOTRE DAME IN INDIANA WHERE HE WAS AWARDED A PhD IN 1996. HIS RESEARCH INTERESTS INCLUDE ANCIENT CHRISTIANITY, THE EUCHARIST AND ANGLICAN THEOLOGY. DEAN MCGOWAN WILL ADDRESS GUESTS FOLLOWING THE NOON LUNCHEON AT THE PARISH HOUSE.




## BRUTON'S HISTORIC RECORDS

Among the interesting things to explore in our new Heritage Center is a short video describing the Bruton Parish Historic Records. The records themselves are available on the Parish website at [www.brutonparish.org/heritage](http://www.brutonparish.org/heritage), so everyone can use them easily on their home computers.




We have begun with two particularly interesting volumes. The first is our oldest Parish Register, used by Middleton Parish and its successor Bruton Parish, from 1662 to 1797. This important record from the colonial era has been digitized by the experts at William and Mary's Swem Library. You can browse through the pages or use the search function to identify places where particular names appear. While the original Register has suffered considerable damage through the years, it remains a fascinating window into the life of early Williamsburg and a valuable source of genealogical information.



The second volume is A Guide to the Memorials of Bruton Parish Church. In it you will find in an easily searchable form the inscriptions on the tombstones and memorial plaques in the churchyard and church.

Since many visitors to Bruton come with questions about their family connections to the parish's early history, these resources will be especially valuable. A leaflet available in the Heritage Center and in the tower shows how to access and use the website.

We give thanks to Friends of Bruton, sponsor of the Historic Records project, and to Don and Elaine Bogus, who have led and supported it. The Friends plan to add further documents in the future and to keep the resources freely accessible to all.

## FIRST FRIDAYS RECOVERY EUCHARIST

The next First Fridays Recovery Eucharist will be April 6 at 5:30pm in the church. Come celebrate the joy of Easter and the joy of recovery with us. Each month SpiritWorks Foundation and Bruton host this service with prayers and readings that focus on helping people find ways to live faithfully in the midst of any kind of suffering, especially addiction, codependence, mental illness, and trauma.

Join us for a candlelit hour in the chancel of the church where tears are welcome, joy is celebrated, and all are embraced exactly as they are in their brokenness. During the service participants may write prayer requests and light candles. All are welcome, whether or not you're in recovery.

Be fed in body and soul.



## THE CHURCHES AT JAMESTOWN

The fifth in the series of presentations sponsored by the Bruton Guides Ministry on places and events related to the history of Bruton Parish will be held Wednesday, April 18, at 3pm at the Parish House. Please note the earlier time to accommodate those who do not care to drive at night.



In 2010, Jamestown Rediscovery archaeologists discovered the site of the earliest known Protestant church in North America. In the chancel at the east end of the building, archaeologists found the graves of four distinguished citizens, including the Rev'd Robert Hunt, the first Anglican priest in the English New World. Hear the story of how historical, archaeological, scientific, and forensic specialists worked together to identify the four leaders and unravel the mystery of the silver box found at the grave of one of them.



Now Jamestown Rediscovery archaeologists are examining the area in and around the 20th century Memorial Church to look for evidence of two other early churches constructed c. 1617 and c. 1640 at the same location.

The program will be presented by Danny Schmidt, Senior Staff Archaeologist, and Mark Summers, Manager of Educational Programs at Jamestown Rediscovery.

We will discuss the basic structure of EfM, share some materials and try to identify the level of interest at Bruton for a class during the 2018-19 year. If you are interested but can not attend the meeting, contact me by email at [mhibbitts@cox.net](mailto:mhibbitts@cox.net).

EfM prepares participants for the ministry to which each of us is called. It is that vocation for which we pray at the conclusion of the Eucharist, "And now, Father, send us out to do the work you have given us to do, to love and serve you as faithful witnesses of Christ our Lord." EfM provides lay persons with a theological education which supports their faith and also teaches them to express that faith in day-to-day events. The program develops an informed and knowledgeable laity to face a complex and often confusing world.

The current curriculum calls for a year-long study of four subjects: the Hebrew Bible, the New Testament, Church History and Theology, Ethics. Participants are only asked to make a one-year commitment at the beginning of the study, which begins in mid-September and concludes in mid-June at Bruton Parish.

EfM has evolved since it was first developed in 1975 by the School of Theology at Sewanee. Today, it is an international program with participants in ten countries and ninety-three of the one-hundred Episcopal dioceses in the United States.



## AED AT THE PARISH HALL AND IN THE TOWER AT THE CHURCH

Automated External Defibrillators have been installed in the reception area at the Parish Hall and in the right closet entering the Tower at the church.

An automated external defibrillator is a portable device that checks the heart rhythm and can send an electric shock to the heart to try to restore a normal rhythm. AEDs are used to treat sudden cardiac arrest.

If an individual suddenly collapses or loses consciousness, or you come upon someone unconscious and unable to respond when you call or shake the person, this may indicate the possibility of cardiac arrest. Breathing may be absent or abnormal and a pulse difficult to find, or absent. By applying the AED, the heart rhythm can be checked and it will indicate if an electric shock is needed.



**IMMEDIATELY ASKING SOMEONE  
TO CALL 911 IS IMPERATIVE!**

The AED is user-friendly and, when turned on, the device will give you step-by-step instructions, both verbally and visually. You can obtain pictures and information through their website.

There are cautions to be aware of such as water as a conductor (insure the individual is not in or near water), metal such as necklaces or underwire bras need to be removed. If the person has an implanted medical device such as a pacemaker, the AED should not be used.

Once the pads with electrodes have been applied as directed, the device will analyze the cardiac status of the person and direct you what to do. There is a small bag with items you might need such as scissors to remove clothing, a razor to remove chest hair, and a mask barrier so you can assist with breathing.

If someone has a sudden cardiac arrest, using an AED and giving CPR improves their chance for survival.

We are very fortunate that the Fire Department with Advanced Life Support, the Police Department, along with Colonial Williamsburg Security have responded quickly whenever we have needed their assistance. We also have many parishioners in the medical field who bring their skills when there is a need.

Please take a minute to observe the location of the AEDs in the Parish House and the Tower at the church. You never know when you might be called on to use one!

We are putting together a familiarization program for this equipment; more information to follow.
