Dear Christ Church Friends,

Somewhere a long ways back someone said that there's a good chance God's favorite prayer is "thank you." I wish I could remember who said it so I could give her or him credit, but I can't. But one thing I'm grateful for is having heard it. I remember how releasing it felt to hear that simple teaching...that of all the offerings God might find pleasing, the offering of thanks for our creation and salvation...the offering of thanksgiving through our lips and our lives...is at the top of the list.

More than one wise person along the way has opened to me the grace in the spiritual practice of making what's called a gratitude list. It's a pretty simple practice. It involves sitting down for a few minutes...fifteen, maybe twenty...and simply making a list of the things for which one is grateful. Sometimes, what gets put on the list are big things...that God loves us, for example, and has made us right. Sometimes, what gets put on the list are little things...that one's car works, or the cup of tea this morning tasted especially good. Sometimes, what gets put on the list are things that at first glance did not appear to be blessings...a difficult decision or situation, for example, that revealed a truth, or through which God gave guidance and sustained us.

There's a belief and insight in this practice of "gratitude listing"...that gratitude is a disposition; that it is a perspective within us that can be nurtured; that look closely enough and there are blessings that can be counted; that just as prayerfulness is fostered by prayer, and a servant's heart fostered by service, and worshipful living fostered by worship, so gratefulness is fostered by the act of gratitude; and that somehow, when we pay attention to these blessings...when we name them...God builds up our spirit, and strength, and joy.

The spiritual practice of thanksgiving seems to be one of those practices that opens us up and takes us to new places. We are made

aware of our relationship with and dependence on God; we are brought into connection with the One who makes us, sustains us, and saves us. Our perspective on what is changes, and we become more likely to see that we truly have been given our "daily bread." We stand taller, and stretch; and as such, become more connected with those around us. It seems a truth, that gratitude for what we have been given opens us to generosity unto others. When it is that the Apostle says to the Corinthians "God loves a cheerful giver," I think that's what he's saying...that the Lord's heart is warmed when generosity is fueled by gratitude; when giving is born of counted blessings.

So it's a simple thought I leave with you in this edition of *The Grateful Heart* and as we prepare to make our own offerings to the service God is doing through this people...what is it that you're grateful for? What's on your list? Consider for yourself the practice of "gratitude listing," and explore what God does when with intention one gives thanks. Again, it's a simple practice...a pen; a piece of paper; fifteen minutes once a week; making a list; no editing; completely private and personal; keep it, or throw it away when one finishes. But maybe try it, and see if God doesn't do something new...

At the Last Supper, Jesus gives thanks. At the beginning of almost every one of his letters, the Apostle Paul gives thanks. The Psalmist seems to be giving thanks all the time. Gratitude is all over the place in the scriptures, and in our worship...a reminder, possibly, of the grace revealed to a grateful heart, and the fruitfulness of God's love.

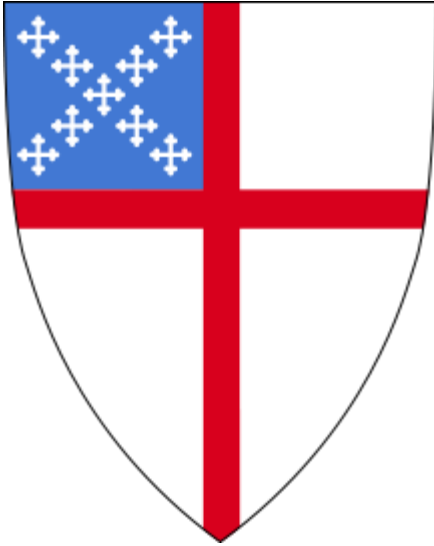

In October, the Music Ministry usually has just settled into a rhythm of regular rehearsals and worship services. Except that this year, in addition to that, we are preparing for our combined service on October 16 at 10 AM. What a wonderful celebration of our commitment together that will be!

In case you were wondering about making a commitment to join the Christ Church Choir (which would be wonderful), here are Frequently Asked Questions and answers, that might be helpful to you.

Who can join?

Persons 16 years and above.

Do I need to be able to sing?

Of course, since that's what a choir does. But **everybody** who has a voice can learn to sing. If you can speak, you have the potential to sing. (By the way, most people who think they cannot match pitch is because the pitch they are trying to match is outside of their comfortable vocal range.)

Do I need to have experience? Do I need to know how to read music?

No and no. But you will soon learn!

Do I have to audition in front of Keith?

Yes (oh horror!! Deal breaker!!). Auditions are for placement, not entry. **Nobody** is denied entrance into the membership of the choir because they didn't meet some musical standard. Auditions allow me to know where to assign you to your most comfortable singing range.

What is expected of me?

Show up, ready to serve others. Consistency in attendance.

When are practices?

Every Thursday 7:30pm – 9:15pm.

When does the choir sing?

Sundays 10:45am service. 1st Sundays of the month – both services; Last Sundays of the month – choir does not sing.

What is the significance of the choir?

Primarily, the choir helps the congregation to connect with God through music. We accomplish this:

- by setting an example of engaging ourselves in worship, so that the congregation may be inspired to do likewise;
- by singing songs to God with words that the congregation can identify with and thus share in our prayer to God; this allows us to be mouthpieces of the congregation;
- by singing songs to the congregation with words that are teachings from God's Word, thus allowing ourselves to be mouthpieces of God.

When is a good time to join?

Long answer: The Choir Year has its cycle of rhythm that is a cross-breed of our community's life-rhythm and the liturgical seasons:

Beginning of Fall (Sep. 1) to Beginning of Christmas Preparation (Nov 10)

Christmas Prep (Nov. 10) to Christmas (Dec. 25)

New Year (Jan. 5) to Concert Day (Mar. 3)

Concert (Mar. 3) to Easter (Apr 8)

Easter (Apr 8) to End of Choir Year (Jun 17)

Although it is better to join at the beginning of each of these cycles, there is never really a bad time to join (since we sing almost every Sunday).

Short answer: Now is always a good time to serve the Lord.

Total income through August 31st is \$56,494 more than the budget. This positive performance is due to non-pledge income being consistently higher than the budgeted amount all year (Non pledge income is all gifts received not associated with a pledge). Expenses are under budget by \$35,895 primarily because some ministry teams will spend their allocations later in the year than anticipated in the budget.

Total cash on hand includes proceeds from the sale of the land to the County of Henrico, temporarily restricted cash and unrestricted cash. Unrestricted cash available for operations is \$266,493. Temporarily restricted cash is gifts received where the donor has specified a specific purpose for the gift.

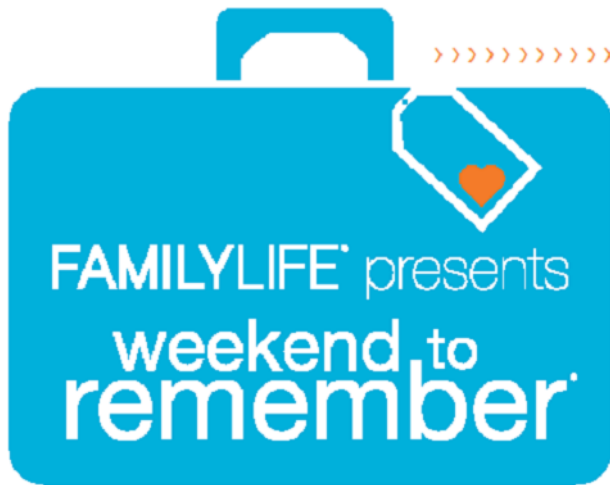
The construction loan is related to the Growing for the Generations Campaign. Gifts received to fulfill Growing for the Generations pledges are being used to make payments on this loan.

Womens Bible Study

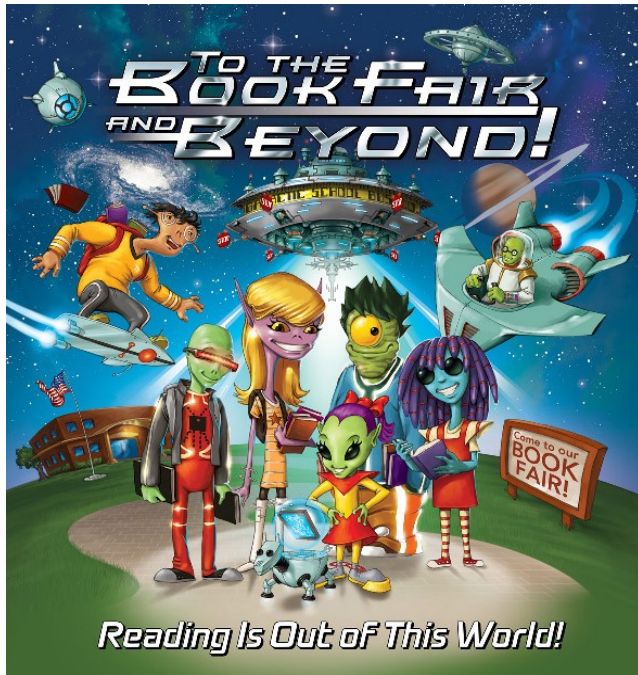
Wednesday Morning Women's Bible Study (October 5 and continuing for 20 weeks)

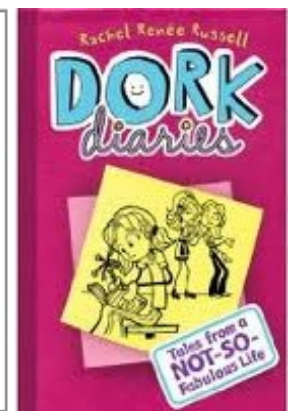
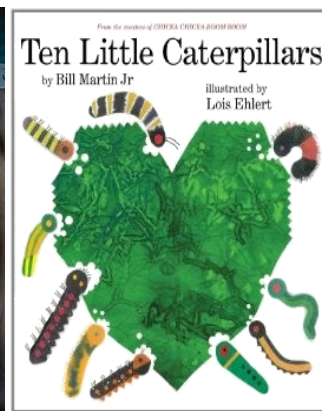
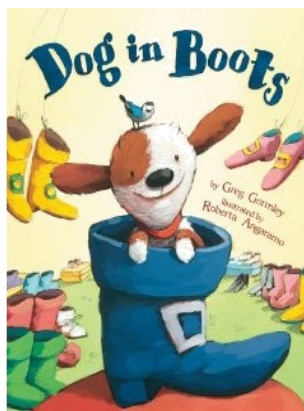
The Book Fair benefits George Mason two ways:
