Rector's Letter – Annual Report 2011

In a form of wonderful redundancy, once again I have nothing but good news to share regarding the state of St. Christopher's Episcopal Church. In fact, our parish closes 2011 in a rock solid position on every front.

Advancements in our educational offerings, children and youth ministries and choir opportunities have mixed with a gifted staff and long-standing foundational programs to yield a programmatic effort that is as broad as it is exceptional.

Our new Mid-Week Manna program combines a community meal, adult and young adult Christian Education with the introduction of a new children's choir. PreYC, a bridge program for children in grades 3 – 6 was developed by our Youth Pastor, Vanessa Riutta, to better help our youth who will soon be transitioning into their teenage years. The Incarnation Project, launched in 2011 by St. Christopher's and three other Episcopal congregations, is a partnership with the people of Haiti aimed at eventually building the Episcopal School of the Incarnation in the mountain town of Le Pretre. January 2012 will mark the third mission trip we have made to Haiti in the past year and our successes include a well, (soon to be built) latrines, two medical missions and budding partnerships. Our 2011 Women's Retreat at Camp Beckwith was a tremendous blessing to the over 75 women who attended as was our fall camping trip to Ft. Pickens where we enjoyed a weekend of fellowship, worship, bonfires and fun. Both will unquestionably continue in the years ahead.

Additionally, our existing ministries thrived this past year. For example, our 2011 Christmas Caravan raised over \$30,000 (a record!) for local charities. While I cannot begin to enumerate the countless ministries that continue to be offered through our parish, and I hate to discover I have left something off my lists, it is astonishing to reflect on the difference our church makes. Without question, it is the strength and continuance of the countless, long standing ministries of St. Christopher's that have once again allowed us to pivot to new endeavors with the comfort of knowing that those ministries we have done well for so long, will be continued.

Worship continues at the heart of our community and through the good work of our worship committee and dedication of our music leaders, God is glorified powerfully in our parish. One must pay close attention to our worship schedule, as there is perpetually something new just around the bend. Our Epiphany Taize Service, Veteran's Day celebration, Jazz and Beach Eucharists, Chrismon Tree Decoration, Children's Musical, Lessons and Carols, and the myriad other offerings in 2011, made each week special and breathtakingly different from the week proceeding.

Through every step, lay leadership once again proved key. Our Vestry and Wardens have offered sound discernment and steady, vision-based decision making. Newly recruited leaders oversaw our walkway project with its fundraising components while others transformed our parish interiors and made them even more beautiful. Joining Caravan workers, children's ministry leaders, EYC volunteers, choir members, Green Thumbers, worship assistants and acolytes, prayer intercessors, Christopher's coordinators, Serenade planners, party throwers, Wednesday night dinner makers and countless others, each leader has guaranteed that the diverse calls of God on our church are being heeded. What a blessing it is to serve in a church of servant leaders!

Financially, our church is strengthening at a substantial pace; once again adding new pledges in the double digits (26) with new pledged giving exceeding \$55,000. While every dollar quickly finds a ministry use and an active church always seeks to fight above its weight class, it remains nonetheless a wonder that in these hard economic times, our 2012 budget is once again strong, sound and mission-driven.

Numerically, our church continues to grow, with ever more individuals and families finding that God can be met in the worship and community that thrives within our doors. New growth is perhaps the most readily apparent indicator that God is active in our midst. As a simple rule, I believe that churches intentionally living into God's call to service, inevitably grow. Faithful churches are contagious churches. St. Christopher's continues to prove this true.

All said, we find ourselves in a very blessed season.

In closing, let me recount a conversation I shared almost three years ago with (the soon to be) Senior Warden extraordinaire, Jim Johnson. Speaking in his car the week I accepted the call to be your Rector, Jim and I reflected on the good things beginning to take form at St. Christopher's. Within the conversation, Jim asked what I thought was key to my happiness as Rector. I told him my heart's deepest desire is to serve a church where it is unmistakable that God is alive and active; a place where the Spirit of Christ resonates throughout the community and where I know that I am being used by Jesus within that body. In other words, my primary vocational aspiration was (and is) to serve a church flourishing in its vocation as the Body of Christ. More than anything else, I said this would give me joy in my work.

As you undoubtedly notice, that desire has not only been met, but so far exceeded that there really is only one response that can be given: "Praise God from whom all blessings flow!"

St. Christopher's, always thank God for the joy of being the people of God.
