Summer will be here before we know it, so it's time to start preparing for some Summer Fun! This year we will be taking children who have completed the 3rd grade through 6th grade to Centri Kid Camp in Sherman, TX on June 28th – July 2nd. This is the camp we attended last summer.

The cost per camper this year will be \$135. Due to a limited amount of spaces available, a \$35 deposit is due by March 28th to reserve your child's space. Reservations can be made after this date but spaces are available on a first come first serve basis. If you are interested in going as a leader please let me know. Adult leaders' camp fee will be covered.

The cost of camp per camper is higher than the \$135 camper fee so we will be having fundraisers on April 18th (Kidz Choir Dinner Theater) and May 20th (Pizza Inn) to offset the cost so you only have to pay \$135 per camper. More details to follow. Children that will be attending camp are asked to participate or help with these events.

Enclosed is the Camp Participant Form and other information concerning Centri Kid. Please fill out the Participant Form for each camper and/or leader attending and have it notarized. We have two notaries available at the church office. Notarized participant forms can be dropped off on Sunday or Wednesday nights at the Kidz Ministry Check- In Counter or at the church office during office hours.

Centri Kid Camp Info:

When: June 28-July 2nd

Cost: \$135 per camper

Where: Austin College in Sherman, TX

Rooms: Dorm-style, bathroom on hall. Linens not provided.

What to bring:

- Twin sheets or sleeping bag, towels, pillow, blanket
- Clothes that can be worn to recreation and tracks
- Clothes that can get really messy (for OMC & if you plan on taking a messy track)
- Closed toe, closed heel shoes (for outdoor activities)
- Bible, notepad, pen and backpack to carry things in
- Water bottle (please pack—this will be essential during Track times)
- Toiletries (toothpaste, shampoo, etc)
- Sunscreen
- Spending money for snacks, camp store, and missions offering
- An alarm clock (no cell phones)
- A dark t-shirt if you plan to take tracks including activities with water
- Modest one-piece bathing suit or two-piece with dark shirt to wear over it for water tracks if desired
- Colored shirt for OMC (3rd grade-yellow; 4th grade-green; 5th grade-blue; 6th grade-red)

Do not bring:

- Anything that advertises alcohol, tobacco, illegal drugs
- Anything that explicitly or implicitly promotes racism, sexism, or hatred of any group or person
- Anything that explicitly or implicitly refers to sexual actions or situations
- Excessively short or tight fitting clothing
- Alcohol, tobacco, illegal drugs, fireworks, or any kind of weapon
- Radios, iPods, CD players, roller blades, skateboards, cell phones, or water guns
- Anything that calls attention to underwear (sagging pants, rolling down waistband, etc)

Bible Study

Bible Study: Bon Appetit :: God's Recipe for Your Life

Opening Day :: Who am I? We are called to be children of God. He has called us out of the world and called us to be His. On this night, we'll lay the foundation for our study throughout the week.

Day 1 :: I am Adopted Today, we'll take a look at David's adoption of Jonathan's son, Mephibosheth. This adoption was completely as a result of David's unmerited generosity towards the family of Jonathan. Likewise, because of Christ, God has graciously adopted us as His children, even when we did nothing to earn it. He has given us all the rights and benefits of children of God.

Day 2 :: I am Being Changed Today, we'll take a look at one of the most changed lives in all of Scripture...Simon Peter. Because of His relationship with Jesus, Peter's life was changed in almost every way. We'll look at what it means to be a new creation because of our relationship with Christ.

Day 3 :: I am Unique Today, we're going to take a look at the life of one of the heroes of the Old Testament...Joseph. This was a kid who was unique in many ways: he was favored by his father; he had strange dreams; he wore a colorful coat, etc. Yet, because of his relationship with God, he was confident in who he was and who he was made to be.

Closing Day :: Go and Do Likewise We want to challenge campers to go back to "normal" life and to live as ambassadors for Christ. By living a life in line with God's Word, we spread His love through our world back home.

Recreation

Recreation: A time daily to play outdoor team-building games within the camper's Bible study group. It's high-energy and requires closed-toe shoes.

Tracks: Campers will choose from the list of tracks on Monday during Registration. They will select their top five and will get one of their choices for Track A and one for Track B. All five should be choices that the camper would enjoy, as they could get their fifth choice. They will participate in the same track Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday.

It may be good to let campers think about track choices, but please don't choose tracks before you arrive. Let our CentriKid staff explain these in full upon arrival at camp before your group chooses. Tracks are subject to availability.

OMC: Rec on Thursdays. OMC stands for Organized Mass Chaos, and that is exactly what it is. Every player knows exactly what task he is doing, but each player in the game is doing something different. Players attempt to complete as many tasks as possible (one task at a time), but players are interrupted to help other players complete their tasks during the game. For recreation, each grade's team will have a color: (3rd grade-yellow; 4th grade-green; 5th grade-blue; 6th grade-red)
