- A poster of a battle or general of the Civil War Time Period.
- A battle scene (May even be on a cake)
- Samples of the food eaten by soldiers
- A flag of the Confederate or Union Armies
- Memorization of the Gettysburg Address
- Report on Abraham Lincoln, Battles, or Generals
- A letter written from a soldier’s point of view
- A scrapbook of Civil War Pictures
- An interview of a “newspaper” editor (soldier, general, President Lincoln, etc.)
- Dress up like a soldier of that time period.
