FROM THE INTERIM PASTOR

Reflections for Eastertide

As I write these Easter Greetings, there are always signs of resurrection, hope, and joy in a world barely coping with extraordinary natural disasters and human ones in the form of violence and war. Our task this Easter Season is to celebrate them.

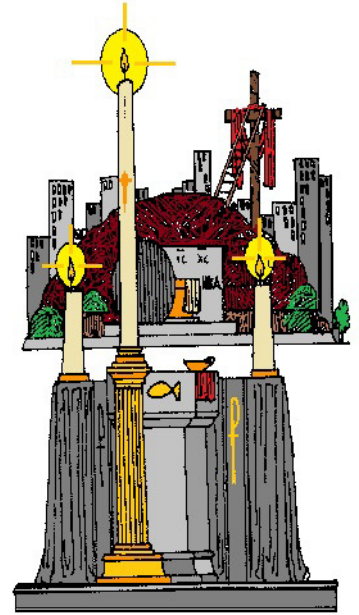
For your reading this Easter, I hope that you will choose Sandy Tolan's *"The Lemon Tree"*, recommended by our bishops as the book for the diocese to read in 2011. Our discussions of "The Lemon Tree" will begin Tuesday of Easter Week at 7:30 PM in the Fireside Room. This is a wonderfully heroic true story of an Israeli, a Palestinian, and their families as they struggle to find a way to go forward caring for one another despite the violence that seeks to pull them apart.

As a suggestion for further reading, I would like to share with you some wisdom from James Carroll's new book, *"Jerusalem, Jerusalem"*, a story of sacred violence. His thoughts about religion are both provocative and of value in a society that struggles with being religious. He says that good religion celebrates life, not death. "To be fully alive is to be a way of being held by what does not die, and that does not drop what it holds. Religion calls that God."

Good religion also recognizes in God's Oneness a principle of unity among all God's creatures, a unity that is also known as love. "Good religion offers revelation, not salvation, proclaiming that creation is God's self-expression, and that as creatures, humans are simply by virtue of existing, already part of it: *saved by virtue of being.*" Finally good religion knows nothing of coercion and may, paradoxically have a secular character.

Carroll suggests that we need to carefully discard all forms, categories, and symbols of religion that prove incapable of self-criticism or renewal. I was pleased to hear James Carroll, a Roman Catholic, say that "religions will disqualify themselves as agent of God's presence or work unless females can claim therein positions of complete equality." At St. Andrew's and in the Episcopal Church as a whole we are moving in the right direction.

The Lord is Risen Indeed! Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!





In today's high-speed world, time to think and reflect often is a luxury. Lent gives us a structure to meditate, pray and thoughtfully consider our lives and our relationship with God. Join us for special Lenten communion services at 7 p.m. on Tuesdays and 6:30 a.m. on Wednesdays.

In addition, there is the regular 10 a.m. service on Thursdays, the 6:30 p.m. Compline on Mondays and on the second and fourth Mondays of each month, Centering Prayer at 7:30 p.m.

It's not too early to plan for Holy Week, April 17-24. The week begins with Palm Sunday.

In addition to the 7 p.m. service Tuesday, April 19, please join us for the moving Tenebrae service at 7 p.m. Wednesday, April 20, with its dramatic ending in darkness. On April 21 the choir participates in the 7 p.m. Maundy Thursday Eucharist and stripping of the altar and sanctuary. Good Friday, April 22, services run continually from noon to 3 p.m. including Holy Communion from reserved Sacrament, Passion Gospel, Way of the Cross, The Great Litany, Reproaches, meditations at each hour. The 7 p.m. service on Good Friday includes the Proper Liturgy with Passion Gospel and Holy Communion from reserved Sacrament.

Easter Sunday, April 24, begins with the 7 a.m. service and dropping the banner and the chanting of the Exultet. Following the 10 a.m. service, the children have their annual Easter egg hunt.



SEVERAL INVITATIONS FROM THE ALTAR GUILD!



All parishioners are cordially invited to assist the Altar Guild in its preparations for Holy Week and the celebration of Easter. On Thursday, April 14, at 11:00 a.m. in the Hall we will be making palm crosses for distribution to the parish on Palm Sunday. This is a fun and easy project (directions and "training" cheerfully supplied), and will be followed by a tasty lunch. Rumor has it that we may also be assisting the Easter bunny in a pleasant chore after we eat.

Saturday morning, April 16, is set aside for decorating the church in preparation for Palm Sunday. We'll work from 9:00 to 11:00 a.m. or so, not including doughnut and coffee breaks. It's a good idea to bring work gloves, and any donations of palm fronds (we can use all types) are especially welcome.

Preparing the sanctuary for Easter morning will be done on Saturday, April 23 beginning at 9:00 a.m. It usually does not take longer than 3 hours or so, and you are welcome to come for all or part of that time. (The early birds get the best doughnuts!) This is a great opportunity to meet your fellow parishioners (of all ages!) as we arrange flowers and plants, fill candles and get everything "spic 'n' span" for the Easter liturgies.

Finally – you may wonder what happens to all the beautiful plants donated by parishioners specifically for our Easter celebrations. On Monday, April 25, we will meet at 9:00 a.m. to begin the joyful task of delivering these plants to the members of our parish who are homebound or hospitalized, and also to our local care facilities. The plants provide much pleasure to parishioners who receive them, as well as a sense that they are remembered and are still a vital part of our parish community. The deliveries are also a great form of outreach to our community! We need both drivers and deliverers, and we provide directions to the homes and facilities (we haven't lost anyone permanently, yet!). Afterwards, many of us go to a local restaurant for lunch.

Please consider joining us in one or all of these rewarding activities!

GODLY PLAY IS COMING TO ST. ANDREW'S!

Do you wonder about Godly Play?

Godly Play is a creative and imaginative curriculum that teaches children the art of using Christian language - parable, sacred story, silence and liturgical action - to help them become aware of God's presence in their lives. It is rooted in the Episcopal principles of scripture, tradition, and reason and the teaching methods of Maria Montessori.

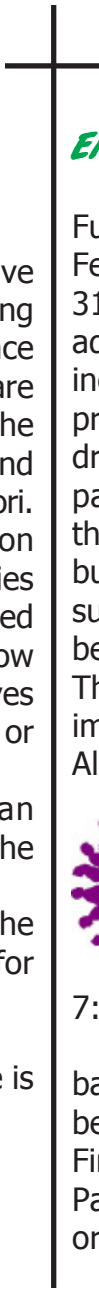
Biblical stories are told with hands-on materials, props, and symbols to make the stories accessible to children. The children are then asked wondering questions, which lead them to think how the stories of God's people relate to their own lives and relationship with God. There are no right or wrong answers.

During work time, children have an opportunity to use any of the story materials in the room or other craft materials.

Sunday School ends with Feast, and the children then join their parents in church for Communion.

Do you wonder how you can help? Many materials are needed for Godly Play. Here is a beginning list. Check back for updates.

- a. A clean area rug (about 5 ft x 8 ft)
- b. Low book shelves
- c. Baskets
- d. The ability to cut shapes out of wood



ENDOWMENT FUND INFO



The Board for the Endowment Fund held their quarterly meeting on February 20. The total Fund balance as of January 31, 2011 is \$829,509. It was noted that, even after adjusting for additional donations and accrued income, the Fund is now worth more than at its previous high in 2008 before the financial market drop. The Fund was established in 1982 with a parishioner's donation. It has been invested throughout the years. The capital is never spent, but much of the income is available to the Vestry to support exceptional expenses. Over \$342,000 has been distributed so far over the lifetime of the Fund. The next Board meeting is scheduled for June 12 immediately after 10:00 mass, in the rector's office. All interested parishioners are welcome to attend.

II. Guest John Mignot discussed security concerns at the Soup Kitchen. The Policy Committee will discuss guidelines for safety in the Soup Kitchen and Clothes Closet.

III. The February 5, 2011, Vestry Retreat minutes were reviewed, corrected, MSA.

IV. INTERIM PASTOR'S COMMENTS / REPORT

On Sunday, March 20, we will honor Archbishop Oscar Romero. There will be an evening program at 7.

V. SENIOR WARDEN'S REPORT

The Treasurer's report: It was MSA that the budget be amended to decrease the music budget by \$600 and to increase the church school budget by \$600. It was MSA to accept the Treasurer's report as presented.

Preschool: We have sent a letter to the preschool regarding the rent increase. It was MSA that Addendum II to the preschool lease

not include any reference to the grass area between the Parish Hall and Moody Hall. *The Membership / Fellowship Committee* needs more members.

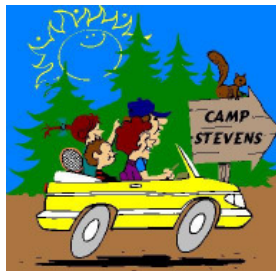
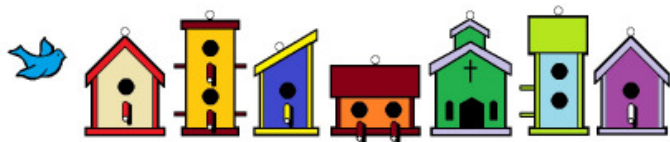
GOOD-BYE FR. CHARLIE!

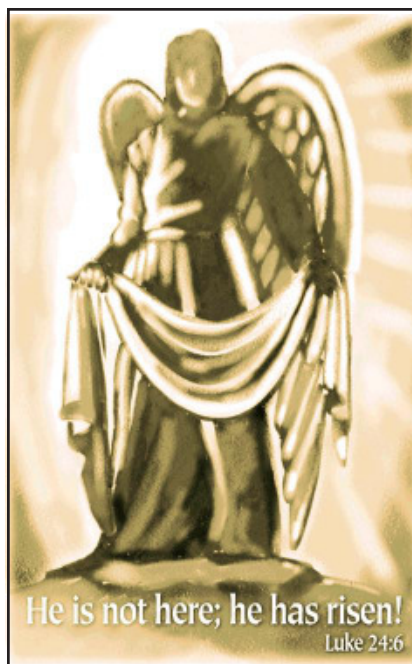
SPRING 2011 UTO
