FROM THE SENIOR WARDEN

Change is very difficult for me. I worry even in ANTICIPATION of change! For about a year before I retired from my job of almost 40 years, I worried about what I was going to do after I retired. I just knew I was going to become a recluse with NOTHING to do. Well, God definitely took care of that worry!

Living things change every day. My skin flakes off, and my hair falls out. My mulberry tree will soon start to lose its leaves so it can use that energy to grow and prepare for next year. If the old does not die away, the new cannot grow. But for us and for the plants in the garden, change is not quick or easy.

There are those who say that change is good for us but that is not quite correct. Any physician or psychologist will tell you that change is physically, emotionally, and psychologically difficult for us. In fact it can be quite traumatic. It may be necessary, but it is not easy.

So you won't be surprised if I tell you that as the parish is about to call a new rector, I am beginning to worry in anticipation of having to change again. The changes may not always be comfortable or easy. We may not like everything that the new rector does or says. And yet, I can hear God saying with a smile, "Why do you worry? Haven't I always helped you through changes before?"

Life experiences tell me that no matter how much planning or worrying I do, change happens...often with unexpected twists and turns. Our parish has undergone huge changes over the last two years when we had to learn how to be a church without a full time rector. It was often uncomfortable and scary. What kept me going was the trust that even though I was not always sure of what I was doing or where I was going, God did. In the midst of crazy change, God was changeless.

I take comfort in the words from the service of Compline, "Be present, O merciful God, and protect us through the hours of this night, so that we who are wearied by the changes and chances of this life may rest in your changelessness; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen." (BCP 133)

FROM THE LITURGY COMMITTEE

Over the last year, our interim pastor made a number of changes in the liturgy at our Sunday service. The Liturgy Committee recommends that the parish live with them for now.

The rector is canonically responsible for worship. Any further changes we make now might well be reversed or altered further by our new rector. We know that change is hard on a congregation. So we believe a period of stability is in our best interests at present.

The gospel procession no longer ends on the altar rail steps, but continues down the aisle. The Book of Common Prayer directs that, if not read from the lectern, the Gospel may be read "from the midst of the congregation (BCP 406)."

The altar candles are now extinguished immediately after the dismissal (when we have just proclaimed our intention to "go forth into the world") to help mark the end of the service appropriately. The prompt extinguishing of the altar candles reminds us that it is now time to leave, rejoicing in the power of the Spirit.

SEARCH COMMITTEE REPORT

Committee members are happy to report that our telephone interviews are completed and we are now having personal visits with candidates. The diocese is conducting the official background checks for us. Checking personal references is an ongoing process, and we will share with the Vestry our top candidates when that process has been completed. After the final candidates are officially presented to the Vestry, they will begin their discernment.

We continue in prayer as we seek God's guidance in our discernment process. Again, thank you for your prayers and support!

If you see an accident or if someone reports to you about seeing an accident on church grounds, please fill out an Accident Report (or help the witness to fill one out) so we know of the accident, can gather vital details, and can help the person who is hurt.





WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN STEWARDSHIP AND TITHING?

Stewardship invites parishioners to give a percentage of their income that represents their giving to the parish and other charities. Tithing is the biblical notion of giving one-tenth (10%) of our money. Good stewards reflect upon their current level of giving, and consider "Taking-a-Step" to a higher level of giving, if possible. The ultimate goal may be to achieve the biblical tithe, or it could be less or more, depending upon what a person/family has concluded through prayer and reflection.

In August the Stewardship committee is planning a Tithe Sunday on August 21 – not to raise more funds – but to give us the opportunity to experience the Tithe, at least for one week. Watch for more information.

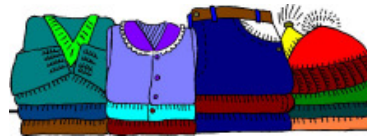

COMING IN SEPTEMBER

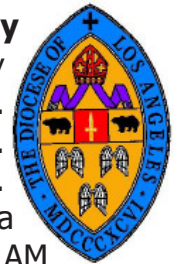
