## Ruminations from the Rector

### What's Love Got To Do With It?

February 14<sup>th</sup>. Valentine's Day. Love. Peculiar isn't it how in English we have only one word for love? We use the same word to express our feeling for a sport as for a spouse? For a movie as for our mom? Love. It's a big idea that can get lost in translation. What we actually do around, for, or with our love describes better the kind of relationship we hold with our beloved. Given how central it is to our spiritual life, couldn't we Christians promote a more refined way of describing love? Our Greek ancestors certainly did. But even then...only four forms: Agape, eros, philia, and storge. We struggle and fuss with finding the right way to express our feelings, our commitments, and our affections. Yet, this is one big idea we want to be clear about what we mean.



There are other big ideas we carry in our lives. I'd like to hear from you about what are the big ideas you ponder. Authority - Who's really in charge? Freedom - Is it actually possible? War - is it in our nature? Is there a grand Plan God has? Where does the Bible talk about that? What if I can't find meaning in my life? Is it the human condition to always be forlorn? Is loneliness fundamentally with us because we are on earth and not in heaven? Is there a heaven? Is my psyche the same as my soul? Do I need to be saved? Who first said so? Is that the same as changing my bad behavior?

This Lent we'll be looking at the Big Questions of our lives. It would be helpful to hear what yours are as I put together this series of discussions for Lent. We will tap astronomy, neuroscience, Holy Scripture, ancient philosophers, psychology, and maybe even the Oxford English Dictionary to explore the big questions of life.

I find as I listen to people talk about their lives they are often slanted to a cluster of values that evaluate what they should do, where they should go, and who they need to associate with. Understanding our cluster of values reveals the big question that rumbles in our unconscious. Because it's in our unconscious we are, well, unconscious of what it is. As we listen to one another that which is hidden may be revealed. Bringing our big question to our conscious mind can ease the anxiety and the nervous drive in our daily life. Living sweetly with our big question may give us the peace that passes all understanding. It certainly is an aperture for viewing a powerful part of our conversation and listening.

Send me your questions, your really big questions. We will discuss them during our Tuesday night discussion group. We will examine what Jesus says and how our Christian spiritual tradition informs our spiritual quest to answer our Big Questions.

✦ Sound System upgrade - As you may be aware the Vestry approved an upgrade to the existing system, speakers so the choir can hear the sermon, a new rear speaker, and a modern digital recorder to facilitate the recording of Beth's sermons. While not quite complete it should be done in the next few weeks. Please bear with us as we install the equipment, test it, and fine tune it.



We have 106 pledges for a total of \$ 212,494. Now that the festive season is over it is time to catch up with things forgotten (or put aside) - If your pledge is one of these, please make sure you get it to office or bring it with you on Sunday. It is still not too late but the Vestry needs an accurate financial forecast for the coming year for planning purposes. Thanks in advance.

## **Outreach**

### ***O Baby, Baby!***



There is a crying need among THE most vulnerable of our county's children...they need diapers and newborn clothes. This Lent we will be collecting diapers (any size) for Project HOPE School and newborn clothes (any type) for Orangewood Children's Home.

Orangewood needs onesies, t-shirts, caps, sox, blankets, anything for a newborn! These need to be new items. This is a urgent request. Children are born in the hospitals and have nothing to wear upon arrival. The county can provide diapers for them, but has a severe shortage of clothes during their usual six month stay in the county custody. The good news is these children have an excellent chance of becoming adopted by families that can care for them. The challenge is for the county to clothe the naked babes until they are adopted.

Project HOPE School assists homeless children and they have a distinct need for diapers of any size.

Both of these organizations are people we have worked with and supported in the past. We know our contributions make a significant difference. So, for this Lent give up the notion that the world doesn't need you, or that your contribution is too minor to make a difference. YOU CAN MAKE A DIFFERENCE! We will collect these items through Easter and hope that our contributions will sustain them for awhile. Thank you for your participation.



### ***Food Lovina Guys Cook-off!***



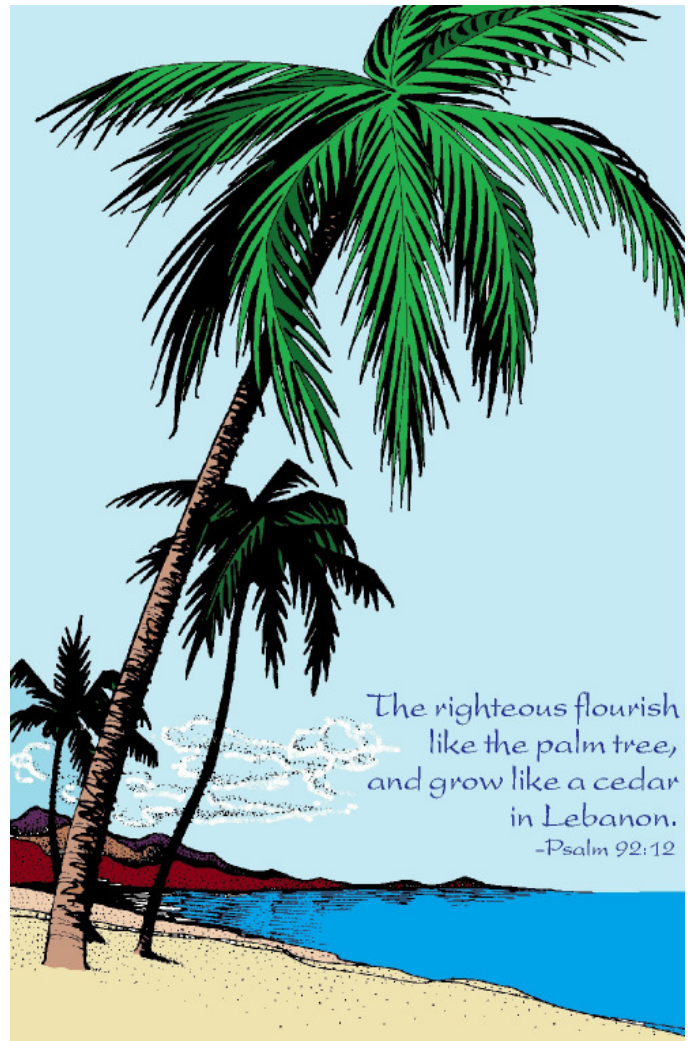

**Centering Prayer** will meet on Mondays, February 13<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup> at 7:30 PM in the Fireside Room.

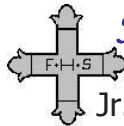
