## FROM THE SENIOR WARDEN

Our church is beginning yet another phase of its life. It will be a time without a permanent rector and a time without an interim. But our parish church will continue thanks to all of you. You are the church. You are its ministers. You are its members.



That is what it says in the catechism, the "An Outline of Faith," at the back of the Book of Common Prayer (BCP), beginning on p. 845.

Q. *How is the Church described in the Bible?*

A. The Church is described as the Body of which Jesus Christ is the Head and of which all baptized persons are members....

Q. *What is the mission of the Church?*

A. The mission of the Church is to restore all people to unity with God and each other in Christ.

Q. *How does the Church pursue its mission?*

A. The Church pursues its mission as it prays and worships, proclaims the Gospel, and promotes justice, peace, and love.

Q. *Through whom does the Church carry out its mission?*

A. The Church carries out its mission through the ministry of all its members. (Underline is mine).

Q. *Who are the ministers of the Church?*

A. The ministers of the Church are lay persons, bishops, priests, and deacons. (Note the order!)

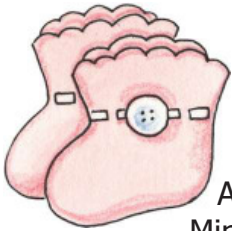
Q. *What is the ministry of the laity?*

A. The ministry of the lay persons is to represent Christ and his church; to bear witness to him wherever they may be; and according to the gifts given them, to carry on Christ's work of reconciliation in the world; and to take their place in life, worship, and governance of the church.

So, as we move into the middle of summer and early fall our job is clear. We are the church. We are members of Christ's body. We are its ministers. We are to carry on Christ's work in the world by working, praying, and giving for the spread of the kingdom of God.

There will be different supply priests at the altar every week, but you are heart and soul of this parish and this Church. We need you. Please join me in doing this important work.

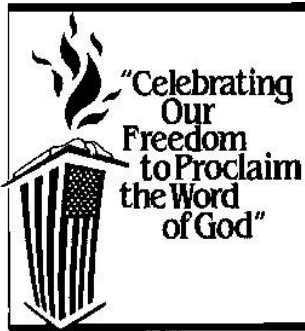
### SEARCH COMMITTEE REPORT



The Search Committee continues to make great progress on our rector search. As you will remember from our presentation in March, we are "narrowing the list" as we move along from receiving written materials from the candidates to arranging personal interviews. We are now in the midst of scheduling and conducting one-on-one interviews by telephone as well as by Skype (when available). We expect that this stage of the process will give us further insight into the remaining candidates and will reveal their "fit" with St. Andrew's.

Once the interview phase is complete, we will move on to visiting the candidates in their home parish and/or inviting them to Fullerton for face-to-face meetings. At the end of this last phase we will then be ready to present the "finalists" to the Vestry for their determination of who will receive the call to be the next rector of St. Andrew's.

We appreciate the continued prayers and support of the Rector Search Prayer Support Group as well as the entire congregation as we move forward in our work.

### Fullerton Interfaith Emergency Service News

At the Spring recognition luncheon of FIES, two of our parishioners were honored for their service. Vernon Shelters was singled out for his enduring service at the FIES Food Distribution Center where he has been a weekly volunteer for many years. Vern also is a dedicated helper at our own parish Friday Eve Soup Kitchen.

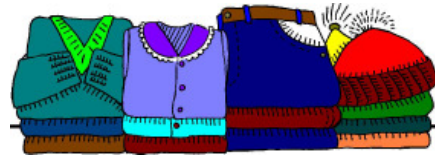
Our Parish FIES Board of Directors member, Warren Bowen, was recognized as a founding member of FIES 20 years ago. He has returned to the Board for the past few years as an active member and continues to represent St. Andrew's.

FIES is North Orange County's primary all around agency for the needy with the food distribution center, short term family housing for the needy, emergency public utility assistance, training in job seeking and holding, and its newest effort, a "second step" family housing unit to be constructed soon for longer term shelter. FIES counts over two dozen churches and the Jewish temple among its support groups and is thus able to attract various foundations and community groups for support and growth. You may pick up an information pamphlet on FIES at the church coffee hour or in the office.

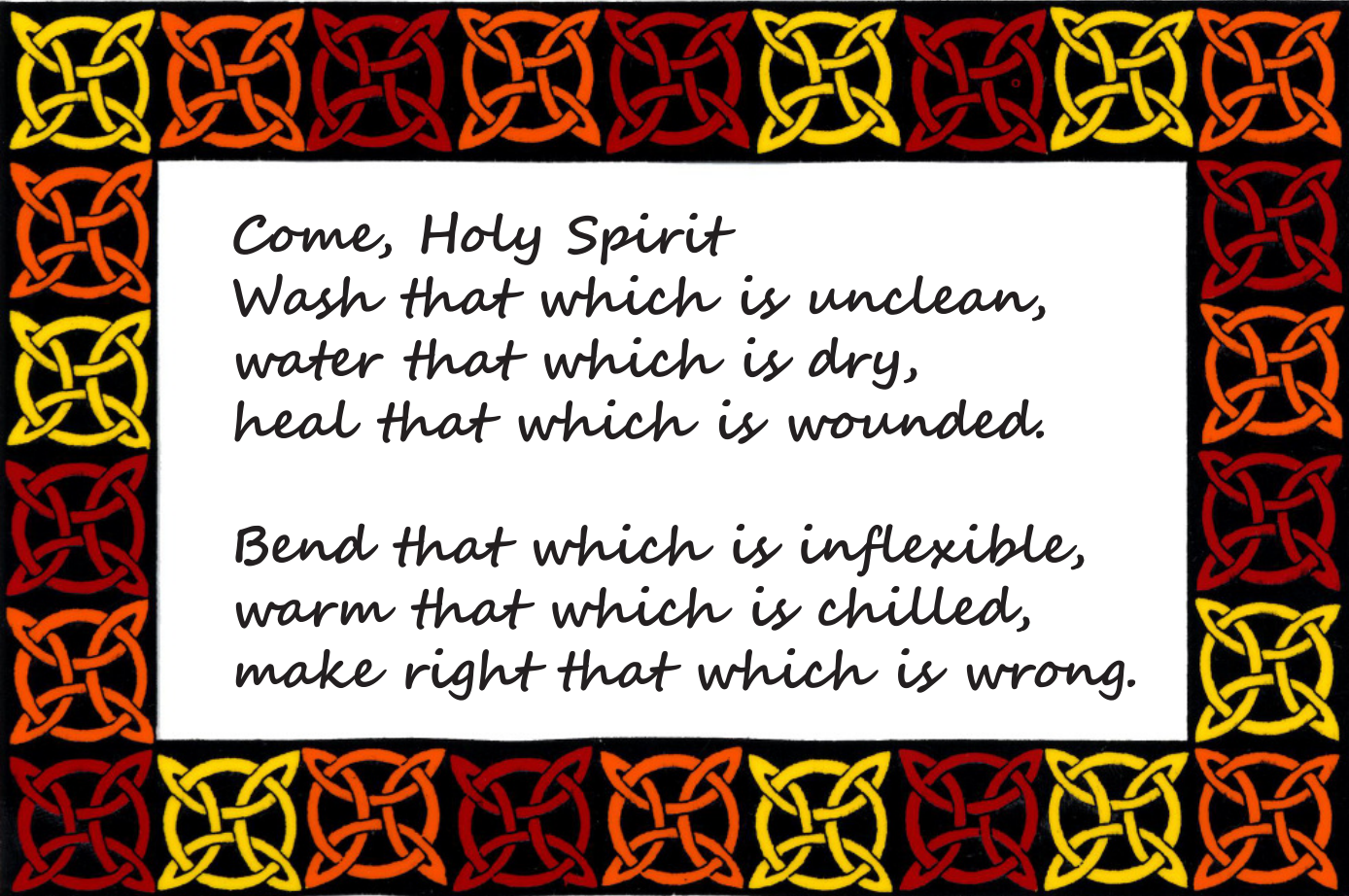
