From the Interim Pastor

Who is right?

In my thirty-five years of ministry, I have served many congregations where for many the question of who is right seems to be the most important. For example, the famous scientist Stephen Hawking has declared that Heaven is a fairy tale. The Internet is buzzing with comments about whether Hawking is right or wrong. My thoughts about heaven concern my being with God. I believe that I am always with God and God is always with me. When my own ego gets in the way I am not able to feel God's presence, but that does not mean that God is not in me or I in God. He also says that a belief in heaven is for those who are afraid of the dark. Since I am not afraid of the dark, I guess that I don't have to worry about Heaven being a fairy tale.

During this Easter season we will hear how the early Christian community struggled with doubt and faith, especially in our readings from the Acts of the Apostles and the Gospel of John. Were these early Christians right or wrong? Perhaps a better question to ask is how did the Spirit of God change their lives and the world in which they lived and how can we discern the Spirit of Truth working in their lives and ours?

As you prepare to call a new rector, your search committee will not be searching for someone like Fr. Mark or Fr. Charlie to lead this parish. Instead, the search committee will be seeking to discern whether the candidates are called by the Spirit to lead this congregation as your spiritual coach in the years ahead. This coach must be able to challenge and offer guidance as you struggle with the statements of a Stephen Hawking, with the questions of candidates for baptism and confirmation, with questions of stewardship, budgets, liturgy, and your role in the diocese, the various communities in which you live, and finally the place of St. Andrew's in the world.

It is all of you who are called to be witnesses of the Risen Christ. How you do that as a community of faith is the question only you can answer. It is not for your new rector to decide for you. You have all the gifts of the Spirit in this congregation. It is your task to discern them and use them to the best of your ability. Remember that we are always in transition as individuals and as the people of God. What remains constant is God's love and our call to share God's love with everyone.

May our Lord Jesus bless you now and always!

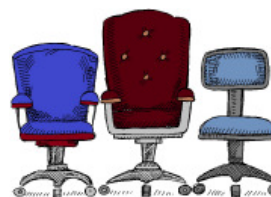

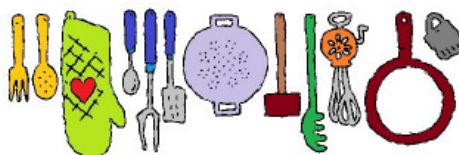

Centering Prayer

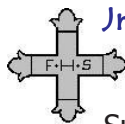
