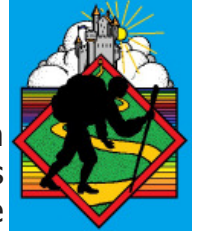

INTERIM PASTOR'S CORNER

Walking the Bible in Lent: A Video Journey, Tuesdays at 7:30 PM, Fireside Room



By foot, jeep, rowboat, and train, Bruce Feiler sets out on an epic journey to experience the Bible in its own world. His quest takes him to the birthplace of civilization, to the ancient town where some believe Abraham was born and then to the ancient ruins of Harran, where God tells Abraham to "go forth" to the Promised Land. As Feiler "walks the Bible," he discovers that his journey turns into a very different kind of pilgrimage. He wonders if the true importance of his travels may not be where the Bible took place. Instead, it is the uncharted spiritual landscape that beckons as strongly as his geographic adventure.

Feiler retraces Joseph's path to Egypt. He then takes us from the great temple in Luxor, to the pyramids and sphinx of Giza, and into the royal burial tombs in the Valley of the Kings. Feiler explores the ancient ruins of cities where the Israelites were said to toil under an oppressive pharaoh. Did the Israelites build the pyramids? Was it really the Red Sea Moses crossed? As Feiler confronts these questions, he realizes that it isn't the location, or even the event that's important, but that it was experienced as an act of God.

The Sinai Desert is the barren wilderness where the Israelites find themselves after they've escaped Egypt. How will Moses lead them? How will he bring them to the Promised Land? In the concluding chapter of "Walking the Bible," Bruce Feiler follows the Israelite's 40 year trek through what the Bible calls a "great and terrible wilderness." We will do the whole trek of the Hebrew Scriptures in 40 days of Lent.

Despite its harshness, the desert is also a haven for spiritual pilgrims. In the shadow of the mountain believed to be Mount Sinai, Feiler visits St. Catherine's Monastery, the oldest operating church in the world. He attends worship there, an unchanged ritual of 1,500 years. One of the monks, Texas-born Father Justin, shows him the Monastery's world-renowned ancient library of religious art and manuscripts.

Throughout, he is struck by the spiritual significance of the land, and its relationship to the people, and to God. At the end of his own journey, Feiler realizes that although Moses is denied entrance himself, it is not the land after all that is important for Moses. It is meeting God there.

At the end of our Lenten journey, we will join Jesus for his Holy Week journey to the Cross.

Summary of Vestry Minutes, January 27, 2010

A. GUEST Leo Poehner discussed a new spiritual support group for men, MALEs (Men as Learners and Elders). The group will meet twice a month on Thursdays from 7:30 - 9 PM.

B. INTERIM PASTOR'S REPORT: We will print all service bulletins.

C. SENIOR WARDEN'S REPORT

a. Finance Committee: The Treasurer presented the proposed budget for 2011, which was MSA with the following notations and concerns:

i. The Vestry is concerned that only approximately 1% of pledge income is available for outreach and that most of the outreach for 2011 will be funded by disbursement from the Endowment Fund.

ii. The approved budget shows a deficit of approximately \$15,000. This budget includes elimination of the paid position of Youth Director; elimination or reduction of funding for several programs which have reserve funds; use of Endowment Fund income to fund outreach; and an assumption that we will have at least one month this year with supply priests. The true deficit is therefore much higher than \$15,000.

b. Stewardship Chairman, Bill Pye, reported that letters were sent to people who pledged last year and did not renew their pledge this year. 114 pledges were received for \$215,453.

c. Our Parish Administrator, Minerva Cruz, will be on maternity / family leave during the summer. She will be paid, and the office will be covered with volunteer help during her absence.

d. Preschool update: We will increase the rent for the preschool.

D. COMMITTEE REPORTS

a. Search Committee: Lynn Abouchar reported progress is being made in the search process.

b. Parish Relation: Scheduled events appear elsewhere in the Messenger.

c. Buildings and Grounds: Junior Warden Margie Bangs reported that there are termites in the church. It was MSA that we tent the church at a cost of no more than \$6000 with the funds to come from the McDowell bequest and the replacement reserve fund. The storage room in Moody Hall will be cleaned out for use by the Junior Youth Group and Centering Prayer. There will be a work party on March 5 at 8:30 am.

d. Christian Education: Lynn Abouchar reported that discussion will be held with Sunday School Director Jessica Lowerre and the Sunday School teachers to revitalize Sunday School. Mark Wills met with the Youth Group to discuss the Rector search process with them. Ken Dick is holding regular Youth Group meetings. Marilyn St. John is teaching the Junior Youth Sunday Seminars; they will have a social on February 25. Acolytes are scheduled so

they can attend Sunday Seminars. They will serve together on the fourth Sunday when they will have met on Friday for a social event. Future plans include a Sunday School open house and Youth Sunday.

e. Pictorial Directory Committee: Don Harrell reported that corrections have been submitted, and the directory should arrive soon.

At the Annual Meeting on January 30, Elizabeth Desloge, Linda Drake, Micki Ireland, and Mary Pat Keeton were elected to the Vestry. Bill Bangs was re-elected to the Endowment Fund Board and Milt St. John was elected (2/12) as the Vestry representative. After receiving reports from the wardens, the interim pastor, and the parish organizations, the meeting was suspended until Sunday, February 13, after the 10:00 a.m. service when we discussed the 2010 Financials and the budget for 2011.

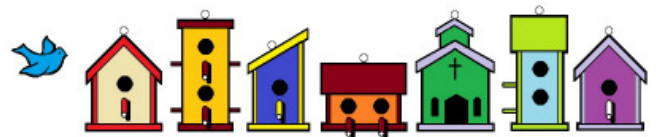

The Altar Guild burns last year's Palm Crosses to make the ashes for Ash Wednesday. Please bring your old palm crosses and place them in the baskets provided at the church doors.

If this is what you want to do, we hope you will come to the evening Lenten services on Tuesday nights from 7:00 to 7:30 p.m., just before the Discussion Group.
