Interim Pastor's Corner: Our Place in the Anglican Communion?

Following the Diocesan Convention last December, which held round table discussions about the proposed Anglican Covenant, the Diocese of Los Angeles is recommending that "The Episcopal Church not endorse the final draft of the Anglican Covenant but that we patiently continue the conversation out of our bonds of affection and mutual loyalty to the entire Communion."



One of the highlights of our comments regarding the Covenant is the recognition of respect for the differences in polity contained in the document. "The Episcopal Church was founded in democracy and has enjoyed a polity which is free and democratic since 1789. This long-standing course cannot be reversed. We do, however, acknowledge, honor and support the differences in polity and governance that distinguish the various churches of the Communion. We believe respect for those differences is a crucial component of our tradition that should undergird any Anglican Covenant. For that reason, we support Sections One and Two of the Covenant, which positively affirm the foundation of our faith, our common Anglican vocation, and do not challenge our unique polity."

"One of our chief strengths as Anglicans has been our ecumenical availability to Christians who find in us the essence of the faith once delivered to the saints, along with latitude in "things indifferent." We have been a tradition of bridges, not walls. We are concerned about the omission of the laity from Section 3. As St. Paul teaches, we are all of us the Body of Christ and individually members thereof (I Corinthians 12). There are four orders of ministry in the Church – bishops, priests, deacons and lay people, who also minister as members of the baptized people of God.... A Covenant to which we could subscribe would need to re-imagine the Instruments of Communion to provide a stronger representation from all the orders of ministry." Finally, "Section 4 is of greatest concern. It creates a punitive, bureaucratic, juridical process within the Standing Committee of the Anglican Communion, elevating its authority over the member churches despite previous affirmations of member church autonomy (see, e.g., Section 4.1.3)." For an in depth study of the Anglican Covenant, I recommend the essays contained in *The Genius of Anglicanism: Perspectives on the Proposed Anglican Covenant* available online by the Chicago Consultation.

Search Committee Report



The search committee is happy to report that we have 28 spiritual and talented candidates whose resumes, education/work histories, and personal profiles we are reading and discussing. In order to identify those whose abilities match the goals and responsibilities as deemed important by our fellow parishioners and recorded in St. Andrew's position profile, we are carefully assessing the areas of expertise, style of spiritual and administrative leadership, and prior experience of each priest presented.

As we narrow the field, we pray for guidance during this important part of our search, we remember that Jesus implored his disciples to cast their nets wide and deep. And so we are not making hasty judgments but letting each candidate reveal him/her self to us at each step of the process.

We are sending those candidates remaining in the search process a packet with more information about our parish, including recent service bulletins, the Messenger, our Annual Report as well as maps and basic information about the Fullerton area. It is important that our prospective rector know as much as possible about us for she/he is also in a Discernment Process. In return, we ask that the candidates provide us with responses to several specific questions, sample sermons and other materials so that we might get to know them better.

Once we receive this material, we will again evaluate their profile and determine whether their candidacy warrants further exploration via telephone interviews. We anticipate that this part of the process will take several weeks, since there will be some lag time between receiving and evaluating their responses. Like you, we pray that the thoroughness of our discernment process will yield the result that we all want: the right rector for St. Andrews. We who are creatures of Time must learn to live in God's Time as we interact with people all over the United States and overseas.

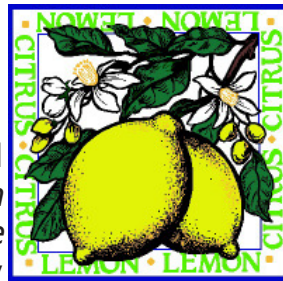
May Work Party

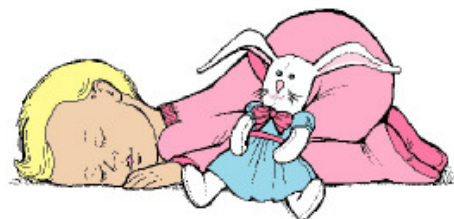
From the Altar Guild Director

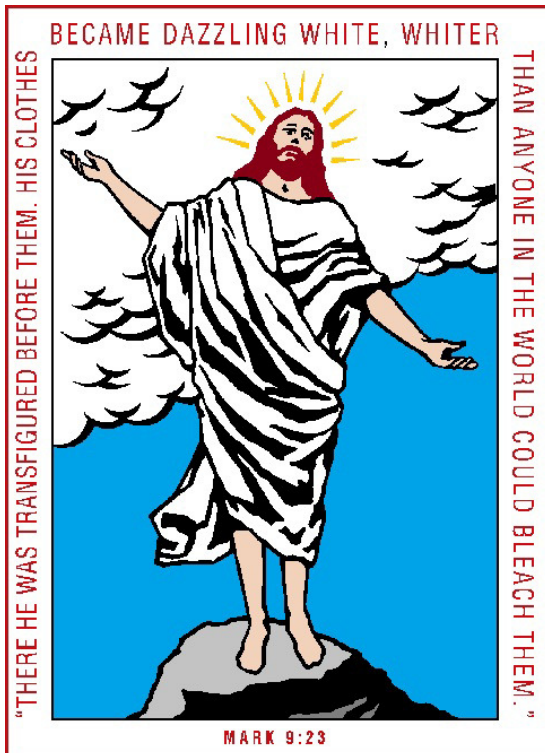
