RUMINATIONS FROM THE RECTOR



A priest could hardly open a new ministry with more auspicious Sundays as All Saints Day and then the next Sunday being the patronal feast day of the congregation. Then not too long after that comes the national feast day itself: Thanksgiving. Feels like gratitude all around. Gratitude for old friends, new friends, and everything else that is and is to be. We'll be saying and singing thank you for the whole month!

On November 6th, our celebration of All Saints Day, we stretch our hearts and minds to recognize the whole people of God – past, present and future. Historians ground us in the stories of the past and from that vantage point we peer into our present and future. As the people of the present we need to remember that the “present” people of God not only share our pews with us, but also show up everywhere in our lives today. You meet them at school or at work or at tea... as the hymnody goes.

As I write this, I say goodbye to an era of present day saints in Northern California. An era of 30 some years worth of friends and ministry colleagues I leave to be joining you all. You no doubt recognize more than ever that your era of the past 30 some years has turned its page now too. A lot of life happens in that time – happy days, challenges, broken hearts, amazing miracles, and the blessing of friendship. This month we welcome our era of ministry. I give thanks for all the past and present saints that have brought us to this point and this place. Our era of ministry means not only the joining of you and me together, but our other “present” saints in our community who don't realize their lives are about to change too.

In 1978 I found a most ridiculous reason to come to an Episcopal church. The reason I came doesn't really matter; showing up did. My life hasn't been the same since. I was so put off by the odd rituals and language that at the end of the service I tried sneaking out the side door to avoid having to shake this priest's hand at the front door. But, the priest at that church made an utter fool of himself. So eager to welcome the newcomer he ran across the church yard into the parking lot, robes and vestments like wings, and came up to me quite breathless and said, “Excuse me, I don't believe we met? I'm Donald Schell.” Six months later I was baptized. Who knows what will happen when someone crosses our threshold of welcome?

Present day saints are all around us, just waiting for our welcome, our invitation, our gesture of friendship and inclusion. Give your friends, your acquaintances, anyone you meet, any excuse to come to church. Once they are here, they may discover this is the spiritual home they had been longing for. I did. You did. Who else will be deeply grateful they are with us?

NOVEMBER IS FIES MONTH FOR ST. ANDREW'S ...

- 1 jar of peanut butter

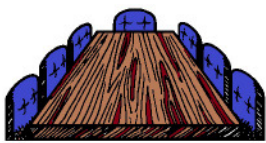
DONATE A CAN OF FOOD, RECEIVE A FREE HOT DOG



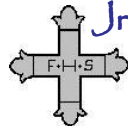
The Choir

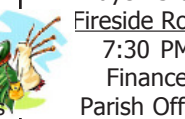
