To the Search Committee:

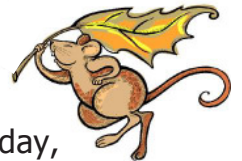

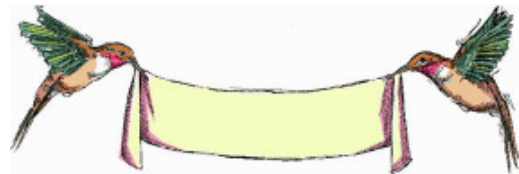

⚡ MINERVA returned to the office on Monday, September 12. The office will be open from 9:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Thursday. (Note: Tuesday office hours return!) However, the office will close at 1:00 p.m. on Fridays.

⚡ ANNOUNCEMENTS: The Liturgy Committee was asked to consider making the announcements at the beginning of the service. The Committee decided to keep the announcements at the end of the service for two reasons. First, when announcements are made at the beginning of the service (especially at 10:00) about 1/3 of the congregation is not there to hear them. Second, the committee had discussed making other changes in July and had decided not to make any changes in the way the liturgy is "staged" until after our new rector arrives. We understand that the end of the 10:00 service may seem awkward, but we hope you bear with us for a little while longer.

Outreach



November is our month to provide bags of groceries for Fullerton Interfaith Emergency Services. We will pass out empty grocery bags on October 30 with a list of groceries that will feed a family of four for 2 days. Shopping to fill the bag is an interesting endeavor, and can be especially meaningful for your children to know that they can help put groceries on the table for other children in need. We plan an ingathering on Sunday, November 13th, when the bags will be blessed before they are delivered to FIES. If you can't fill your bag before then, they will be welcome until the end of the month. If you are unable to shop, a check for \$25 (with FIES on the memo line) will help buy the food.

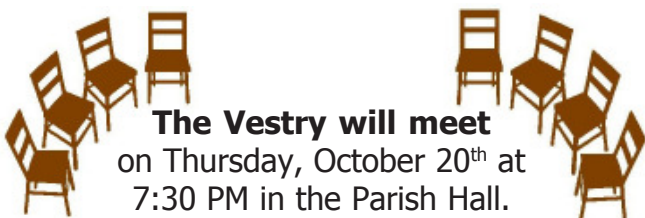

St. Andrew's Day
