FROM THE SENIOR WARDEN

The Vestry and Search Committee members are very much on edge these days. We all seem quite tense with and testy to each other and to everyone else around us. I think we are feeling the pressure of knowing that the time is NOW for us to choose a new rector, even while we do our regular jobs and fulfill our other Vestry responsibilities.



The Search Committee's long months of work are finally drawing to a close. By the time you read this, the rector "finalists" will have been presented to the Vestry. But the Search Committee pondered and contemplated if they had made the right choices and decisions. I know each one of them has had more than one sleepless night.

Now the Vestry realizes that the final decision is ours to make. Each of us in our own way wanted to have input in this decision and to choose the next rector. However, we realize that in some ways it would have been far easier if we didn't have to be the ones choosing. That way we couldn't be blamed for anything, and we could even blame someone else if we wanted to! We laugh that it is like having a master key: it doesn't give us more freedom and power, just more RESPONSIBILITY.

Growing up, I couldn't wait to be on my own. But when I finally was on my own, I felt the weight of the awesome responsibility of my decisions and choices. Choosing the right rector for our Parish is like that responsibility, but doubled since we want to choose the right rector not just for ourselves but for the whole parish. How will we know the right one to select?

Joanna Satorius (Diocesan Deployment Officer) and I decided that all of us have this idea that when the new rector comes, all of our perceived problems and anxieties will magically disappear. The congregation will double or triple in number within weeks, and the entire parish will support the church so generously that our financial concerns will disappear forever...that magically (that is, without us doing any work), all would be well.

The new rector will not be the magician some parishioners want, able to wave the magic wand and fix all the ailments some believe we have. Definitely s/he will not be able to do everything alone, in a miraculously short time. Good changes will come, but not overnight and perhaps in different ways than we expect.



As a wise young man pointed out to me recently over lunch: the importance of a church in the 21st century will not be in its size or because of its religious leader. The importance will be the result of the entire congregation's Gospel impact on its community. It will be determined by the good we do in/for the community and throughout the parish itself.

Then the impact of St. Andrew's Church cannot be the work and responsibility of the rector alone. All of us will continue to be important components to the church both in the community and to each other. The work lay people have been doing must continue to be done by the laity. We cannot just dump all of it onto the shoulders of the new rector. His/ Her task will be to lead us in all areas of this parish, especially liturgically and spiritually, but s/he cannot do the work alone. We all must do the work of this congregation.

I always wait for divine inspiration to come to me...like it came to the ancient leaders of Israel...in a clear loud voice saying, "I am God. Listen to me." But inspiration never comes to me like that. It comes in a cartoon, a phrase in a song, a feeling in the pit of my stomach, a news headline on the radio, or an unrelated story of a friend.

Even the ancients didn't always listen to the Divine voice right away. Besides, God sometimes spoke in voices of "a multitude of the heavenly host," but sometimes She spoke in the silence. Please pray that each of us on the Vestry will hear God's voice, however and wherever She speaks; and that we will allow ourselves to be guided by His hands.

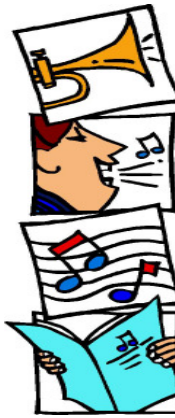


Book Nook
