**BISHOP CURRY VISITS EPISCOPAL CENTER AT DUKE**

The Episcopal Center was a joy filled space on the occasion of the Bishop's Visitation Sunday, May 2nd, 2010. Duke students, the Center's advisory board members and guests gathered for the afternoon service at which The Rt. Rev'd Michael Curry presided. The Holy Eucharist was celebrated by the bishop with con-celebrants The Rev'd Nils Chittenden, newly appointed Chaplain of the Episcopal Center, and The Rev'd Karen Barfield, Interim Chaplain. At this last service of the semester, Duke senior Samiron Ray was baptized, and a new baptismal bowl blessed by the bishop.

Following the service, everyone joined together for a wonderful meal provided by St. Stephen's Church. Special thanks go to Nancy Barnes, Louise Cabot, Sydney Culp (and her helper Will Culp) and Priscilla Shows for their donations for the dinner.

May 2nd was new Chaplain Nils Chittenden's first official Sunday. His bio follows. The Episcopal Church is alive and well at Duke University.

**The Reverend Nils Chittenden**

Nils Chittenden was born and raised in the south-east of England, about an hour from London. He attended an Anglican boarding school founded for the sons of the clergy and then studied for an undergraduate degree in theology at the University of Durham, north-east England. Following his undergrad days, Nils began to explore more fully a vocation to ordained ministry, and spent a year working as a pastoral assistant in an urban parish near Newcastle-upon-Tyne. He then returned to his native south-east and worked for Canterbury Cathedral as a visitor representative and guide. After two years at seminary in Cambridge, England, he was ordained deacon in Durham Cathedral and ministered in a small rural parish for two years. During this time, Nils Chittenden felt increasingly called to chaplaincy ministry, and became a Chaplain to industry and urban programs in Gateshead, north-east England, where he focused on inter-faith community development, and housing and homelessness support provision. During this period, he studied for and gained a Master's degree in politics and social policy. His time in Gateshead acted as a springboard to his next move, which was heading up a national non-profit called the Churches' Community Work Alliance. Although a UK-wide post, with extensive travel, he was based in Durham and combined his national work with being a minor canon at Durham Cathedral and Chaplain of St Mary's College, University of Durham.

Nils Chittenden's interests are many and varied. He is a competent musician, mainly as a choral singer and pianist, and he enjoys many musical genres from Renaissance polyphony and JS Bach to 70s disco music and more recent bands. He hopes that he might be able to take up flying lessons again and work towards his Private Pilot's License. He likes to travel, preferably to places that have good food and wine! He also loves home improvement and interior design.

**Men's Club Activities**

The St. Stephen's men have been busy with projects!

Particularly, with walkway lighting: the long days permitted a Men's Club team of Orlando Lomanto, Allen Killam, and Dean McCumber working with Clyde Stephens to complete the renewal and upgrade of the walkway lighting leading to the sanctuary. After approximately 25 years most of the posts supporting the lights have disintegrated. New posts are being installed where needed and improved light fixtures mounted. This work will be completed by mid-summer.

Special thanks go to Orlando Lomanto and Allen Killam. Orlando was pivotal in locating new posts; Allen has been doing the really "heavy lifting" by breaking the old posts out of their concrete bases. Clyde has been helpful in many key ways, as usual!

For your information, when we know more about the new church sign, we'll complete the upgrade of the light at the bottom of the hill nearest the road and run a wire from there to lighting for the sign.

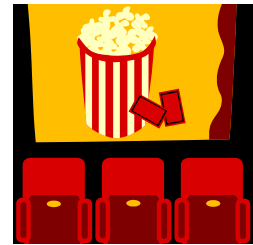

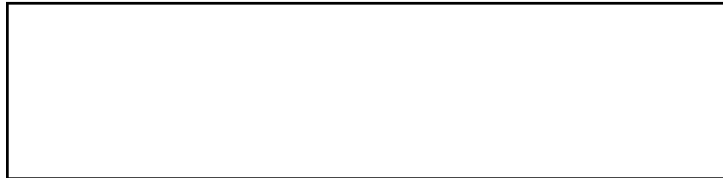
