St. Stephen's Concert Series will present Timothy Olsen, Kenan Professor of Organ at University of North Carolina School of the Arts, Winston-Salem. Dr. Olsen will perform a recital on the Flentrop Organ at St. Stephen's Episcopal Church. The concert is preceded by an interview with Dr. Olsen by Dr. Joseph Kitchen at 3:00 PM in the Parish Hall.



Dr. Olsen received his Bachelor of Music in organ performance from Concordia College and pursued graduate work at the Eastman School of Music, earning Master of Music and Doctor of Musical Arts degrees in organ performance and literature and a Master of Arts degree in theory pedagogy. He has served on the faculty of Ithaca College, Cornell City University, Binghamton University and Oklahoma City University, where he was the Wanda L. Bass Chair of Organ. In July 2009, he was appointed the Kenan Professor of Organ at the University of North Carolina School of the Arts in Winston-Salem, NC. Dr. Olsen has played recitals throughout the United States and has been featured on Minnesota Public Radio's Pipedreams. In 2002, he received First Prize at the American Guild of Organists National Young Artists Competition. In 2009, he was a featured recitalist and workshop presenter at the 2009 Region VII AGO Convention in Albuquerque, N.M. He also performs with orchestras and collaboratively in organ/trumpet recitals, organ duo recitals, and as organist for major choral works.
