Below is the response and effect of one of our LIFE Communities efforts at doing good:

Hello All,

Thank you so much for your generous donation of turkeys for families we work with in the Dorchester community through The Family Nurturing Center. From all the collected donations, we were able to surpass our original goal of raising 50 turkeys. We raised an incredible amount of 91 TURKEYS!!! That means, we were able to provide 91 families with turkeys, many of whom would not have been able to afford a nice Thanksgiving holiday meal in these tough economic times. Your generosity is greatly appreciated. Here are a couple examples of the responses from families that we were able to serve from this event.



One of the families is a single mother, with four children under the age of five, who is overwhelmed with her financial situation.

“I was stressing out thinking about where I was going to get a turkey for Thanksgiving. You just saved me.”

The second family is a single mother with a brain tumor, in her late 20s, with a three-year old autistic child, who is struggling to make ends meet.

“Since I haven’t been able to work because of my brain tumor, the holidays this year have been especially hard for us. I didn’t know how I was going to put food on the table for Thanksgiving.”
