

## **Mission Plant**

### **Frequently Asked Questions**

**What is it?** Mission Plant partners a church plant with a church group of students and/or adults to help a church plant make a significant impact in their ministry location.

**What will our group do?** The church group may do one or a combination of but not limited to the following: sports camp, VBS, construction, Bible clubs, block parties, survey, literature distribution, community service, street evangelism, etc. The 'what is done' is determined by the need of the church plant at their particular level of development.

**Where could we serve?** Church plants all over Virginia and Washington D.C. request mission groups to help them. Contact Dallas Mills at [CSMVA3434@aol.com](mailto:CSMVA3434@aol.com) to get possible match ups with church plants based on your church group's ministry skills and preferences.

**How long would we serve?** Mission Plant projects are normally a week, but can be for one to three days. For example a Fall Harvest Block Party event could be done on a Friday evening and Saturday. If your group needs a weekend mission trip, this could be your answer, as well as a week long summer mission project.

**How much will it cost?** Your cost will range between \$75 - \$300, depending on accommodations, meals, and type of ministry. The cost of your trip depends on your sleeping and eating arrangements. Some groups sleep in a gym or church and cook their own meals and do a trip for \$75. Some groups sleep in hotels and eat out and does a mission trip for \$300.

Note: It is customary for the Partner Church to provide resources for the mission project. For example churches doing Backyard Bible Clubs and servant evangelism projects included in their training the necessary materials to accomplish these mission projects.

**What have been the results?** Church Plants have always been able to surge forward in their growth when a Mission Plant team has come to assist them. The level of preparation on both ends has determined the level of growth. Some have doubled in size while others have gained community respect and recognition.

Church groups have had young people called to ministry, students and leaders sharing their faith for the first time, and unity in the group established where there had been disunity. God uses the missional process of Mission Plant.
