

Thank you (for your correspondence).

Pastor Etienne (*pastor of our former sister church*) and I just returned from PAP (*Port au Prince*). I can't even begin to tell you the devastation.

The stench of death on one side of the road as body lay there, the other side of the road people sleeping, as they are afraid to return to their homes.

We were able to distribute over 1300 bags of food (rice) and water. The people here have not had any fresh water for over 72 hours. Things are getting more dangerous in PAP as aide is being detained.

We are working with a clinic just outside of Leogane. They are completely out of medicines, and had to shut down. We brought them some antibiotics and other supplies. We are hoping to return on Monday/Tuesday with more items. The banks are closed, the schools are closed, all the shops are closed. So it is becoming more difficult to get things here in Haiti.

Right now, we need people here that know how to handle Natural disasters. The country is in a state of confusion and dismay.

We were woke this morning at 3:30 by another tremor (much worse in PAP than here in Cayes). The people around us started screaming and from every direction you could here choruses on 'Amazing Grace'.

Thank you for helping organizations to bring relief here to Haiti. Whatever your church decides will be of great help. As the magnitude of what is needed is beyond what we can express
