A Reading from the Acts of the Apostles.

Now in Joppa there was a disciple whose name was Tabitha, which in Greek is Dorcas. She was devoted to good works and acts of charity. At that time she became ill and died. When they had washed her, they laid her in a room upstairs. Since Lydda was near Joppa, the disciples, who heard that Peter was there, sent two men to him with the request, "Please come to us without delay." So Peter got up and went with them; and when he arrived, they took him to the room upstairs. All the widows stood beside him, weeping and showing tunics and other clothing that Dorcas had made while she was with them. Peter put all of them outside, and then he knelt down and prayed. He turned to the body and said, "Tabitha, get up." Then she opened her eyes, and seeing Peter, she sat up. He gave her his hand and helped her up. Then calling the saints and widows, he showed her to be alive. This became known throughout Joppa, and many believed in the Lord. Meanwhile he stayed in Joppa for some time with a certain Simon, a tanner.



RECEIVING THE WINE DURING COMMUNION

To Sip or To Dip? That is the Question

For decades and more, the church has been concerned about disease transmission through the common cup. This has prompted many a scientific look at the situation. This is the question we one again face with the COVID pandemic. It is counter-intuitive to think that sipping from the cup is safer than dipping the wafer into the cup (known as intinction). But, counter-intuitive or not, that is the case.

I would like to introduce you to the work of Dr. David Gould. Dr. Gould investigated this question of sipping or dipping for the Anglican Church of Canada. I share with you his findings.* Dr. Gould tells us that in "...no case can exposure to a single bacterium result in infection...millions must be transmitted from person to person before infection can occur." While his original research focused more on AIDS than other pathogens, the same trends seem to be true for other pathogens such as COVID-19 and it's variants.

"There is real concern that many modes of intinction used in parishes do not reduce the threat of infection. ...the wafer in the hand of the recipient, then intincting it merely means that the wafer becomes contaminated by the hand of the recipient and that the contaminated wafer is then placed in the wine – spreading infection to it". With the wiping and turning of the chalice, the likelihood of passing along illness very small. Used in normal practice the common cup poses no real risk of infection. For the reasons cited above, the bishop has said no intincting, in the interests of safety.

However, there is another way to fully receive communion without either intincting or drinking. That is through the reception of the wafer only. This has been done for centuries in the past. As we are receiving the living Christ in the sacrament, we know that blood really is inseparable from flesh, so the communion of the wafer alone is full communion. This doctrine called the Doctrine of Concomitance and holds that either the wafer or the cup contains the whole of Christ. While the common cup is normative, the real question is this:

To sip or skip? That is the question.
