Doolittle Grant Nomination Forms Now Available/Deadline October 13 Postmark

The Doolittle Committee administers the Ethelwyn Doolittle Justice and Outreach Fund which provides financial support to organizations outside of the Community Church of New York Unitarian Universalist. These organizations must provide direct assistance or advocacy to designated communities in need. Their work must also fall within the areas of human rights, civil liberties, racial justice and/or environmental concerns. They must also have a 501-C3 designation. Potential Grant recipients must be nominated by members of Community Church of New York UU in the fall of each year. We cannot consider organizations that apply without being nominated by a church member. The nomination forms for 2016/17 submissions are available upon request from the office, at the Welcome Table on Sundays, or on our church's website, and must be returned via U.S. postal mail only, postmarked no later than October 14, 2018 (deadline has been extended).

11 am Worship - John Washburn will speak on Human Rights and the International Criminal Court UNGA Forum – Human Rights in Yemen-1-2:30 pm, Hall of Worship

On UN Sunday, as part of this year's 70th anniversary of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, we are hosting a timely program on the current human rights catastrophe in Yemen – now called the worst humanitarian crisis in the world. Yemen, already the poorest country in the Middle East, is barely surviving a war forced on it by neighboring Saudi Arabia and Iran, and the United States is operating in the middle of it. We will meet and host Yemeni guests from a range of NGOs to gain direct understanding from unique personal and professional views. We will learn what is behind the crisis, what is happening now, and how we can help.

Social Tea – *Inside Palestine & Israel - A Glimpse* - Tuesday, October 23, 2-3:30 pm, Assembly Hall Helga Busemann, a retired social worker, has long been interested in the Israeli-Palestinian conflict. In March 2018, she took the opportunity with members of the USA Mental Health Network to see the situation for herself. Her talk will touch on the disappearing face of Palestine and its on-going struggle to resist under the Israeli occupation. She will also be recalling a visit to the Aida refugee camp in Bethlehem, the work of UNWRA (the United Nations Welfare and Relief Agency), as well as the treatment of children under military law and more.
