Doolittle Grant Nomination Forms Now Available / Return Deadline October 13 Postmark

The Doolittle Committee administers the Ethelwyn Doolittle Justice and Outreach Fund which provides financial support to organizations outside of the Community Church of New York Unitarian Universalist. These organizations must provide direct assistance or advocacy to designated communities in need. Their work must also fall within the areas of human rights, civil liberties, racial justice and/or environmental concerns. They must also have a 501-C3 designation. Potential Grant recipients must be nominated by members of Community Church of New York UU in the fall of each year. We cannot consider organizations that apply without being nominated by a church member.
