

Summer Camp Packing List

Pack in a backpack, duffel bag or foot locker

Mark your stuff with a perm marker – especially if it looks like everyone else's

Don't take anything you would hate to lose or things of high value

Class "A" Uniform - To be worn traveling, evening meals, and all campfires

- Troop Neckerchief/slide – optional
- Scout socks
- Scout trousers or shorts
- Scout Shirt
- Scout belt
- Hanger**

Prescription Medications

- MUST BE IN ORIGINAL LABELED PRESCRIPTION BOTTLE(S)**
- Multiple Prescriptions must be separated - do not mix several different medications in the same bottle.
- Upon arriving at camp/medications will be checked in and administered by camp medic.

Clothing and Bedding

- Sweater, Jacket or sweatshirt
- Plastic to cover mattress (sm. plastic drop cloth works great)
- Sleeping Pad – optional
- Sleeping Bag or Blankets and Pillow or Camp Pillow
- Swim Trunks (no cutoffs)
- Pants/Shorts (lightweight, zipoff legs are best, less cotton and more poly)
- Under shorts
- T-shirts (less cotton and more poly is best)
- Hat
- Rain Gear (coat preferred over poncho)
- Long and Short Pants
- Tennis Shoes (2 pairs!) - No Sandals Allowed, moccasins for camp
- Shower Shoes
- Socks
- Work Gloves

Toilet Articles

- Toothpaste
- Toothbrush
- Wash Cloth
- Soap
- Deodorant
- Towels
- Comb/Brush

- ❑ Sunscreen
- ❑ Toilet Paper
- ❑ Insect Repellant (no aerosol, repellent/sunblock combo is good)
- ❑ Chapstick (with sunblock is optimal)

Advancement

- ❑ Scout Handbook
- ❑ Notebook with plastic sheet covers and a baseball card holder
- ❑ Daily Agenda (in plastic sheet in the notebook); Advanced Scouts should have class agenda
- ❑ Pens and Pencils and Highlighter
- ❑ Merit Badge Books
- ❑ Merit Badge work already completed
- ❑ Blue cards if in process
- ❑ Items needed for Merit Badge Classes

Additional Items

- ❑ Pocket money for scout shop (small bills)
- ❑ Bandana
- ❑ Small notebook for journaling
- ❑ Atlanta Area Council patch for trading
- ❑ Flashlight with Batteries and Extra Bulb
- ❑ Bowl, cup, spoon for around camp
- ❑ Water Bottle/canteen – fill up every day
- ❑ Pocket Knife (no sheath knives) – Trailblazers check in knives with patrol leaders until Totin' Chip earned
- ❑ Totin' Chip card if earned
- ❑ Money for program materials (basket kits, rockets, gas for motor boating), camp souvenirs and snacks (Trailblazers need nearly \$50 in supply costs for the 5 badges)
- ❑ Small Book bag or Daypack (daypack required for Trailblazers)
- ❑ Personal First Aid Kit in Baggie
 - adhesive bandages
 - medical tape
 - pain killers
 - gauze
 - alcohol pads
 - mole skin
 - other small items for treating small wounds
- ❑ Religious Material
- ❑ Sewing Kit
- ❑ Fishing Gear if desired
- ❑ Dirty Clothes Bag
- ❑ Sunglasses
- ❑ Plastic Bag (to bring wet items home)
- ❑ Compass
- ❑ Watch
- ❑ Swim goggles if you use them

- ❑ Camera and Film
- ❑ Small Clothesline
- ❑ Postcards/stamps (buy stamps ahead of time)
- ❑ Book(s) to read
- ❑ Playing cards, chess/checkers
- ❑ Fix it kit – safety pins, rubber bands, twist ties, duct tape, string
- ❑ Mosquitoes netting - optional

- Camp chair
- Walking stick
- Scoutmasters Handbook
- Lantern and extra fuel/mantels
- Troop flag, American Flag
- Duty Rosters
- Camp Medical Kit
- Dining/Keep Dry Flys

- Some pans & gear for any in-camp cooking
