The Grocery committee raises money for the school primarily through three programs: Harris Teeter's Together in Education (VIC) , Food Lion's MVP, and Whole Foods Vouchers. These programs all allow us to raise money by buying groceries. It does not cost the school, STM parents or parishioners any money!!

#### Harris Teeter VIC and Food Lion MVP Programs

When customers purchase select Harris Teeter or Food Lion brand products using their VIC/MVP card, Harris Teeter/Food Lion contributes a percentage of those purchase dollars to the school of their choice. Please make sure your school of choice is St. Thomas More School! We can earn even more money for our school by encouraging neighbors, friends and family to sign up as well.

We maintain a master list of over 200 voluntarily-given VIC numbers and are working toward starting a MVP list as well. Each August we can re-link our cards automatically online using the master list. If you would like to add your VIC card to our list, please contact [Janina](#).

#### Whole Foods Program

The 2010-11 school year will be the 2<sup>nd</sup> year for this great fundraiser. Families buy Whole Foods Vouchers (scrip) from the committee in increments of \$20. Then, you pay your bill at Whole Foods (Elliott Street location only) with the vouchers because they work the same as cash. How does the school raise money? Whole Foods allows STM to purchase the vouchers at a 5% discount. It's that easy. The Grocery Card committee handles the distribution of order forms, money collection and delivery of vouchers to the participants each month.
