Program Overview

Program Highlights

- Faculty from Union Presbyterian Seminary and Randolph-Macon College's Religious Studies and Science Departments will offer lectures and workshops exploring the Convergence of Faith and Science.
- After each lecture, meet in a small group facilitated by a college/ seminary intern, to discuss and apply what you've heard.

EXPLORE AS YOU LEARN

- Dig in the dirt at Shalom Farms as you consider the intersection between farming, food and faith.
- Enjoy a white water rafting trip on the James River after considering the ecological and theological roles water plays in our lives.
- Ask questions about how your future vocation might grow out of your interests in faith and in science.

- Design lesson plans, activities, or guided experiences that can be used by the church or school groups.
