The OGHS offering will be collected on Easter Sunday, April 8. For almost 60 years Presbyterians have made the OGHS offering part of our Easter tradition. It is fitting to celebrate the gift of our Lord's Resurrection by giving of our resources to reach out to others in need.

The theme of this year's offering is based on Matthew 22:39 – "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." There are neighbors in need around the world and Jesus calls us to reach out to one another in times of need. The funds raised go to three powerful relief programs: the Presbyterian Disaster Assistance Program (PDA), the Presbyterian Hun-

ger Program (PHP), and the Self-Development of People Program (SDOP).

Inserts in our bulletins have been highlighting the ways these three programs help in times of sudden natural disasters, in times of hunger or illness caused by drought or violence, and in places of despair and long-term economic stagnation. All of these programs help in both the far reaches of our globe and in communities near us in the United States. We can all be good neighbors to God's children everywhere through our OGHS offering. Use the offering envelope enclosed in the *Communicator* or pick one up in the narthex.

- Write a letter to someone influential in your "Faith Journey."
- Reduce money spent on meals during Lent and donate the savings to Global Missions.

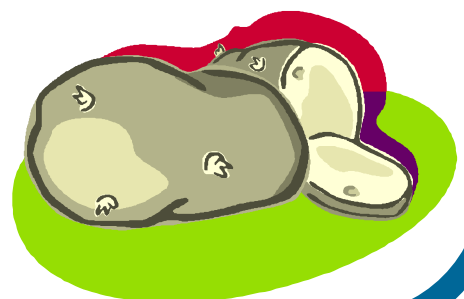


Sonfest at Carowins!

Keep the Stamps for Missions Coming!

It may appear to be a thankless job to us, but Peggy Reinhold, Dublin, Virginia, who processes and sells our used stamps to collectors has a different story.

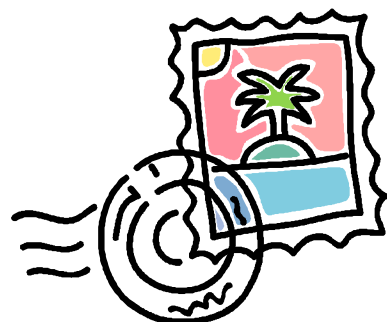
She reports that collectively we Presbyterians contributed \$5,747 to the Church of Christ in the Congo this past year. This year is off to a good start, too, with 64 envelopes, packages, and boxes of stamps already having arrived. These stamps are currently in various stages of soaking, sorting, filing, counting, and packaging to be sent to stamp companies.

"You do make a difference," Peggy says. According to her, evangelists, pastors, and other Christian education workers now have entire Bibles for work in their ministry. Also, their congregations have hymn books to sing from. In addition, special retreats with pastors and evangelists are now possible with the help of our contributions from the sale of used stamps. On behalf of the people in the Congo, Peggy thanks us for helping them to have a better life and encourages us to keep the stamps coming.

According to Peggy, the stamp collectors are very selective in their purchases. Everything must be just right. She urges us, therefore, to be very careful when trimming the stamps, being sure to leave at least 1/4 inch, preferably 1/2 inch, of the envelope around the stamp. Also, she suggests that we concentrate particularly on the large commemorative stamps because they are of more value. (Printed postage is of no value.)

To be eligible for one of these loans, you must meet certain minimum requirements:

- Membership in Brevard- Davidson River Presbyterian Church
- Active in the fellowship of the church
- Acceptance in a degree program at an accredited school
- Productive use of after-school and vacation time



To apply, obtain an application form from the church office and return the completed form to the church office. You will be contacted by the Student Loan Fund Committee for an interview. If approved, you must agree with the terms of the loan agreement and sign it. If you are a minor, an appropriate adult must co-sign with you.

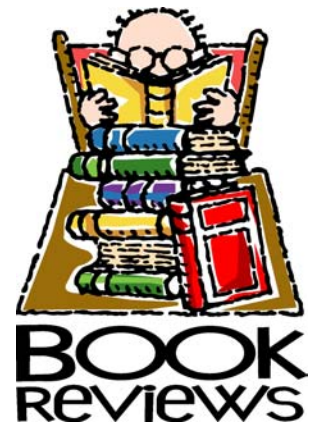
