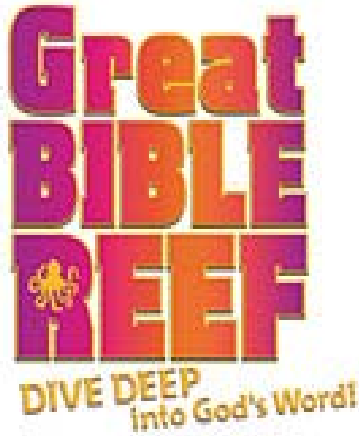

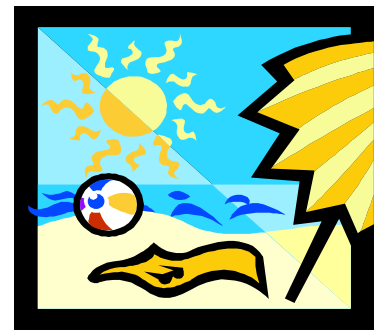

## Attention College and College-Bound Students!!

Did you know that our church has a fund that is designated for low-interest college loans? The Robert and Sara Bolt Student Loan Fund was started 30 years ago by one of our generous members, in memory of his wife. Since then, the fund has grown from interest on the original endowment and from steady donations.

To be eligible for one of these loans, you must meet certain minimum requirements:

- Membership in Brevard- Davidson River Presbyterian Church
- Active in the fellowship of the church
- Acceptance in a degree program at an accredited school
- Productive use of after-school and vacation time

To apply, obtain an application form from the church office and return the completed form to the church office. You will be contacted by the Student Loan Fund Committee for an interview. If approved, you must agree with the terms of the loan agreement and sign it. If you are a minor, an appropriate adult must co-sign with you.

If you are in need of a limited, low-cost loan for college, please apply.

## Spotlight on Local Mission

### Volunteers In Medicine

VIM is one of the local Transylvania County mission endeavors that B-DRPC helps support monetarily. Our 2007 mission budget has \$1,300 earmarked for VIM.

What is VIM? The TCVIM is a local response to make medical care available to the uninsured. As an independent non-government supported agency, it depends on local financial support and volunteers to provide a medical safety net to those in need. Last year 545 people were cared for in the twice-weekly free clinic and community pharmacy, and the weekly metabolic

clinic. These 545 people are among the "working poor" of our county with family income under \$20,000 and no health insurance.

More volunteer doctors, nurses and pharmacists are needed to keep up with the health needs of our county. If you are qualified and can spare a few hours twice a week (mostly evenings) call Florence Allbaugh, Volunteer Coordinator at the TCVIM office 883-4454 or directly at 862-3345. The VIM office and clinic is located in the lower floor of Sharing House at the corner of Oakdale and Duckworth.

### Sharing House

June is one of our months to provide non-perishable food and other necessities for the Food Pantry at Sharing House. Four months a year (March, June, Sept. and Dec.) we try to fill our Sharing House collection bins in the narthex to overflowing with food and paper, cleaning and hygiene supplies.

Sharing House is the face of Transylvania Christian Ministries; the 26 year-old joint effort of Transylvania County churches and other concerned citizens to help our neighbors in crisis. Our B-DRPC 2007 mission budget earmarks \$16,100 to support Sharing House, and many of our members are dedicated volunteers as well as individual donors to the work of TCM.

### Memorials and Honors

The Mission Ministry Team reminds us that each month, members of our church make meaningful donations to honor and memorialize members, family and friends. Missions outside our congregation's needs, both local and worldwide, are appropriate ways to honor people committed to being followers of Christ. The needs are great. There are projects that would extend the concerns of the people you love. You could donate to the support of a particular project or missionary, or contribute to a general fund for "Mission", which will be available to serve those in our community and world as specific needs arise.

**THE BOOK OF CONFESSIONS AND THE BOOK OF ORDER** are the official handbooks of the Constitution of the Presbyterian Church and the guidelines used by church officers.

In the 285 section on the library shelves, you will find other resources that help explain what it means to be Presbyterian.

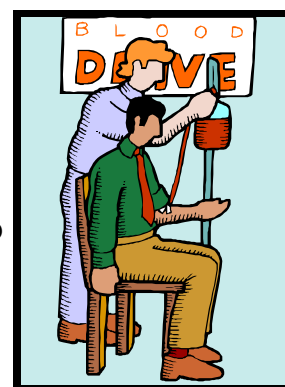
These books as well as other resources for group or home study are available in the Resource Room in the Education Wing or on the cart available during fellowship time in Davidson River Hall.

# WNC Presbytery in Brief

Moderator Maggie Lauterer called the 72<sup>nd</sup> meeting of the Presbytery of Western North Carolina to order at 9:05 a.m. in the Anderson Auditorium of Montreat Conference Center.

After passage of the Omnibus Motion and Stated Clerk's Report, the Presbytery worshipped. In addition to an excellent sermon calling us to honor the covenant in our ordination vows, the service included celebration of the Lord's Supper and Installation of General Presbyter, The Rev. Barbara "Bobbi" White.

Commissioners then:

- Recognized youth of 62 churches who participated in the recent Souper Bowl on Super Bowl Sunday, collecting a total of \$24,068.89 + 5,279 food items + \$13,363.40 subsidy from Nickel A Meal, for a total of \$37,431.79. The Presbytery collected 13% of all money collected in North Carolina.
- Discussed MontreatPresbyterian Church's request for dismissal to the Evangelical Presbyterian Church. This process was lengthy (adjournment was not until nearly 6:30 p.m.), interspersed by various substitute motions and frequent calls for "point of order." Those representing Montreat Presbyterian Church repeatedly reminded us that they simply wanted the opportunity to serve Christ in a different way. Others contended that there could be nothing simple about any of the process.
- The end result of all the debate was the acceptance of the Revised Recommended Decision presented by the Special Task Force. The vote on dismissal included dividing the current Montreat Presbyterian Church into two congregations, namely: The continuing Montreat Presbyterian Church (which continues the name "Montreat Presbyterian Church" within the PCUSA) and those members of the current Montreat Presbyterian Church who are desirous of being dismissed as a congregation to the Evangelical Presbyterian Church. The vote for dismissal requiring 2/3 votes was passed.
- The vote concerning property included that PWNC take possession of property now "held in trust... for the PCUSA" (BOO:G-8.0201) by the formerly undivided Montreat Presbyterian Church, so that, for up to six months, the churches, Montreat Conference Center, Montreat College and Presbytery may work together toward a mutually acceptable resolution concerning the property, and the Task Force shall bring a recommendation about property to the October meeting of Presbytery.
- The recommendation ended with prayer asking for the divine blessing of grace and peace on this settlement, to the lasting glory of the One God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Amen

Approved unanimously a final resolution offered by George Gunn, Stated Supply Pastor of Fletcher Presbyterian Church in Banner Elk, as follows:

- The Presbytery recognizes that by its action, two (2) congregations at Montreat have been created, congregations which will continue to share a common mission in the world and in the Montreat community. Therefore, the Presbytery of WNC continues to pray for both congregations and for their faithful and fruitful service to the Lord; and we pray that this service maybe a witness to the continuing work of the Holy Spirit to further the unity of the Body of Christ.

Adjourned with prayer by the Rev. Parker T. Williamson, at the request of the Moderator.

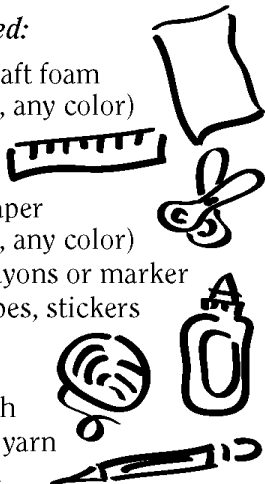
# Kids Page!

## A Verse Frame

Make this special gift for your dad, uncle, grandfather or father-figure. It is nice to be reminded of our heavenly Father's love for us.

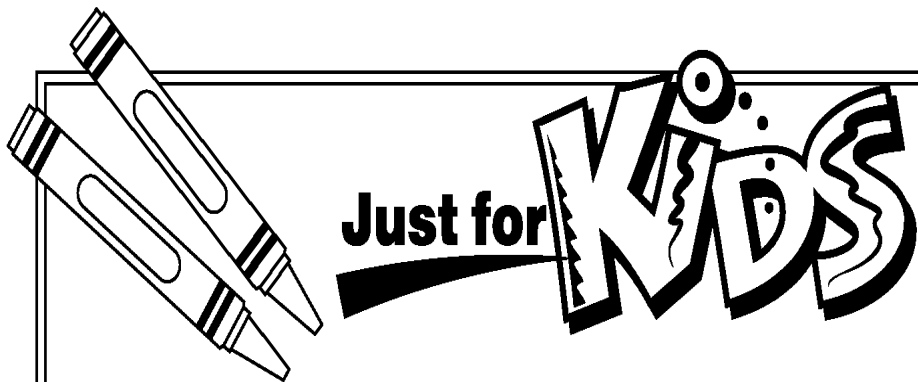
**What you need:**

- Piece of craft foam (8½" x 11", any color)
- Ruler
- Scissors
- Piece of paper (8½" x 11", any color)
- Pencil, crayons or marker
- Foam shapes, stickers (optional)
- Glue
- Hole punch
- Ribbon or yarn



**What you do:**

1. Use your ruler to measure a rectangle inside the piece of craft foam. Draw the rectangle, and then cut it out. Your foam should now look like a frame.
2. Place the piece of paper under the foam frame, and trace the shape of the frame's window onto the paper.
3. Choose a verse to write inside the rectangle on your paper. (Your frame can go horizontally or vertically.) Suggested verses include 1 Corinthians 8:6, Philippians 4:20 and 1 John 3:1.
4. Turn the frame over (face down), and put glue around the edge. Lay the verse face down on the back of the frame, and let it dry.
5. Decorate the outside of the frame with foam shapes, stickers or drawings.
6. Use your hole punch to punch two holes at the top of the frame. Tie a piece of ribbon or yarn through the holes to hang the frame.
