This month meet Debra Niehoff. Thank you very much for sharing your story with us about your entry into The Redeemer community.

How long have you been attending services here? I started coming about a year ago after moving from Newtown in Bucks County to Newtown Square.

What other Episcopal churches have you attended? In Bucks County, I was a member first of St. Andrews in Yardley and then Holy Nativity in Wrightstown.

What is your previous church experience, if any? I grew up in the Presbyterian Church but discovered the Church of England while living in London, and found the ritual and dignity of the Anglican service spiritually meaningful.

How did you find The Redeemer? I was interested in finding a new church near my new home but wasn't sure where to begin. Fortunately, the Internet came to the rescue!

What inspired you to attend? I fell in love with the beautiful building and everyone I met was warm and welcoming.

What would you want to tell others about The Redeemer to encourage them to come and explore our parish? As someone who was a complete stranger not only to the church, but to the community, I feel that The Redeemer has played a vital role in helping me create a new home.

Tell us a bit about yourself outside of The Redeemer—your job, your family, your hobbies. A neuroscientist by training, I'm currently the research manager for the Association for Frontotemporal Degeneration, where I oversee our grant programs. I love all things outdoors – hiking, kayaking, fly fishing especially. And I have two beautiful collies and enjoy competing in agility and obedience trials.
