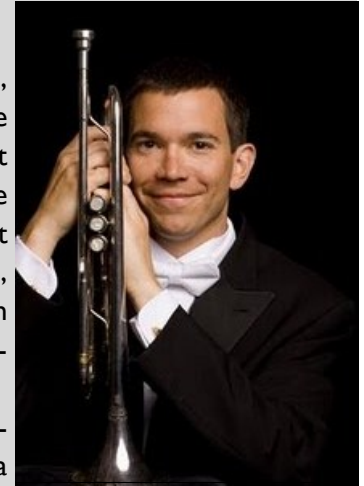
Musical Notes by Dr. Donald Chen

Unlike many composers of the Baroque era, e.g., Telemann and those who followed them in the Classical era, e.g., Haydn and Hummel, Bach did not write any concerted works specifically for the trumpet. Nonetheless, judging from the important role Bach assigned the trumpet in his cantatas, masses, and orchestral suites, attest to the high regard he had for the instrument and the high expectation he had for its technical mastery.

While in the employ (1708-1717) of Count Sachsen-Weimar – as violinist in the court orchestra and organist of the court chapel – he came into contact with the Italian instrumental music which was then the rave of Europe, especially works by Antonio Vivaldi. Bach began to compose instrumental music in a style akin to Vivaldi's and often transcribed Vivaldi's music for other instruments. Concerto in D major, BWV 972, part of which you hear this morning, was one of such works.

It is transcribed from Vivaldi's Violin Concerto in D major, Op. 3 no 9. Hence the title: Concerto in D major after Vivaldi, BWV 972. BWV stands for Bach-Werke-Verzeichnis ("Bach Works Catalogue"). This designation combined with numbers that follow, identifies each composition Bach ever wrote.
