Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

God's blessings to you as we begin this new year in 2012! It is always an exciting time as we review the work of God in our life over the last year and begin to think about the things that God may have in store for us in the coming year. As we look over the last year, there are always regrets and hurts that are a part of the realities of life, but we can also see how God has been faithful to us, walking with us and guiding us through the challenges of our life.

It is precisely this kind of remembering that has been part of the fabric of our faith that we learn in scripture. Many passages of the Old Testament summon the courage people need to face their current challenges by remembering the faithfulness of God through the ages. The Psalmist in Psalm 116 cries out "For you, Lord, have delivered me from death, my eyes from tears, my feet from stumbling, that I may walk before the Lord in the land of the living. I trusted in the Lord when I said, 'I am greatly afflicted.'" The Psalmist remembers the faithfulness of God in his grief, and in thanksgiving, he now moves forward in faith saying, "I will fulfill my vows to the Lord in the presence of all his people, in the courts of the house of the Lord— in your midst, Jerusalem. We will have individual challenges in the coming year. We face challenges as a congregation, but I know that God will be there walking with us every step of the way. So we begin the new year not with trepidation about what is to come, but rather boldly stepping into the promised in-breaking of God's kingdom when we seek his will and follow in faith.

A WORD FROM THE COUNCIL PRESIDENT:

It was wonderful to see so many of you attend our special congregational meeting on December 4th. If you weren't able to be there, the congregation voted to move forward with hiring RSI to conduct a capital stewardship campaign to determine Prince of Peace's ability to raise funds for facilities expansion and renovation. I want to take this opportunity to provide you with what the next steps are and a general timeline for these items.

RSI, specifically, Craig Miller, will begin meeting with a leadership team in January that Pastor Jonathan and I are working to assemble. Our Annual Congregational Meeting will be on March 18th and this will also be about the time that stewardship campaign events will begin for the congregation as a whole. Information packets will be distributed while Bible Studies and Prayer will be the focus of our time together for about 5 to 6 weeks in March and April. The initial phase of the campaign will culminate on April 22nd when we will be asked to make commitments to the building campaign. RSI has committed their services to Prince of Peace for a 3 year bridge period that follows the initial campaign.

Meanwhile VSWC, our architects, will be working up some final conceptual drawings for the congregation to review. You have probably seen the renderings that VSWC has already developed hanging in the narthex. These were based on meetings with the building committee, church council and the congregation. The plans continue to be tweaked and will not be finalized until after we have completed the stewardship campaign and have a better understanding of what we can actually accomplish facilities wise.

This congregation will have an active role in the stewardship campaign and the decisions that will be need to be made following Commitment Sunday on April 22nd. There will be a special congregational meeting again following the campaign (probably in May). As a congregation, we need to decide on how best to proceed. Please let your Building Committee, Church Council and/or Church Staff know if you have questions. We will do our best to answer them.

I also want to take this opportunity to thank you for the generosity shown toward the staff for Christmas. It is wonderful to be a part of this congregation! As you know, December is always a busy month as we prepare for the birth of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. This December presented even more challenges for many of us as we had a number of members and/or friends and family members of members that were ill or dying. Prince of Peace is at its best when we pull together as a family. Please continue to hold those that are sick or grieving in your prayers.

2012 presents with much to accomplish! I look forward to going on this journey with you and wish you good health, happiness and comfort in knowing that we have been given the greatest gift of all in eternal life! Happy New Year!

BUILDING COMMITTEE

Thank you, thank you, Prince of Peace members, for your strong support of the capital campaign vote which will lead us forward in the process to a new Sanctuary, enlarged education space, and other improvements to enhance our ministry here together. The Spirit has moved us to this point, and hopefully it will continue to move within us as we transition to the next step.

The architects have provided drawings of the Master Plan based on the needs, desires, and visions of our ministries, and now they and the Building Committee will step back as fundraising is undertaken and we see how much of the vision we can build. The drawings are posted in the Narthex, so please stop by and see what we are planning, keeping in mind that, although we expect to go forward with the basic footprint, there may be quite a number of changes in appearance before we break ground. At this point it's as simple as the click of a mouse to make changes, so we'd like to hear your reaction, and already we've tweaked the exterior a bit in response. Have you noted the stylistic dove, to represent the Peace in our name?

From the drawings, note that the existing Sanctuary becomes the new Narthex or gathering space, and the new Sanctuary is planned right behind the existing altar area. The new Narthex will have space for serving and drinking coffee, room for soft furniture for relaxing, conversation areas, and a cry area with a window to the Sanctuary for parents to bring small children. It will use both the existing main entrance and a new even-more-main entrance at the corner of the building with a covered drop-off. The office area will be expanded into what is now the hallway in front and the mailboxes will be moved to a walk-through alcove.

The proposed Sanctuary will hold 525 people compared to the present 240, with movable wall panels in the rear for overflow. The main ceiling beam will extend from the baptismal font in the rear to the cross and altar up front, linking the cross to the sacraments of Baptism and Communion. The left wall is curved, and the musicians will move to that side to take advantage of the better acoustics it provides. There will be room for the growing voice choir and the bell choir. A Sacristy will be located on the right side adjacent to the Sanctuary.

Turning to the other new construction shown in orange on the drawings, this is education area for the smaller children, consolidating the rooms for these ages and providing improved security for both Sunday School and POP Kids and a handy drop-off area. The rooms for other ages and adults will be moved as shown. The music area will be expanded into the existing hallway where the Library is located now. Other hallways are slated to be widened to accommodate larger numbers of people. There are no changes anticipated in the Parish Life Center.

There's lots of other proposed changes that can be made part of next month's article, but in the meantime, for other descriptions or feedback please contact one of the Building Committee members: Will Clevidence, Rob Koch, Al Kressler, Anne Moloney, Jill Prior, Angie Seiller, Chris Torrison, Joe Vallo, Al Geisinger, Sue McIlvoy, Pastor Jonathan, or me. We all have done a lot of work so far and will be happy to hear from you to describe it and answer your questions.

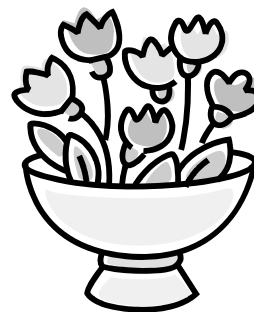
NEED OF CRUCIFER WORSHIP COORDINATOR...
