The View from the Rafters

Journalist Sarah Ellis recently wrote an article entitled "Losing Faith: Why South Carolina is abandoning its churches." I came across the article as I perused religious articles on the *Nurturing Faith News* website. Ellis writes,

Many churches are dying slow deaths, stuck in stagnation if not decline. And if they don't do something, in the near future, they'll share the fate of Cedar Creek United Methodist, a 274-year-old Richland County congregation that dissolved last year; Resurrection Lutheran, a church near downtown Columbia that will hold its last service on Sept. 2; and the dozens of churches that sit shuttered and empty around the state. At the same time, some churches are growing, and some growing quickly. But they might not look much like the churches your grandparents (and their grandparents) were raised in. From meeting in unconventional places to tweaking their traditions, many churches are adapting, offering something different that many people thought the church couldn't do for them.

Ellis does well at drawing attention to the trends in church life, trends that we often see and feel, yet are a bit reluctant to discuss. She gleans information from a variety of religious and secular sources and condenses the information into an informative article in hopes of bringing the discussion of the plight of declining churches into the light of careful and thoughtful discussion. As a follower of Jesus Christ, as a pastor and as a committed servant of the church, I hope her insights will be the springboard that faith communities need today to discuss, listen and learn more about what it means to be the church in the 21st century.

Please be in prayer as fellow members of the FBC faith community travel to FBC Mocksville, NC to attend the "Growing Young" Conference. Sponsored by the NC Cooperative Baptist Fellowship, churches from around our state will be intentionally engaging in a conversation about the health and well-being of our churches. Not avoiding the hard conversations and being willing to listen to a team of folks associated with the Fuller Institute, we are assembling to avail ourselves to the spirit of God as we seek to understand better what it means to be a healthy, vibrant growing church. These are challenging days for being the church, and church leaders must be intentional on setting our eyes and ears toward discerning the Spirit of God. Like the Israelite nation released from Egyptian slavery, we are wandering in a cultural wilderness needing now to follow the real presence of God in order to take up residence in a promised land of spiritual, physical, emotional and mental stability, and health. Please be in prayer for those who will be attending.

Church health begins with you! Let me encourage you to become more disciplined in prayer and study, to become more committed to making church ministry and mission a personal priority in your weekly schedules, to invite a friend who is not attending church, and to encourage the body of believers in giving of your time, resource, and self. We have a beautiful church family; let's nurture and steward God's faith community for the generations who will follow after us.
