

MEN'S MINISTRY-BROTHERHOOD – BAPTIST MEN – MEN OF 1:10

The men of Pittsboro Baptist Church have always been active in service and ministry. Prior to 1970, their activities were organized through the Sunday School classes.

1959

WMU responded to a request from WMU Headquarters to send clothes to Hong Kong. Response was so overwhelming that the WMU was unable to supply postage. The Griffin Bible Class provided postage for the clothes donations to be sent to Hong Kong.

1962

Layman's Day held October 21.

1964

Baptist Men's Day held January 26 and again October 25.

1981

Chapter of the Royal Ambassadors was organized and led by Russell Cooper, Leon Shaw, Gene Griffin and Larry Johnson.

1985

Gene Griffin: 3 RA groups this year, grades 1-9

1987

Crusader, Younger and Older Pioneers participated in basketball games in February.
Church wide pig pickin' sponsored by the Baptist Men and RA's – January 23
Baptist Men's Day – January 24, September – 21 men and boys attended a breakfast and organizational meeting.
Four men went to Cameron for a work day.
The Brotherhood/Baptist Men organized into an active entity/mission group on September 12..

1988

Baptist Men Director George Shivers: average attendance at meetings/breakfasts 20- 23 men, RA's-seven enrolled Brotherhood enrollment – 44
10 men worked at Caswell doing renovations
Baptist Men sponsored Family Night on March 30, beans and cornbread meal with proceeds going to World Hunger
Men prepared breakfast Easter Sunday morning, serving 90 people
Baptist Men's Day – January 24; pig pickin' – January 23
Baptist Men and RAs participated in Bibles for Russia campaign, sending 20 Bibles to Russia
Men sponsored a drive to help a family in need after their mobile home was destroyed by fire
Brotherhood Director George Shivers: stated the organization had a good year even though the organization is only one year old
96 attended a missions kick off supper in Sept. along with WMU
WMU and Brotherhood are working closely together, many things planned for the year
Oct- joint meeting Brotherhood/ breakfast held with WMU, 34 attended
Elmer Bouldin, Fred Nooe, George Shivers helped with work on a church in Raleigh, Leesville Road Baptist.
November – 6 men went to Mars Hill College to construct a fellowship hall and chapel
With WMU – provided food for 10 families at Christmas
Nov. 6-12, 1988 RA week

1989

Baptist Men's Day January 22 , pig pickin' held Jan,21 to kick it off, 104 attended
Fred Nooe who has been a special influence for missions in the church and has made numerous work project trips in the US and other countries, was presented the first Outstanding Christian Service Award.

Baptist Men –reroofed, repaired, and painted the home for Mrs. Hilda Bell

Baptist Men – will cut wood for those who need it for winter months

Baptist Men prepared Easter breakfast for the church

Six or seven of our men went at various times to Jamaica to repair churches damaged by a hurricane

Baptist Men started a Men's Sock Fund Project to purchase 400 pairs of socks for missionaries in New York City to distribute

A group of RA's and men collected trash for "Adopt a Highway"

The Baptist Men cut wood and made a plan to work on Mrs. Craft's house.

Nov 5-11 - RA Week; RA Sunday- Nov 5th with luncheon after service.

1990

Baptist Men Director – George Shivers

Ten men attended Baptist Men's Conference in January

Baptist Men's Day, Jan 28,with cookout and fellowship on Jan. 27th

5 worked the association office work day in Sanford

March – 8 went to Caswell for a work day

Prepared Easter Sunrise service breakfast

Projects –built a deck for the youth minister, painted a garage for Carl Yates, did garden work for Fred Nooe ,carried out the renovation of the Fellowship Hall and the room for Spanish Mission

Average attendance at breakfasts – 23

11 helped at Cameron's Boys Camp to work on building

Nov. 4-10, 1990 RA week.

1991

Baptist Men Day – Jan.27

Eleven RA's and men worked on the Adopt-a-Highway pick-up in March

RA Sunday, Nov 3

A church-wide effort to fill boxes with food, toys and gifts for 36 families (through Salvation Army) The RA's and men delivered them – December

1992

Men and RA's had breakfast- Mike Ryan shared New Zealand experiences

Jan 26, 1992 Baptist Men's Day- Jan 26, 1992

Feb.- Combined home mission study for GA's and RA's

Baptist men worked on Fort Caswell project

Men worked on Habitat for Humanity project.

Men and RA's had breakfast- afterwards they cut trees at Jane Nooe's house

RA week – Nov 1-7

Pioneer RA's renamed their group, "The George Shivers Pioneer RA Chapter."

40 Families were given food boxes.

RA Post Office collected 29¢/card for in-house Christmas card delivery

1992-1994

Volunteers from PBC traveled to Raleigh each Saturday over a two year period to participate in a Church Build where volunteers built the Korean Baptist Church from the ground up.

1993

January 24- Baptist Men's Day

Summer months – several men and 18 youth worked on construction at New Brunswick Island Baptist Church at Holden Beach

November: RA Recognition service and race car event; RAs sponsored a Christmas Card Mail Box

Baptist Men with WMU sponsored Food Baskets for 40 families

October – RAs and others participated in CROP walk

Continued to hold monthly breakfasts for the group

1994

January 23- Baptist Men's Day

Continued to hold monthly breakfasts for the group

Nov 13-20 – RA week

1998

Men had a trip to Caswell, men helped Jeff Magee in putting up his garage

Joint project with WMU providing food for Korean Children

Work on the picnic shelter had begun but stopped due to weather and lack of funds for lumber

Karl Shaffer agreed to work with RAs (four boys)

May 9 -return to regular scheduled breakfast meetings

Brotherhood meeting average attendance 12

1999

Brotherhood meeting average attendance 15

New program with WMU beginning May 1. Collecting canned food each Sunday or Wednesday for Salvation Army

Work on 902 picnic shelter continues (summer)

Men and women traveled to Seven Springs in December.

2000

Food drive for Salvation army continued

Men and women traveled to Seven Springs January 8, to work on six houses

Work scheduled second Saturday of each month to help with flood relief efforts

January 30 – Baptist Men's Day

Seven Springs mission trip – work on six houses, sixteen went on January 8,

Church now has an equipment trailer for mission work.

2001

Mission trips planned to Tarboro, Grifton,

May 4 worked with Hanks Chapel United Church of Christ to put on new roof in Hanks Chapel community, example of home mission

Much work being done at Spanish Mission

July - work down east curtailed

October - church agreed to assist in building a Habitat House in the spring and would assume sponsorship for building a habitat house

2002

Men's breakfast had 44 present
Habitat House work to begin March 9th, other churches participating
Good fellowship and good work on Habitat house, women prepared meals for those working on project
Habitat House – July 6, lots of trim work done, expect house to be completed in August

2003

Plan that Baptist Men, representing the church, would be working on one to two habitat houses each year.

2004

Church kitchen repainted,
Baptist Men's Day- Jan 25
RAs have 11 enrolled

2005

George Shivers - attendance good for monthly breakfasts,
May 14 traveled to Cameron assist in building shelter at Boys' Home,
10 men worked on Habitat House Oct 1
Men's Retreat –October 21-23

2006

Baptist Men: about 20 men attending,
Feb. 18 -Habitat work day in Siler City
Baptist Men's Day – January 22 with men's praise team
Men's breakfast was held with the 40 Days of Community Prayer Breakfast
Baptist Men – Three men going to Gulfport, MS April 22-29

2008

Operation In as Much held April 18

2009

Iron Man Event – January 23
Wild Game Dinner in February or March,
Operation In as Much held in the spring.
New ministry would be announced on Mission Sunday, Feb. 8
Broken Windows Ministry completed a ramp for a church member, another project scheduled for following Saturday
Men and women went to Red Springs on November 6 & 7 for construction work

2010

Men's Retreat, Nov.13, camping at Crosswinds

2013

The annual Father-Child Camp-out held at 902, the second Friday in June.
Repair work was done on a woman's home by Men's Ministry members.
The Baptist Men changed its name to the Men of 1:10.

2014

The Wild Hearts Dinner February 8 was a huge success.

March- seven men worked at Caswell with hope do more of this in the future.

Beginning in July, there will be no more Saturday breakfasts. Beginning in September will meet the second Friday evenings during odd months. The current study: *The Fight for Manhood*.

2015

Baptist Men, teamed up with SIS for a Valentine Banquet. Tickets required. Event was successful with 67 in attendance.

2016

Jeff Magee, representing the Men of 1:10 Ministry stated that the bi-monthly meetings have been good with food and fellowship. Group would not sponsor a Valentine banquet this year.

2019

(April) Group is focused on disaster recovery projects in the eastern part of the state. Groups worked every 4th Saturday of the month with an average of twelve workers per trip.

7 to 9 men went to Spring Lake to make repairs. July was the last month that this trip happened. The neighbors are working together to repair their homes.
