Central UMC Music Ministry: A Volunteer's Perspective by Bonita Wiedenhaupt

When I joined Central 23 years ago, I was newly single and from a smaller church. I knew that to fit in and feel at home I needed to get involved. I had always been in church choirs, so that was a good place to start, and I have been in Central's choir since then. Music is a big part of my worship. It makes me happy. We practice each piece so often before we offer it in worship that it becomes a part of my soul. I find myself at home humming or singing our pieces without even realizing it. Also, the friendships built in choir are priceless. We always have prayer time and that helps keep us close as we pray for each other.

Music is such an important part of worship and our church is blessed to have many forms.

- As I watch and listen to the bell choir, I'm amazed with their skill and precision. Worshiping with their offering of music makes me think heaven must also have bell choirs.
- The Brass Choir is another vital part of our church's music. They often make the hair on my arms stand up. Think how biblical they are! Brass instruments are mentioned often in the Bible.
- It makes me smile and teary at the same time to hear the Cherub and Children's Choirs with their enthusiasm and strong voices. At such a young age they are learning much by being in the choir such as working together, following the director, gaining confidence by performing and biblical concepts of how God and Jesus work in our lives.
- By the time children are older and join the Youth Choir, their skills have been honed and their commitment to worship touches me deeply.
- The Chancel Choir is one of our adult choirs. Besides singing on Sunday mornings, we offer up other programs throughout the year including special music during Christmas and Easter, often with orchestral accompaniment. We all know how crowded those services on holidays can be. Join the choir and you will always have a seat!

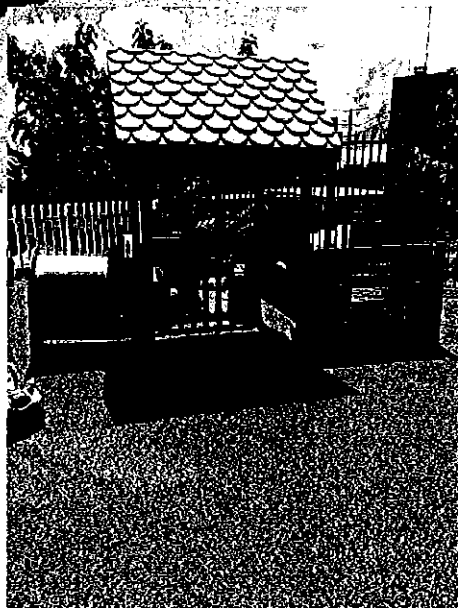
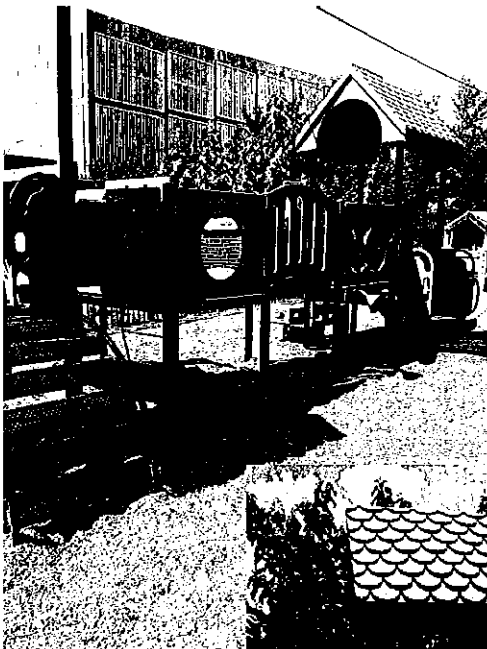

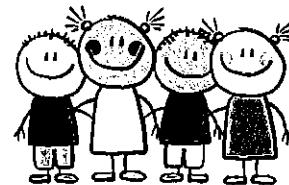

Youth Ministries

It has been a whirlwind of a summer for our youth! We ended in the best way possible - a mission trip. During the week of July 22, twenty-three of our teenagers spent four days serving and volunteering around Asheville. They cleaned creeks, pulled weeds, shoveled mulch, carried and organized groceries, served meals, and a multitude of other activities at five different organizations around the city. They would come back to the church in the evening to not just hang out, but also pray and worship every night. The week was the beginning of the future of the youth ministry here at Central!

CYMT Innovation Lab

The Center for Youth Ministry Training has been awarded a \$1.1 million grant to create an innovation laboratory for the faith formation of young people. They believe they have been called to create and innovate in the image of our Creator. The lab is designed to test new models for ministry that are both practical and theologically grounded, and which seek to better intersect with the real lives of adolescents. As they sought to bring design thinking into conversation with practical theology, they found ten "lead innovators" (youth workers) to work with and to spend 2-3 years testing out new ideas in their congregations. Andrew Mochrie, our Director of Youth Ministries, has been chosen to be one of those ten "lead innovators" and Central is officially an Innovation Lab! Stay tuned over the next two years as we seek new ways of being in ministry with adolescents.
