The Ritual Life

One of the gifts of our liturgical tradition as Episcopalians is our practice of rituals. The roles rituals play in our approach to God can vary widely and we may miss their importance.

Ceremony and ritual can add depth and meaning to our experience of worship. Can is the pivotal word here. Whether we realize it or not, ritual is central to our lives, especially to our spiritual lives. In our corporate worship and in our faith in Jesus, ritual helps us to remember important things about ourselves and about God.

Saying certain prayers repeatedly, such as the Lord's Prayer and the Collect for Purity help us to learn truths about the God, who, at times, can seem beyond our scope of even slight understanding.

Sometimes we hear negative uses of the word ritual. Just as the word ceremony is used on occasion to refer to something devoid of sincerity or as something meaningless (as in "mere ceremony"), ritual is occasionally used the same way.

When I was in college, I thought the Episcopal Church had done a poor job of helping me to be "brought up in the Christian faith and life" and "to grow into the full stature of Christ" (see the Book of Common Prayer, page 302) as the service of Holy Baptism describes the responsibilities of parents and godparents, and by extension the entire congregation.

As I grew older and became more engaged with my faith and by increasing my participation in worship in the Episcopal Church throughout my 20s, I began to appreciate the ways that ritual had formed my faith in Christ and my understanding of myself.

December and January will offer some very powerful and enriching opportunities to worship God and grow in faith. I pray that you will seek to engage in the life we share with each other in worship. I truly believe that as you increase your involvement and attentiveness in our practice of ritual, you will find yourself being blessed and your faith and understanding of God increased exponentially.
